# RELATIONS WITH THE SOUTH ASIAN ASSOCIATION FOR REGIONAL COOPERATION (SAARC) AND DRAFT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN UNESCO AND THAT REGIONAL ORGANIZATION (177 EX/59)

- Approves the draft memorandum of understanding contained in Annex II to the abovementioned document;

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

#### between

# the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC)

#### and

# the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO)

<u>Inspired</u> by the spirit of cooperation among Member States, which forms the basis of the foundation and operations of SAARC as well as UNESCO,

<u>Founded</u> upon the commonality of aims, goals and concerns, centred upon the development of UNESCO's fields of competence, e.g. education, culture, communication and information, and the sciences, between SAARC and UNESCO,

<u>Considering</u> the need to strengthen cooperation between UNESCO and the Member States of SAARC, and

<u>Realizing</u> that education, culture, communication and information and the sciences play a key role in socio-economic development and cultural progress,

SAARC and UNESCO agree on this Memorandum of Understanding, taking into account:

- the Charter of the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation;
- the Constitution of UNESCO and its Medium-Term Strategy.

Accordingly, SAARC and UNESCO agree to cooperate mutually, as appropriate and possible and in agreed ways, to help Member States to:

- 1. achieve education for all, agreed upon at the World Education Forum, Dakar, 2000;
- achieve education-related SAARC Development Goals (SDGs);
- 3. promote pluralism through education by promoting dialogue among civilizations;
- 4. promote science and technology education, quality education and teacher training through increased use of ICTs and distance learning;
- 5. conserve the cultural, tangible and intangible, heritage of the Member States; promote and protect the cultural diversity of the Member States, in particular their cultural, natural and intangible heritage as well as through their cultural expressions, while supporting a fruitful intercultural and interreligious dialogue, notably through: (i) protecting and safeguarding activities for cultural heritage; (ii) promoting accession to and implementation of UNESCO's relevant standard-setting instruments; and (iii) enhancing capacity-building initiatives in these fields;
- 6. protect their environment and ecosystem;

- 7. build the capacity required for further advancement of education, culture, communication and information and the sciences in the Member States;
- 8. facilitate technical cooperation including capacity-building in the areas of education, culture, communication and information and the sciences;
- 9. promote freedom of expression and universal access to information.

To achieve the aforesaid aims, SAARC and UNESCO may:

- (i) inform each other of their initiatives and plans relevant to education, culture, communication and information and sciences;
- (ii) exchange reports, technical publications and other documentation relevant to education, culture, communication and information and science activities;
- (iii) promote research, analysis and dissemination of information on such themes as enhancing technical cooperation and human resource development, including programmes in the mutually agreed areas;
- (iv) develop mutually agreed projects and programmes of collaboration.

This Memorandum of Understanding enters into force upon signature by the Secretary-General of SAARC and the Director-General of UNESCO.
