Nzassa, House of Music and Dance (Treichville, Côte d'Ivoire)

Background	Treichville has long been the heart of cultural life in Abidjan and has many operators and cultural events. But is rich potential cannot flourish in the absence of an adequate institutional, material and technical environment.
Objective	 Create a centre for cultural and economic activities: the Nzassa will be a tool to support creation and distribution, a vocational training centre, a commercial space and an incubator for cultural industries of the music and dance sectors. Promote a participatory approach involving civil society and private and public sectors to formulate and implement concrete measures for music and dance fields.
Partners	This project involves international cooperation (GACD, <i>Organisation internationale de la francophonie</i>), public sector (Municipality of Treichville, Ministry of Culture), private sector (Chamber of Commerce, businesses in the music and dance sectors) and civil society (the NGO <i>Culture et Développement</i>).
Beneficiaries	 The Nzassa project's local stakeholders Music groups, dance companies, stage technicians, labels, and cultural enterprises and professional organizations in music and dance.
Duration	Long-term project launched in 2006
Line of Action	 Foresee the mission of a support structure for cultural industries: the Nzassa Identifying needs and developing a feasibility study (2007-2008). Organising the seminar "Support for Cultural Industries in Africa: Needs, Objectives, Methods, Tools" (May 2008, Abidjan). Thirty-eight cultural managers of the sub-region contributed to better coordinating the support initiatives for cultural enterprises. Establishing a public-private consortium to oversee the setting up and management of Nzassa Ensuring sustainable and efficient management Four-month capacity-building programme for the administrators of Nzassa aimed at providing expertise and know-how to ensure a sustainable and efficient management of the centre, in addition to their active participation in its establishment, resulting in project ownership and success. Support the first operational activities Organising a training workshop for thirty cultural operators on organising and producing concerts (2009). Producing training materials adapted to local realities which support the sustainability of training programmes. Revitalize a West African network of incubators and foster the sharing of experiences Participating in the programme entitled "Supporting the West African network of music business incubators in the music sector", supported by the EU/ACP, by conducting a survey on the economic activities in the music sectors of Dakar, Ouagadougou and Treichville resulting in a qualitative and quantitative database (2009/2010). In the framework of the sub-regional meeting entitled "Incubators for Enterprises in the West African Music Industry" (Dakar, 22 to 24 June 2010), present the findings of the survey in order to facilitate the formulation o
