4 Report by the Director-General on the execution of the programme adopted by the General Conference

> This report is intended to inform the Members of the Executive Board of progress achieved in the execution of the programme adopted by the General Conference.

182 EX/4 Part I of the report contains the main results achieved during the first 18 months of the 2008-2009 biennium, corresponding to document 34 C/5. In order to provide a more concise and strategic account of programme implementation, this report is limited to the following four items: (i) overall assessment of key results for the five major programmes and the UNESCO Institute for Statistics; (ii) UNESCO's contribution to operational policies and activities for development cooperation within the United Nations system; (iii) Progress Report on the implementation of the revised strategy for technical and vocational education and training (TVET); and (iv) Progress Report on the International Year of Planet Earth.

Members of the Executive Board of the Intersectoral Platform on UNESCO's support to countries in Post-Conflict and Post-Disaster (PCPD) situations. The reporting nature of the document does not a priori entail decision-making.

DRAFT PROGRAMME AND BUDGET FOR 2010-2011 (35 C/5)

21 Consideration of the Draft
Programme and Budget for 20102011 (35 C/5) and recommendations of the Executive Board

(Item to be examined by the Joint Meeting of the PX and FA Commissions)

Following consideration of the Director-General's draft Programme and Budget for 2010-2011 (35 C/5), the Executive Board adopted its comments and recommendations thereon in 181 EX/Decision 18, which has become document 35 C/6.

In it, the Board took note of the budget ceiling of US \$671 million which the Director-General had proposed, representing a zero-real growth (ZRG) approach, and of the budgeting techniques. Nevertheless, the Board requested the Director-General to reinforce priority programmes, in particular those relating to Africa, and to further rationalize expenditure linked to Parts I and III of the Draft Programme and Budget. After the Board adopted document 35 C/6, the Director-General had indicated to the Board that he would prepare a revised version of the Draft Programme and Budget, with recosting adjustments in line with the latest IMF figures and with scaled down expenditure levels for Parts I and III. At the same time he indicated that it would not be possible for him to respond to the call for a reinforcement of priority programmes, in particular those relating to Africa, beyond the strengthening he had already proposed in draft document 35 C/5.

Accordingly, the Director-General is submitting to the Board the entire draft document 35 C/5 Rev, with its two volumes

and the accompanying technical note. With two exceptions, no programmatic changes have been made in this revised document. There is no change in the number or order of paragraphs, especially in Volume 2 of the 35 C/5 Rev. The programmatic and strategic components are therefore preserved as are the expected results for all activities when compared to the original Draft 35 C/5. Thus, the policy and programmatic recommendations by the Executive Board in document 35 C/6 remain fully valid and unaffected by this revision.

The revised draft programme and budget before the Board has a budget ceiling of US \$653 million representing a nominal increase of US \$22 million over the 34 C/5 Approved, i.e. a 3.5% nominal growth. Reaching this budget ceiling entailed a cut higher than would have been required by the mere technical adjustments associated with ZRG. This larger reduction was reached through the reduction of budgetary provisions in Part III. Furthermore, the total recosted amounts have been accordingly reduced by US \$10 million, and the amounts of Parts I and III have been pared down by a combined amount of US \$8 million, with a total reduction of US \$18 million compared to the earlier Draft 35 C/5. Thus, the budget envelope has been reduced to an amount below ZRG.

The Executive Board may wish to consider endorsing the budget envelope proposed by the Director-General and to convey its recommendation in an addendum to document 35 C/6.
