The Executive Board,

A. Content of the report

- 1. Recalling recommendation 13 of 33 C/Resolution 92, and 33 C/Resolution 78, in which the General Conference requested the Executive Board to report to it at each session on the implementation of the current Programme and Budget (C/5), together with the results achieved in the previous biennium (C/3),
- 2. <u>Further recalling</u> 34 C/Resolution 89 inviting the Executive Board to have a wider and more strategic assessment of the performance of the programmes, including the EX/4 document, by expressing its views progressively during the biennium through explicit decisions on the performance of individual programmes at the main-line-of-action level,

- 3. <u>Having examined</u> document 189 EX/4 –37 C/3 Draft and document 189 EX/INF.10 summarizing the debate of the Ad Hoc Preparatory Group,
- 4. <u>Thanks</u> the Director-General for her presentation of key achievements, challenges and lessons learned and proposals for the way forward for each of the five major programmes and the two global priorities, as well as the new presentation of financial information on the resources used to implement the Programme and Budget;
- Stresses that the work on the EX/4 format and content should continue to be driven by 184 EX/Decision 4 and 186 EX/Decision 4, which call for more impact-and-evidencebased analysis;
- 6. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to pursue her reflection, in close collaboration with Member States, taking into account the debate of the Executive Board at its 189th session, specifically on the global leadership of UNESCO in its areas of competence, notably in the context of the preparation of the post-2015 Millennium Development Goals (MDG) agenda;
- 7. <u>Reiterates</u> the importance of UNESCO's international and intergovernmental programmes in achieving the mission and objectives of the Organization;
- 8. <u>Also invites</u> the Director-General to include the results of her reflections in her preliminary proposals for documents 37 C/4 and 37 C/5;

B. Format of the report

- Recalling 176 EX/Decision 29, 34 C/Resolution 89, 184 EX/Decision 4, 186 EX/Decision 4, and document 179 EX/4 Part II –35 C/3 Draft,
- 10. Reiterating its commitment to results-based management (RBM) as a vital tool for evidence-based strategic decision-making by the governing bodies,
- 11. <u>Underlining</u> the contribution expected from the C/3 document in terms of accountability for results and financial and administrative transparency, and as a tool for the planning of future programme cycles,
- 12. Recognizing that document 189 EX/4 37 C/3 Draft builds on the continued efforts to strengthen reporting on the performance of the programme in response to 34 C/Resolution 89,
- 13. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to pursue her efforts to ensure a more analytical, self-critical, evidence-based, research-based and impact-oriented reporting which:
 - (a) establishes clear linkages between the results achieved and the MLAs and expected results in the C/5 document, paying particular attention to capacitybuilding at the national level, and making good use of the complementary empirical evidence provided in the programme evaluations conducted by the Internal Oversight Service (IOS);
 - (b) uses a more coherent approach across all sectors and the two global priorities;
 - (c) includes a section on the results achieved by the programme-related and corporate services in the main printed document of future EX/4 documents, at least on an annual basis;
 - (d) includes analytical reporting on achievements, challenges and opportunities covering UNESCO's entire action towards the two global priorities;

- 14. Also invites the Director-General to:
 - (a) renew the past practice of providing validation from the Internal Oversight Service on the results achieved in the previous biennium, and to present in the C/3 document the findings and conclusions of the Internal Oversight Service that are relevant for the reinforcement of results-based monitoring and reporting;
 - (b) continue to address the challenges relating to results-based management identified by the Internal Oversight Service in documents 35 C/3 and 36 C/3, and to present to it at its 190th session a time-bound action plan for implementing the recommendations of the Internal Oversight Service in order to enhance monitoring and reporting.

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Preparations for drafting the Programme and Budget for 2014-2017 (37 C/5)

- 1. <u>Having considered</u> document 189 EX/5 on the follow-up to decisions and resolutions adopted by the Executive Board and General Conference, and in particular concerning preparations for drafting the Programme and Budget for 2014-2017 (37 C/5),
- 2. Recalling 187 EX/Decision 17 (III.A) relating to the review of the consultation process for the preparation of the C/4 and C/5 documents, the findings of the independent external evaluation of UNESCO (185 EX/18) and related decisions and resolutions, in particular 36 C/Resolution 112,
- 3. <u>Aware</u> that the programming of the Organization needs to be based on a full evaluation of the results of the programme of the previous biennium and the most inclusive evaluation of the ongoing implementation of the programme adopted for the current biennium;
- 4. <u>Further aware</u> of the review of all flagship programmes proposed by the Director-General in her roadmap (189 EX/15 Part I Add.):
- 5. <u>Mindful</u> that, in order to draw maximum benefit from the lessons learned from such evaluations and reviews, the consultation process for the preparation of the C/4 and C/5 documents needs to be revisited.
- 6. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to consult with key partners, including agencies of the United Nations system, on UNESCO's possible contribution and added value to the achievement of the internationally agreed development goals, with a view to further clarifying UNESCO's role and function in documents 37 C/4 and 37 C/5;
- 7. Requests the Director-General, taking into account 36 C/Resolution 104 and 36 C/Resolution 112, to present to it at its 190th session her preliminary proposals for the next Programme and Budget;

- 8. <u>Decides</u>, taking into account the preliminary proposals presented by the Director-General, and its own decision in this regard, that:
 - (a) a new questionnaire, which includes both quantitative and qualitative aspects, shall be sent to Member States, National Commissions, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental organizations in March/April 2012, with a request that each Member State should submit a single reply on behalf of both its government and its National Commission;
 - (b) the Director-General shall prepare her preliminary proposal for document 37 C/5 based on the responses to the questionnaire as well as on 36 C/Resolution 112;
 - (c) regional consultations of Member States and National Commissions shall be held after completion of the questionnaire;
 - (d) the results of the regional consultations shall be submitted for consideration at its 190th session.

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Implementation of 36 C/Resolution 43 and 187 EX/Decision 5 relating to the Ascent to the Mughrabi Gate in the Old City of Jerusalem¹

The Executive Board,

- 1. Having examined document 189 EX/5,
- Recalling previous decisions, including 176 EX/Special Plenary Meeting/Decision, decision 34 COM 7A.20 of the World Heritage Committee at its 34th session (Brasilia, 2010), and 187 EX/Decision 5 concerning the Ascent to the Mughrabi Gate in the Old City of Jerusalem,
- 3. Also recalling the relevant provisions on the protection of cultural heritage, including in the four Geneva Conventions (1949), the relevant provisions of the Hague Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict of 1954, the Convention for the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage of 1972, the inscription of the Old City of Jerusalem and its Walls at the request of Jordan on the World Heritage List (1981) and on the List of World Heritage in Danger (1982), and the recommendations, resolutions and decisions of UNESCO,
- 4. Reaffirming the purpose and spirit of the professional encounter at the technical level on 13 January 2008, as well as the follow-up meeting on 24 February 2008,
- 5. <u>Noting</u> the Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Reinforced Monitoring Reports and its Addendum prepared by the World Heritage Centre,
- 6. Recognizes the concerns raised in this regard about the decision by the Jerusalem District Planning and Construction Commission on the town planning scheme for the Mughrabi Ascent, and the subsequent decision by Israel's National Council for Planning and Construction to adopt "an alternative plan for the Mughrabi Ascent", approved on 31 October 2010 by the above-mentioned Commission;

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Adopted by consensus.

- 7. Requests that, despite the decisions mentioned in paragraph 6, the process for the design of the Mughrabi Ascent be inclusive of all parties concerned, in accordance with obligations and duties of such parties as stipulated in the content of previous World Heritage Committee decisions;
- 8. Reaffirms in this regard, that no measures, unilateral or otherwise, should be taken which will affect the authenticity and integrity of the site, in accordance with the Convention for the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage of 1972 and the relevant provisions on the protection of cultural heritage of the Hague Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict of 1954;
- 9. <u>Notes</u> the request made by the World Heritage Committee in previous decisions, and requests, in this regard, the Israeli authorities to continue full cooperation with all concerned parties, in particular with Jordanian and Wagf experts;
- Acknowledges receipt of the Jordanian design for the restoration and preservation of the Mughrabi Ascent, submitted to the World Heritage Centre on 27 May 2011, and thanks Jordan for its cooperation in accordance with the relevant provisions of UNESCO conventions for the protection of cultural heritage;
- 11. <u>Affirms</u>, in this regard, that the UNESCO-initiated process for follow-up to the design of the Mughrabi Ascent, which is aimed at proactively facilitating an accepted and monitored solution concerning the Mughrabi Ascent among all parties concerned, be coordinated with all such parties, in accordance with the spirit and content of previous World Heritage Committee decisions;
- 12. <u>Acknowledges</u> in this regard, the concerns raised regarding Israel's submission and content of its plan for the Mughrabi Ascent, referred to in paragraph 6, and <u>requests</u> the World Heritage Centre to be proactive and follow closely, in the context of the Reinforced Monitoring Mechanism, the developments associated with this process;
- 13. Also notes with satisfaction the access provided by Israel to the Mughrabi Ascent for Jordanian and Waqf experts on 23 May, 8 August and 28 November 2010, and reiterates its request that Israel continue the cooperation commenced with all parties concerned, in particular with Jordanian and Waqf experts to enable agreement on, and implementation of, a final design for the restoration and preservation of the Mughrabi Ascent among all parties concerned;
- 14. <u>Further notes</u> in this regard, reports of preliminary discussions between Jordan and Israel concerning the Mughrabi Ascent, which stipulate, *inter alia*, that no measures, unilateral or otherwise, shall be taken on the site in accordance with paragraph 8 above, and the necessity of an accepted design and implementation thereof among all parties concerned; and <u>welcomes</u> the recognition by the parties concerned of the need for coordination on this issue;
- 15. <u>Expresses</u> its thanks to the Director-General for the action she is taking to facilitate the dialogue and professional exchanges between all the parties concerned;
- 16. <u>Reiterates</u> the call of the Director-General to organize a follow-up meeting of experts as soon as possible, once the parties concerned have reached agreement;
- 17. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to submit to it a progress report thereon at its 190th session.

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Action plan for the review of the 1976 Recommendation on the Development of Adult Education

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1974 Recommendation on the Status of Scientific Researchers

 - (a) the Working Capital Fund, which is an interest-free loan from Member States, is intended to provide finance for expenditure against the approved budget of the Organization (C/5 document), pending the receipt of assessed contributions from Member States;

- (b) the Working Capital Fund should only be used to bridge short-term cash flow difficulties owing to temporary arrears in assessed contributions, and not to finance budget shortfalls or cover chronic or long-lasting arrears, for which policy decisions by the governing bodies must be sought;
- (c) the current level of the Working Capital Fund is comparable to that of other United Nations agencies, and has been adequate thus far given historical patterns of receipt of assessed contributions;
- (d) this level may be insufficient to address exceptional cash flow difficulties and, therefore, that other mechanisms might be considered in such cases;
- (e) an appropriate level for the Working Capital Fund should be determined, in the light of a number of related internal and external factors affecting the vulnerability of the Organization, including the mechanisms at its disposal to cope with cashflow difficulties;
- (f) a review of the Working Capital Fund should be based on a thorough assessment of the financial situation and reliable projections of the cash-flow situation,
- 6. <u>Decides</u> to maintain the level of the Working Capital Fund for 2012-2013 at \$30 million, as established in 36 C/Resolution 93 (II), paragraph 1 (a);
- 7. <u>Invites</u> the Director-General to submit to it, at its 191st session, a report containing a review by the External Auditor of the appropriate level of the UNESCO Working Capital Fund on a long-term basis, with a view to forwarding its recommendations thereon to the General Conference at its 37th session;

- Reaffirming UNESCO's essential role in ensuring education for all, in protecting the cultural, historical and natural heritage of humanity, and in facilitating the free flow of ideas,
- Recalling United Nations General Assembly resolutions 66/176 and 66/253, <u>also recalling</u> Human Rights Council resolutions S/16-1, S/17-1, S/18-1 and A/HRC/19/L.1Rev.1, and <u>further recalling</u> League of Arab States resolution 7446 dated 12 February 2012,
- 5. <u>Extremely concerned</u> with the continuous deterioration of the situation in the Syrian Arab Republic, and with the violent repression affecting civilians, including children, students and journalists.
- 6. <u>Strongly condemns</u> the continued widespread and systematic violation of human rights and fundamental freedoms by the Syrian authorities, in all UNESCO's fields of competence;
- 7. <u>Urges</u> the Syrian authorities to immediately put an end to all human rights violations, to protect their population, particularly children and students, to restore freedom of expression and communication, and to protect heritage;
- 8. <u>Invites</u> the Director General to report on the implementation of the present decision and on the consequences of the current situation concerning UNESCO's activities and tasks:

 Invites UNESCO, when the situation on the ground so allows, to take all possible measures within its fields of competence in order to resume its essential role, particularly in education, freedom of expression, communication, and the protection of heritage.
