SPEECH

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HEAD OF THE VIETNAMESE DELEGATION AT THE 38TH UNESCO GENERAL CONFERENCE

We are committed to provide all necessary material conditions and resources for the operation of these two centers, thus creating exchange and learning opportunities for young and female scientists in ASEAN and other regions, especially Africa. This will also help increase the visibility of UNESCO in Viet Nam and Southeast Asia.

Being aware of the importance of the Biosphere Reserves, Viet Nam is working closely with UNESCO in implementing a number of initiatives to ensure each citizen will become an environment ambassador with greater responsibilities for bio-diversity protection. We also look forward to UNESCO's continued support for the activities of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves, and promoting the initiative on green growth and low carbon in biosphere reserves. Such initiative is conducive to the SDGs and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The Global Geopark has been playing a ever greater role as a contributor to sustainable socio-economic development in local areas. Viet Nam supports the transformation of the Global Geopark program into an official program of UNESCO and is willing to provide appropriate resources for this program.

In the area of information and communication, with the assistance of UNESCO, Viet Nam is taking various measures to ensure access to information for the local communities and ethnic minority groups in remote areas in order to make sure no one is left behind in today's interconnected world.

Today's globalized world is exerting strong impacts on the social development of all nations. Therefore, increasing cooperation between policy

makers and scientists in social management has become more important than ever before. On that note, Viet Nam has established a Sub-Committee on Management of Social Transformation to deal with arising matters in social management.

Finally, Viet Nam always supports UNESCO's endeavors to contribute to world peace and development. We are committed to stand by UNESCO and other member countries in implementing its programs and initiatives to bring UNESCO closer to the people and communities all over the world.
