The Conference of the Allied Ministers of Education was convened by the British Minister of Education, the Rt. Hon. Richard Austen Butler, then President of the Board of Education, on 16 November 1942.

The following countries were represented from the beginning of the Conference : Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Greece, The Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Yugoslavia and Great Britain.

Luxembourg, The United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics joined the Conference at its fourth meeting on 25 May 1943, Australia, Canada, China, India, New Zealand and South Africa at the fifth meeting on 27 July 1943. From the twelfth meeting on 12 July 1944 the United States of America participated in the work of the Conference. The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics was not represented at the last two meetings.

Studebaker, Mr. Grayson, H. Kefauver, Mr. Ralph E. Turner, and Dean Mildred Thompson were members of this Commission. The Commission held two open meetings with the Conference of Allied Ministers of Education and proposed the development of the Conference of Allied Ministers of Education into the United Nations Organisation for Educational and Cultural Reconstruction.

The Conference of Allied Ministers of Education established at its 6th meeting on October 5th 1945 an Executive Bureau which was to meet fortnightly, the first meeting to be convened on 27 October 1945.

The membership of the Executive Bureau was as follows : 1 representative of France, one of Great Britain and one or two representatives of each of the following groups of Members. Group A : Belgium, Luxembourg, The Netherlands and Norway. Group B : Czechoslovakia, Greece, Yugoslavia, Poland. Group C : The British Dominions and India. China, the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics appointed observers to the Executive Bureau.

Sir Ernest Barker was asked to accept the Chairmanship of the Commission. Mr. Richard Seymour, Deputy Secretary-General of the British Council was nominated Secretary. The following countries were represented by their delegates from the first meeting : Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Greece, Norway, The Netherlands, Poland, Yugoslavia and Great Britain. From the 9th meeting, on 24th June 1943, The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America were represented; India and Canada from the 12th meeting on 29th July 1943; China and South Africa from the 14th meeting on 16th September 1943; Luxembourg from the 16th meeting on 14th October 1943; Denmark from the 35th meeting on 29th June 1944; Australia from the 51st meeting on 28th June 1945; New Zealand by an observer from the 53rd meeting on 13th September 1945.

HISTORY COMMITTEE

In the second meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission held on 11 March 1943 a Sub-Committee was formed to consider further the recommendations to be made to the President's Conference with regard to the production and supply of history text-books of an objective character for enemy occupied countries after the war. This Committee consisted primarily of the Chairman, Sir Ernest Barker, Mrs Parkes, Monsieur Gros, Dr. Sommerfelt and Dr. Opocensky. The Plenary meeting of the Conference had given instructions that the Sub-Committee should be expanded so as to include representatives of all the nations represented on the Commission. It was also instructed to advise on a brief history of the war. From the second meeting the following countries were represented : United Kingdom, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Norway, Yugoslavia, Greece and Poland; The United States of America from the fourth meeting; The Netherlands from the fifth meeting; The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics from the eighth meeting.

The final Book-Pool Committee was created at the 23rd meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission on 30 December 1943. At the fifteenth Meeting of the Conference of the Allied Ministers of Education, on 10th January 1945, the Chairman the R.H. R.A. Butler suggested to the Conference, which agreed, that the Executive Bureau should consider what steps could be taken immediately by the Conference to deal with the problem of children who had suffered mental and physical disabilities during the occupation of their countries. The Bureau agreed at its 27th meeting on 17th January 1945 to set up a Commission to deal with this matter. Delegates from all the occupied countries and from China, the U.S.A., the U.S.S.R. and the United Kingdom were invited to attend this Commission.

At the 14th Meeting held on 10th May 1944, the Bureau of the Conference decided that, for the purpose of examination of the copies of the Allied Governments to the questionnaire on basic scholastic Equipment (Paper AEE/A/56) a special Commission should be set up, consisting mainly of experts in this field of school supplies. It was agreed that Dr. Devik (Norway) should be asked to become Chairman of the Commission and Mr. Van Dyck, Secretary. All the Governments represented at the Conference should be asked to nominate experts to serve on the Commission.
