Item 10 Renewal of the mandate of the Group of Experts for Financial and Administrative Matters

The Executive Board,

- 1. Bearing in mind 26 C/Resolution 19.3,
- 2. Referring to its decisions 137 EX/Decision 8.6, 142 EX/Decision 3.1.3, 143 EX/Decision 9.1, 144 EX/Decision 6.10, 148 EX/Decision 5.7, 153 EX/Decision 5.6, 158 EX/Decision 5.6, 163 EX/Decision 5.6, 168 EX/Decision 5.6 and 173 EX/Decision 10 on the Group of Experts on Financial and Administrative Matters.
- 3. <u>Decides</u> to renew the mandate of the above-mentioned Group of Experts. For the 2008-2009 biennium, the Group of Experts will comprise 12 experts designated by 12 Members of the Executive Board, two from each group, as follows:

Mandate and working methods of the Group of Experts on Financial and Administrative Matters

The Executive Board,

- 1. Recalling paragraph III.6(b) of 26 C/Resolution 19.3.
- 2. <u>Recalling</u> its previous decisions, and particularly 137 EX/Decision 8.6, which established an expert group on financial and administrative matters,
- 3. Decides that the mandate of this Group of Experts shall be as follows:
 - (a) to assist the Finance and Administrative Commission in its work with a view to increasing its effectiveness;
 - (b) to examine from a <u>strictly</u> technical point of view the administrative and financial aspects of the documents and issues that the Finance and Administrative Commission refers to it;
 - (c) to raise no matters of policy during its work;

The background of the Group of Experts is attached to this draft resolution for the information of Board Members.

- 4. <u>Decides</u> that the Group of Experts shall normally meet one week before each of the sessions of the Executive Board;
- 5. Renews its decision to finance the expenses of the Group of Experts, including the cost of travel and subsistence allowances for experts not living in Paris whose expenses are not borne by their respective governments, from the budget of the Executive Board;
- 6. <u>Invites</u> Member States to take the necessary steps for the experts designated as members of the group to attend meetings regularly;
- 7. Requests the Director-General to provide every assistance to facilitate the work of the Group.

GROUP OF EXPERTS ON FINANCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

BACKGROUND

- 1. By 136 EX/Decision 3.4.1, Part II, the Executive Board, having examined the reports of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU/REP/89/9) and especially its Recommendation 3 concerning the creation of an experts' group, acknowledged the advisability of establishing a small group of experts which would be drawn from the Finance and Administrative Commission and whose role would be limited to assisting the Commission in a fact-finding and advisory capacity, and also decided to include the question in the agenda of its 137th session.
- 2. At its 137th session the Board decided (137 EX/Decision 8.6) "to set up, on an experimental basis, a group of experts on financial and administrative matters which will be drawn from the Finance and Administrative Commission and to be financed from within the budget provision made for the Executive Board". It also decided on the mandate of the group and concluded that it should be composed of a total of 12 experts, two per electoral group.
- 3. The General Conference, by 26 C/Resolution 19.3 on the modification of Article V and VII of the Constitution regarding the Executive Board, requested this organ in Part III, paragraph 6(b) of the above resolution, to improve, in its new composition, its structure and working methods by all appropriate measures, e.g. by establishing a small advisory committee on administrative and budgetary questions, as was done at the 136th session.
- 4. At its 139th session the Board designated the members of the Group of Experts who commenced their work during the same session (139 EX/Decision 6.10).
- 5. At its 140th session the Board considered for the first time the report of the Group of Experts. Having endorsed the report of the Group, the Executive Board considered the contribution to be positive and decided to continue the practice of financing its costs from within the budget of the Board (140 EX/Decision 7.1). Furthermore, it was noted with appreciation that, as mandated, the Group: (i) concentrated its work on purely financial and administrative matters; and (ii) avoided policy issues.
- 6. At its 144th session the Board decided for the first time on the mandate and working methods of the Group of Experts on Financial and Administrative Matters (144 EX/Decision 6.10).
- 7. The above-mentioned resolution and decisions are annexed.
- 8. Decisions of the Board concerning the renewal of the mandate of the Group of Experts are provided below: 148 EX/Decision 5.7, 153 EX/Decision 5.6, 158 EX/Decision 5.6, 163 EX/Decision 5.6 and 173 EX/Decision 10.

- 1. <u>Having examined</u> the report of the Joint Inspection Unit (JIU/REP/89/9) and especially its Recommendation 3 concerning the creation of expert groups,
- 2. <u>Anxious</u> to discharge fully and efficiently its responsibilities, in particular in financial and administrative matters,
- 3. <u>Convinced</u> of the need to ensure both better preparation of and better follow-up to its decisions,

- 4. Bearing in mind the budgetary constraints facing the Organization,
- 5. <u>Aware</u> that a comprehensive proposal for the reform of the Executive Board has been submitted for consideration by the General Conference,
- 6. <u>Acknowledges</u> the advisability of establishing a small group of experts which would be drawn from the Finance and Administrative Commission and whose role would be limited to assisting the Commission in a fact-finding and advisory capacity;
- 7. <u>Calls</u> on its Members and on Member States to pursue consultations with a view to reaching a consensus on the composition and precise terms of reference of this expert group (appointment procedures, expertise required, necessary conditions to ensure effective participation by all its members, frequency of meetings, including during the intersessional period, definition of tasks, etc.);
- 8. Requests the Director-General to collect and distribute as soon as possible to Board Members and to Member States relevant information and data on similar groups in other institutions of the United Nations family;
- 9. <u>Further requests</u> the Director-General to study the financial and legal implications, and in particular the question of whether the establishment of this expert group requires amendments to the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board, and to communicate these considerations to the 137th session;
- 10. <u>Decides</u> to include in the agenda of its 137th session an item entitled "Establishment of an expert group on financial and administrative matters".
