Summary of debate	The Chairperson, Dr. Abdulla El Reyes (United Arab Emirates), opened the Debate 4 on item 4.23 – Proclamation of 28 September as the "International Day for the Universal Access to Information (38 C/70). The Chairperson of CI Commission gave the floor to Morocco which introduced the item 4.23.		
	The representative of the Director-General, Mr Guy Berger, Director of the Division for Freedom of Expression and Media Development, made a short presentation on the proposal, submitted by Angola, Morocco and Nigeria, to proclaim an "International Day for the Universal Access to Information" on 28 September. Item 4.23 was examined by the Executive Board at its 197th session (197 EX/Decision 35). 38 C/70 document transmits to the General Conference the recommendation made by the Executive Board at its 197 <sup>th</sup> session.		
	Dr. Abdulla El Reyes opened the floor to the delegates for their comments.		
	The following countries took the floor: Egypt, Kenya, United Republic of Tanzania, Argentina, Colombia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Malaysia, Thailand, Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, China, India, Sudan, Nigeria, Iraq, Republic of Zambia, Viet Nam		
	The representative of the Director-General, Mr Guy Berger, replied to the statements made		

by the representatives of Member States.
The Chairperson of CI Commission invited the Delegates to examine the draft resolution contained in paragraph 2 of document 38 C/70. The draft resolution was recommended to the General Conference for its adoption. No objections were formulated by the Member States.
Dr. Abdulla El Reyes brought to a close debate 4 and suggested moving on the Debate 5 on item 6.1 – Draft recommendation on preservation and access to documentary heritage including digital heritage (38 C/24).

Summary of debate	The representative of the Director-General, Indrajit Banerjee, Director of the Knowledge Societies Division, presented the Draft recommendation on preservation and access to documentary heritage including digital heritage (38 C/24). The document 38 C/24 presents the final draft of the Recommendation concerning the Preservation of, and Access to Documentary Heritage, including in Digital Form, for consideration and possible adoption by the General Conference. By 36 C/Resolution 59, the General Conference requested the Director-General to initiate an in-depth reflection on evaluating and strengthening the Memory of the World Programme (MOW). As its 190 <sup>th</sup> session the Executive Board requested the Director-General to undertake a preliminary study of the technical, financial and legal aspects on the desirability of a standard-setting instrument on preservation and access to documentary heritage for examination by its 191 <sup>st</sup> session. At its 191 <sup>st</sup> session, the Executive Board recommended that the 37 <sup>th</sup> session of the General Conference decide that the issue of preservation and access to documentary heritage, including digital heritage, be regulated at the international level by means of a Recommendation. The General Conference, at its 37 <sup>th</sup> session, invited the Director-General to submit to it at its 38 <sup>th</sup> session, for possible adoption, a draft standard-setting instrument in the form a Recommendation (37 C/Resolution 53). The Chairperson, Dr. Abdulla El Reyes (United Arab Emirates), opened the floor to the delegates for their comments.
