




## School system challenges

Counteract the old system with a high degree of unemployment, import of, often short term, experts, and outmigration of youth. It is normally the females that leave and males who stay behind, leading to many social problems.

- Skilled teachers with local roots (language, culture, local knowledges)
- education driven by central norms and poorly fit the local needs
- Provide training that is relevant for local job markets.

## What this meeting can do

- State the obvious: Education matters!
- Good practice should be identified and promoted (CA+ NO UNESCO initiative)
- Monitoring and Quality norms should be adapted to value RELEVANT knowledge and skill sets.





## Higher Education challenges

- Relevant


## Challenges this meeting should address

- Arctic Monitoring Network, to be closely linked to local education and knowledge institutions.





- The University of the Arctic has grown to a network of 116
   Universities, Colleges, and other higher education
   institutions, as well as Indigenous Peoples' Organisations,
   evenly distributed in the Circumpolar North.
- UArctic organises a comprehensive set of programs, including cooperation in the delivery of undergraduate and graduate studies, mobility, and promotion of northern education and research capabilities.
