

In April 1944 the Government of the United States of America sent to London a Commission headed by a Member of the American Congress, J. William Fulbright. Mr. Archibald Mo Leish, Mr. John W. Studebaker, Mr. Greyson, H. Refeuver, Mr. Ralph E. Turner, and Dean Mildred Thompson were members of this Commission. The Commission held two open meetings with the Conference of Allied Ministers of Education and proposed the development of the Conference of Allied Ministers of Education into the United Mations Organisation for Educational and Cultural Reconstruction.

The Conference of Allied Ministers of Education established at its 5th meeting on October 5th 1945 an Executive Bureau which was to meet fortnightly, the first meeting to be convened on 27 October 1943.

The membership of the Emecutive Bureau was as follows: I representative of France, one of Great Britain and one or two representatives of each of the following groups of Dembers. Group A s Belgium, Luxembourg, The Netherlands and Norwey. Group B s Csechoslovakia, Greece, Yugoslavia, Poland. Group C s The British Deminions and India. China, the United States of America and the Union of Seviet Socialist Republics appointed Sheervers to the Emecutive Bureau.

The following countries were represented by their delegates from the first meeting : Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Greece, Norway, The Netherlands, Poland, Yugoslavia and Great Britain. From the 9th meeting, on 24th June 1945, The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the United States of America were represented; India and Canada from the 12th meeting on 29th July 1943; China and South Africa from the 14th meeting on 16th September 1943; Luxembourg from the 16th meeting on 14th October 1943; Dermark from the 35th meeting on 29th June 1944; Australia from the 51st meeting on 28th June 1945; New Zealand by an observer from the 53rd meeting on 13th September 1945.

In the second meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission held on 11 March 1945 a Sub-Committee was formed to consider further the recommendations to be made to the President's Comference with regard to the production and supply of history text-books of an objective character for enemy occupied countries after the war. This Committee consisted primarly of the Chairman, Sir Ernest Barker, Mrs Parkes, Monsiour Gros, Dr. Sommerfelt and Dr. Opocensky. The Plensry meeting of the Conference had given instructions that the Sub-Committee should be expended to as to include representatives of all the nations represented on the Commission. It was also instructed to advise on a brief history of the war. From the second meeting the following countries were represented a United Kingdom, Belgium, Czechoslovskia, France, Horway, Yugoslavia, Greece and Poland; The United States of America from the fourth meeting: The Netherlands from the fifth meeting.

At the 14th meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission, held on 16 September 1945 the Secretary of the Commission reported about a meeting which was held to discuss the question of a book-pool. Representatives from the following British Institutions were present a Library Association, The Mational Central Library, The Ministry of Supply, Aslib, Friends of the Mational Libraries, Board of Education, International Federation of University Women and British Council. The 16th meeting of the same Commission held on 28 October 1943 added to the membership of the Book-Pool Committee three representatives of the Commission a Dr. Jan Opocensky (Csechoslovskia), Dr. Maria Danilewics (Poland), and Mr. Als (Luxembourg). The final Book-Pool Committee was created at the 23rd meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission on 30 December 1943. The members were a Sir Ernest Barker, Mr. Seymour, Mr. Richardson, Mrs. Danilewics, Dr. Opocensky, Mr. Als, Mr. Mc Colvin, Captain Wright, Mr. Welsford.

The Committee so established was there maned a Inter-Allied Book Centre Committee.

At the 21st meeting of the Books and Periodicals Commission held on 25 November 1945, Professor Timmermans suggested that a sub-committee might be appointed to deal with rationing of books. It was decided that Dr. Sommerfelt, Dr. Opocensky, Professor Timmermans and Mrs Danilewics be members of this Committee. Mr. Blasum was, in the next meeting on 2nd December, elected to this Committee.

At the fifteenth Meeting of the Conference of the Allied Ministers of Edmontion, on 10th January 1945, the Chairman the R.H. R.A. Butler suggested to the Conference, which agreed, that the Executive Bureau should consider what steps could be taken immediately by the Conference to deal with the problem of children who had suffered mental and physical disabilities during the occupation of their countries. The Bureau agreed at its 27th meeting on 17th January 1945 to set up a Commission to deal with this matter. Delegates from all the occupied countries and from China, the U.S.A., the U.S.S.R. and the United Mingdom were invited to attend this Commission.

At the 14th Meeting held on 10th May 1944, the Bureau of the Conference decided that, for the purpose of examination of the copies of the Allied Governments to the questionnaire on basic scholastic Equipment (Paper AME/A/56) a special Commission should be set up, consisting mainly of experts in this field of school supplies. It was agreed that Dr. Devik (Moreny) should be usined to become Chairman of the Commission and Mr. Van Dyck, Secretary. All the Governments represented at the Conference should be asked to nominate experts to serve on the Commission.
