## REPORT OF THE NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

## Item $\mathbf{1 2 . 2}$ to $\mathbf{1 2 . 1 6}$ of the agenda

## APPOINTMENT OF AN EXTERNAL AUDITOR AND COMPOSITION OF COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND OTHER SUBSIDIARY ORGANS OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE

1. The Committee held its seventh and eighth meetings on Tuesday 18 October 2005 for the purpose of adopting its proposals regarding the appointment of an External Auditor and the composition of Committees, Commissions and other organs of the General Conference, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 35, paragraphs 1 and 5, of the Rules of Procedure of the General Conference.
2. The Committee considered all the nominations submitted by Member States; for this purpose it had at its disposal documents 33 C/NOM/INF.2, 33 C/NOM/INF. 2 Rev., 33 C/NOM/INF. 2 Rev.2, 33 C/NOM/INF. 2 Rev. 3 and 33 C/NOM/INF. 2 Rev. 4 as well as documents 33 C/NOM/4 to $33 \mathrm{C} / \mathrm{NOM} / 8$. The number of nominations to the various organs showed both the interest taken by Member States in the activities of the intergovernmental committees, commissions and councils, and the exceptional capacity within electoral groups, in reaching agreement on submitting a number of candidates equal to the number of seats to be filled.
3. The Committee held one secret ballot for the election of an External Auditor and 14 secret ballots for the elections of eight subsidiary organs of the General Conference.

[^0]:    1 At its 32 nd session, the General Conference adopted $32 \mathrm{C} /$ Resolution 78, deciding to increase the number of Members of the Legal Committee to 24 as of the election which will take place during the 33rd session of the General Conference, and to amend accordingly Rule 36.1 of the Rules and Procedure of the General Conference. The Nominations Committee at its 3rd meeting on 6 October 2005, approved the geographical distribution of the 3 additional seats as follows: 1 additional seat for Group II and 2 additional seats for Group IV. Consequently, the geographical distribution of the 24 seats is the following: Group I - 5 seats; Group II - 3 seats; Group III - 5 seats; Group IV -4 seats; Group V(a) -3 seats; Group V(b) -4 seats.

[^1]:    ${ }^{2}$ To be noted that Member States Parties of the Protocol presented only two candidates for the five vacant seats. The remaining three vacant seats will be open for election at the 34th session of the General Conference.

[^2]:    3 It is to be noted that Group $\mathrm{V}(\mathrm{a})$ presented only one candidate for the two vacant seats: as a result, only 14 members are proposed for election by the General Conference. The full composition of 15 seats will be elected at the 34th session of the General Conference.
