# INVITATIONS TO THE 47TH SESSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION (ICE)

#### **SUMMARY**

Pursuant to the "Regulations for the general classification of the various categories of meetings convened by UNESCO" and in accordance with the draft resolution contained in paragraph 21 of the draft report of Commission II (32 C/72), the Director-General submits to the Board proposals concerning invitations to the 47th session of the International Conference on Education, organized by the UNESCO International Bureau of Education (IBE), to be held in Geneva from 8 to 11 September 2004, and suggests that the Board take, with respect to these proposals, a decision authorizing the convening of this Conference.

Decision proposed: paragraph 11.

#### Introduction

1. Subject to the adoption by the General Conference at its 32nd session of a resolution authorizing the convening of the 47th session of the International Conference on Education (ICE), the Director-General submits to the Executive Board proposals concerning invitations to the Conference whose theme will be: "Quality education for all young people: challenges, trends and priorities". The International Conference will be held in Geneva from 8 to 11 September 2003.

## **Category of the Conference**

2. Under the "Regulations for the general classification of the various categories of meetings convened by UNESCO" (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), this Conference falls into the category of "intergovernmental meetings other than international conferences of States" (category II) and the heads of delegation will therefore represent their governments.

## **Participants**

3. In accordance with the Regulations as they relate to category II meetings, invitations to the Conference are decided on by the Executive Board.

## **Member States and Associate Members (Article 21.1)**

- 4. Under Article 21, paragraph 1, the Executive Board, on the Director-General's proposal and subject to the regulations applicable, shall decide on the Member States and Associate Members whose governments are to be invited.
- 5. In accordance with the above-mentioned article, the Director-General proposes that all Member States and Associate Members be invited to participate, with the right to vote.

## **Non-Member States (Article 21.3)**

6. Under Article 21, paragraph 3, the Executive Board may designate non-Member States to be invited to send observers to the Conference. The Director-General proposes that States that are not members of UNESCO but are members of at least one of the organizations of the United Nations system be invited to send observers. At the time of preparation of this document those States were the following: Brunei Darussalam, Holy See, Liechtenstein and Singapore. In addition, the Director-General proposes that the Executive Board invite to the Conference, as observers, any States that become members of any of the organizations of the United Nations system before the opening of the Conference.

## Palestine (Article 7B)

7. Under Article 7B, the Executive Board shall invite Palestine to send observers to the Conference.

- (b) Other international organizations (Article 21.5)
- 9. Under Article 21, paragraph 5, the Board may decide that the following shall be invited to send observers to the meeting: (a) organizations of the United Nations system with which UNESCO has not concluded mutual representation agreements; (b) other intergovernmental organizations; and (c) international non-governmental organizations, in accordance with the directives concerning UNESCO's relations with those organizations. The Executive Board has also decided on several occasions to invite to category II meetings institutions and foundations that may have an interest in sending observers to these meetings.
- 10. The Director-General proposes that the Executive Board invite the following organizations, foundations and institutions to send observers to the Conference:
- (i) Organizations of the United Nations system with which UNESCO has not concluded an agreement providing for reciprocal representation

11. If the Executive Board approves the proposals contained in paragraphs 3 to 10, it may wish to adopt a draft decision along the following lines:

The Executive Board,

- 1. <u>Recalling</u> that the General Conference at its 32nd session authorized the Director-General to convene the 47th session of the International Conference on Education,
- 2. <u>Having examined</u> the Director-General's proposals concerning invitations to this Conference,

#### 3. Decides:

(a) that invitations to participate in the 47th session of the International Conference on Education with the right to vote will be sent to all Member States and Associate Members of UNESCO;

- (b) that invitations to send observers to the Conference will be sent to the States mentioned in paragraph 6 of document 168 EX/2, which are not members of UNESCO but are members of another organization of the United Nations system, and to any other State that becomes a member of one of the organizations of the United Nations system before the opening date of the Conference;
- (c) that an invitation to send observers to the Conference will be sent to Palestine, as mentioned in paragraph 7 of document 168 EX/2;
- (d) that invitations to send representatives to the Conference will be sent to the organizations of the United Nations system with which UNESCO has concluded mutual representation agreements and which are listed in paragraph 8 of document 168 EX/2;
- (e) that invitations to send observers to the Conference will be sent to the organizations, foundations and institutions listed in paragraph 10 of document 168 EX/2;
- (f) that the Director-General is authorized to send out any other invitations he may deem useful for advancing the work of the Conference, notifying the Executive Board thereof.
