MEMORANDUM ON UNESCO'S STANDARD-SETTING ACTIVITY

SUMMARY

In conformity with 20 C/Resolution 32.1 of the General Conference, the Director-General submits to the General Conference the present document which provides information in tabular form, on the standard-setting activities contemplated or in progress, and on the instruments already adopted.

- 1. The General Conference, in 20 C/Resolution 32.1, invited the Director-General to submit to it, at each of its sessions, 'a memorandum reporting the progress of work undertaken as part of the Organization's standard-setting action, indicating the subsequent stages contemplated and supplying all available information on the use made by Member States' governments of standard-setting instruments adopted under Unesco's auspices'.
- 2. The present document has been prepared pursuant to this resolution. It contains the following tables:
 - Table I Draft normative instruments whose adoption is foreseen for 1989;
 - Table II Possible normative instruments whose adoption is envisaged for 1990-1991;
 - Table III Possible normative instruments whose adoption is envisaged for 1992 or later;

- Table IV Application of normative instruments already adopted;
- Table V List of normative instruments adopted by Unesco, or under its auspices, or for which it is the depositary.
- 3. In Tables I to III a distinction has been made, where appropriate, between the three categories of Unesco's normative instruments, namely:
 - A. Conventions and recommendations which are adopted by the General Conference.
 - B. Instruments, other than conventions and recommendations (such as declarations, charters, etc.), which are adopted by the General Conference.
 - C. Instruments which are adopted by international conferences of States convened by Unesco.

Possible international convention on the recognition of studies, degrees and diplomas in higher education (see document 25 C/34, item 7.7 of the provisional agenda)

ACTION REQUIRED OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE:

The relevant rules of procedure concerning conventions and recommendations (see Manual of the General Conference) provide that:

Article 6

It shall be for the Conference to decide whether the question dealt with in the proposal should be regulated at the international level and, if so, to determine to what extent the question can be regulated and whether the method adopted should be an international convention or, alternatively, a recommendation to Member States.

Article 7

- 1. The General Conference may, however, decide to defer to a future session the decisions mentioned in Article 6.
- 2. It may, in this case, instruct the Director-General to submit to a future session a report on the desirability of regulating the question dealt with in the proposal, on an international basis; on the method which should be adopted for that purpose; and on the extent to which the question can be regulated.
- The Director-General's report shall be communicated to Member States at least one hundred days before the opening of the session of the General Conference.

ACTION REQUIRED OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE:

As concerns the abovementioned possible convention and recommendation, Resolution 20 C/32.1 requires that:

- (a) any proposal whose purpose is to initiate a preliminary study with a view to the international regulation of a question in the form of an international convention or a recommendation to Member States should be the subject of a draft resolution submitted to the General Conference;
- (b) having regard to the nature of the question under consideration, such a draft resolution shall specify the appropriate time-limits, with respect to the session of the Executive Board during which the preliminary study is to be examined, or the session of the General Conference during which the question of the advisability of such regulation will, if appropriate, be discussed; it might also provide for consultation of Member States for the purpose of preparing the preliminary study;
- c) proposals calling for the drafting of a normative instrument other than an international convention or a recommendation should also take the form of a draft resolution which might specify different time-limits, depending on the case, for the different stages of its preparation; such a draft resolution might provide for prior consultation of Member States.

1) Revised recommendation concerning technical and vocational education

At its present session the General Conference will have before it the follow-up on the first consultation of Member States on the implementation of the Revised recommendation concerning technical and vocational education (document 25 C/28, item 7.1 of the provisional agenda).

ACTION REQUIRED OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE:

Articles 18 and 19 of the Rules of Procedure concerning recommendations to Member States and international conventions covered by the terms of Article IV, paragraph 4 of the Constitution state that:

'Article 18

The General Conference shall embody its comments on the action taken by Member States in pursuance of a convention or recommendation in one or more general reports, which the Conference shall prepare at such times as it may deem appropriate.

Article 19

The General Conference's reports on the action taken by Member States in pursuance of a convention or recommendation shall be transmitted to Member States, to the United Nations, to National Commissions, and to any other authorities specified by the General Conference'.

2. Recommendation concerning education for international understanding, co-operation and peace and education relating to human rights and fundamental freedoms

At its present session the General Conference will have before it the first reports by Member States on the implementation of the Recommendation concerning education for international understanding, co-operation and peace and education relating to human rights and fundamental freedoms submitted pursuant to resolution 22 C/4.5 (document 25 C/30, item 7.3 of the provisional agenda).

ACTION REQUIRED OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE: As in paragraph 1 above.

3. Recommendation concerning the status of teachers

At its present session the General Conference will have before it the fourth report of the Joint ILO/Unesco Committee of Experts on the Application of the Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers (document 25 C/29, item 7.2 of the provisional agenda).

ACTION REQUIRED OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE: Examination of the report of the Joint Committee.
