Media arts (musical and written, digital hobbies, video games, graphic arts, design and new technologies related to the arts and creation) are a sector that represent particularly well what Lyon has and aims to become. The city also benefits from the imaging industry, Lyon being the birthplace of cinema.

Fast facts

- The Numeric Center of Lyon employs near to 30,000 people in 2,000 companies, including big leaders in the software, services, telecommunications, multimedia and video games sectors (Cegid, IBM, Jet Multimedia...).
- This Center has been recognized as an international competitiveness cluster by the French State and the Rhône-Alpes Region in July 2005.
- The setting up of two international institutions led to the creation of the Numeric Center: the Global Digital Solidarity Fund and the World Digital Solidarity Agency.

Major media arts institutions

 Lyon Programme for an Information Society (PLSI)

With the objective of "democratising digital", the project was created and set up in Lyon in 2001, with four main priorities: public access to internet, electronic administration, digital education and economic development.
