## Remarks by H.E. Mr. Danny Danon Permanent Representative of Israel to the United Nations

That is why I decided not to share my words with you and instead to invite a holocaust survivor from Jerusalem to represent Israel at this important event.

So I would like to invite, Ms. Martha Weiss, a resident of Jerusalem and a survivor of Auschwitz-Birkenau to address you today on *behalf* of the state of Israel and in the *name* of the Jewish people.
