Address by H.E. President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Mr Nursultan Nazarbayev Nazarbayev at the 38th Session of the UNESCO General Conference

Paris, France, November 6, 2015

Mr. Chairman, Madam Director General, Ladies and gentlemen,

It is a great honor for me to welcome participants and guests of the 38th Session of the UNESCO General Conference.

UNESCO plays a special role in the UN Family.

This Organization, established 70 years ago, is rightly called "the conscience of humanity".

It has made a significant contribution in maintaining our **cultural and historical heritage and** expanding international co-operation in **education**, **science and communications**.

Kazakhstan fully supports UNESCO in its work, the main priorities of which are important areas within the **UN Sustainable Development Goals**.

Twenty years ago, addressing the member states from this podium, I spoke about the goals and objectives of the young state of Kazakhstan.

In the last two decades, our country has made substantial progress and has met **most of the UN Millennium Development Goals**.

The poverty level has been reduced 11 times from 34% to 3%.

We have built hundreds of schools and hospitals.

Kazakhstan's GDP has increased 19 times with per capita income reaching the level of middle-income states.

Life expectancy of our citizens now exceeds 70 years.

Child and maternal mortality has decreased.

We have made significant progress in combating AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis.

We have adopted the **Kazakhstan - 2050 Strategy** that is fully in line with the Sustainable Development Goals with the ambition of **joining the ranks of the world's 30 most developed states.**

Delegates,

In recent years, our world has seen the escalation of threats and clashes based on ethnic, cultural and religious divisions.

The debates of the 70th Session of the *UN General Assembly* underlined the pressing need for a new model for **global development**.

The international initiatives of Kazakhstan are aimed at addressing this important issue.

We propose **2045 Global Strategic Initiative Plan.**

Its main objective is to identify, agree and put in place a global strategy to

eliminate the root causes of wars and conflicts.

It is aimed at giving a **new development impetus based on fair access for all nations to global infrastructure, resources and markets** as well as universal responsibility for human development.

A nuclear-free world should be a central goal.

To achieve this aim, we propose to adopt a <u>Universal declaration on</u> achieving a nuclear-weapons-free world.

In 2016 we will celebrate **25 years** of signing the **Decree on closing the Semipalatinsk Nuclear Test Site**.

The terrible legacy of 40 years of nuclear tests on our country and citizens is an important reminder of the need for the international community to unite to achieve a world free of nuclear weapons.

Forming a common front to fight **terrorism and religious extremism** is another pressing global challenge.

Today the lands of **ancient Mesopotamia** – the cradle of world civilizations and our main religions – are subject to barbaric destruction and looting.

The actions of so called *Islamic State* are causing **irrecoverable damage** to the unique historical and cultural heritage of the Middle East.

Kazakhstan strongly condemns terrorism and extremism in any manifestation.

We propose the establishment of a <u>common global network for</u> <u>addressing international terrorism and extremism</u> under the auspices of the UN.

It is important that our collective efforts in countering Islamic radicalism do not confuse this distorted extremism with peaceful Islam.

We can best counteract extremism through inter-cultural and inter-religious dialogue.

This is the goal of establishing an "Islam against terrorism" Forum.

We must harness the capacity of UNESCO to help achieve peace and international stability.

I propose to establish an <u>International Academy on Maintaining Peace</u> and <u>Sustainable Development under UNESCO</u>.

Basing on best international practices, this Academy could develop **progressive ideas and practical measures** to maintain peace and ensure sustainable development.

Of particular importance is the search for ways of **early conflict prevention** through the implementation of **the UNESCO** *Culture of Peace* Concept.

Its principles chime with Kazakhstan's initiative to develop <u>the NEW</u> <u>FUTURE Concept</u> under the auspices of the UN.

Ladies and gentlemen!

In the mid-13th century the French monk *Guillaume de Rubrouck* visited the ancient Kazakh city *Kayalyk* where **Christian**, **Buddhist**, **Manichean and Muslim communities** coexisted peacefully.

Last year at the initiative of Kazakhstan, China and Kyrgyzstan **eight Kazakh archaeological sites, located on** *the Great Silk Road,* were inscribed on *the UNESCO World Heritage List.*

They include the city of *Kayalyk* – an ancient symbol of tolerance, religious toleration and friendship.

Recently Kazakhstan has celebrated the 550th Anniversary of the Kazakh Khanate.

We are reviving the historical and cultural heritage of *the Great Steppe* and its spiritual values.

The monuments on the UNESCO Tentative List, among them *Otrar, Turkestan, Sauran, Syganak*, are carefully preserved.

In 2013, for the first time Kazakhstan became a member of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee.

This imposes a special responsibility on us to preserve historical and cultural heritage.

Of particular importance is the recognition and revival of the Great Silk Road's traditions.

Its history proves that close cooperation and mutual cultural enrichment are the basis of peace and progress for all humanity.

I am pleased to note the inclusion in the UNESCO Calendar of Anniversaries of the 1000th Anniversary of Almaty, which was the hub of the Zhetysu segment of the Silk Road.

As a multi-ethnic and multi-religious country, Kazakhstan promotes the ideas of **tolerance and inter-ethnic harmony**.

The Congress of Leaders of World and Traditional Religions, convened at our initiative, has become a recognized platform for international dialogue, highly appreciated by the UN.

It was at Kazakhstan's initiative that the UN declared 2013 to 2022 <u>the</u> <u>International Decade for the Rapprochement of Cultures.</u>

We provide full support, including funding, for the program's successful implementation by UNESCO.

We hope for the support of UNESCO Member States for the establishment of <u>a Center for the Rapprochement of Cultures under the auspices of UNESCO</u> in Astana.

Participants of the Conference,

I am convinced that education is key to peaceful coexistence, sustainable development and the progress of humanity in the 21st century.

As a world leader in the area of education, **UNESCO should develop** common standards of education quality to which all countries should strive to attain.

For our part, Kazakhstan is already modernizing our national system of education.

Among the post-Soviet states, our country was one of the first participants

of the European zone of higher education.

Five years ago, we joined the *European Cultural Convention* and Bologna Process.

A national network of intellectual schools and international level colleges has been established in the country.

The Nazarbayev University is a highly advanced project in the field of science and education.

Overall, Kazakhstan is one of the four leaders among 130 countries with respect to the UNESCO Education Development Index.

In order to support the UN Initiative "Sustainable Energy for All", the EXPO World Exhibition will be held in Astana in 2017.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite all states to participate in EXPO 2017.

My proposal is to organize a **separate** "<u>UNESCO Pavilion</u>" within the exhibition to demonstrate its key in achieving sustainable development.

Using the EXPO 2017 Exhibition infrastructure we intend to open <u>an</u> <u>International Center for the Development of Green Technologies under the auspices of the UN.</u>

I suggest UNESCO becoming a scientific co-sponsor of this Center.

Kazakhstan supports efforts to improve UNESCO's efficiency and to strengthen its credibility, modernization and adaptation to the challenges of our time.

I am confident that UNESCO will continue to be an effective forum for cooperation between states and nations to promote enlightenment, humanism and peace.

May I wish all the participants of the General Conference successful work for the benefit of humanity!
