Election of the Members of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Body

- 1. In its first session and by its Resolution 5/MSP 1, the Meeting of States Parties established a Scientific and Technical Advisory Body to the Meeting of States Parties to the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage (hereinafter referred to as "the Advisory Body") according to Article 23.4 of the Convention. In the same Resolution, the Meeting of States Parties adopted the Statutes of the Advisory Body.
- 2. In accordance with Rule 21 of the Rules of Procedure of the Meeting of States Parties to the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage (hereinafter referred to as "the Rules of Procedure of the Meeting"), a State Party may nominate an expert for elections to represent it in the Advisory Body.
- 3. According to Rule 22 of the Rules of Procedure of the Meeting, the election of members of the Advisory Body shall be conducted with due regard to the principle of equitable geographical distribution and the desirability of a gender balance as well as a balance of domains of expertise. Experts shall have a scientific, professional and ethical background at the national and/or international level adequate to the task, in conformity with the objective and purpose of the Convention.
- 4. In accordance with Article 2 (a) of its Statutes, the Advisory Body shall be composed of twelve Members. The Meeting of Parties may increase this number to up to twenty four depending on the number of States Parties. They shall have a scientific, professional and ethical background at the national and/or international level, in particular, in the field of underwater archaeology, international law, materials science (metallurgy, archaeo-biology, geology), and conservation of underwater cultural heritage sites and/or archaeological underwater artefacts.
- 5. With the invitations to the second session of the Meeting of States Parties, each State Party had been asked to nominate a candidate for elections to represent it in the Advisory Body, in

compliance with Rule 24 of the Rules of Procedure of the Meeting. The provisional list of candidates and the background information required is to be found in document UCH/09/2.MSP/220/INF. 4.

- 7. The Meeting of States Parties may wish to adopt the following resolution:

The Meeting of States Parties,

- 2. <u>Decides</u> that, for the purpose of the elections of the Members to the Scientific and Technical Advisory Body to the Meeting of States Parties to the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage, the 12 seats will be distributed among the electoral groups as follows:
