- The 37th session of the General Conference will be opened in a formal ceremony by the outgoing President, H.E. Ms Katalin Bogyay, Ambassador and Permanent Delegate of Hungary to UNESCO and President of the 36th session of the General Conference.
- The UNESCO Chorus and Orchestra conducted by Mr Jorge Lozano-Corres will perform "Va, Pensiero" from the opera Nabucco to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the Italian composer Giuseppe Verdi, born on 10 October 1813.
- The Chairperson of the Executive Board, H.E. Ms Alessandra Cummins, and the Director- General, Ms Irina Bokova, will make statements.
- The election to the Presidency of the 37th session of the General Conference will take place in the afternoon, during the second plenary meeting.
- H. R. H. Princesse Marie of Denmark is visiting UNESCO on the occasion of the 37th session of the General Conference. She will be delivering a speech in the Plenary in the morning session (foreseen at 12:30).

Yesterday, Monday 4 November 2013

• The Interregional Meeting of National Commissions for UNESCO on the occasion of the 37th session of the General Conference took place. The event was opened by Ms Irina Bokova, Director-General of UNESCO. Major topics discussed included: contribution of National Commissions to UNESCO's engagement in the post-2015 development agenda, their activities targeting youth, interface and cooperation between UNESCO field offices and National Commissions, and new modalities of the Participation Programme. A total of 160 representatives from 110 National Commissions and Permanent Delegations to UNESCO attended the meeting.

• The **Leaders' Forum** on the theme of "UNESCO mobilizing for and contributing to the post-2015 agenda through education, the sciences, culture and communication and information" will take place on 6 November 2013, Room I.

This forward-looking policy dialogue, launched in 2011, is intended to address issues of strategic, global and interdisciplinary interest with a view to providing general orientations for the work of the Organization. With the participation of high-level officials from 66 Member States, this event will be of particular importance at a time when the General Conference will decide on the new Medium-Term Strategy, which for the first time will stretch over a period of eight years, from 2014 to 2021. Special attention will be paid to the global priorities of the Organization, Africa and Gender Equality, as well as to the needs of youth, Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS).

The Heads of State or Government who will be present at the Leaders' Forum are the following:

- H.E. Mr Moncef Marzouki, President of the Republic of Tunisia

- Ms Marie Madeleine Mborantsuo, President of the Constitutional Court of Gabon

The sessions of the Leaders' Forum will be moderated by H.E. Mr Shashi Tharoor, Minister of State for Human Resource Development of India and Mr Stephen Cole, Senior Presenter Al Jazeera English, Doha and London.

Yesterday

 The General Conference unanimously elected **Dr. Hao Ping**, Vice Minister of Education of China and Chairperson of Chinese National Commission for UNESCO, as its **37th President**.

The Vice-Presidents of the General Conference, the Chairpersons, Vice-Chairpersons and Rapporteurs of the commissions and committees were also elected. For more details on the elections, please refer to the summary of debate of the Nominations Committee on the website of the General Conference.

- Anguilla was unanimously admitted as Associate Member of UNESCO.
- H. R. H. Princess Marie of Denmark visited UNESCO and delivered a speech in the Plenary. In her speech, she touched upon the important work done by UNESCO, particularly in the fields of sustainable development and education, to face global challenges of the 21st century such as climate change, global health, and social inequalities. She underlined that UNESCO had a very important role to play in order to foster equality education and to empower learners to take action in their communities to face the global challenges. She concluded her address by expressing her continuous support to UNESCO and to the realization of its noble cause.

Discovering creativity programmes

To strengthen culture as a factor of sustainable development, UNESCO implements a number of activities benefitting creators and artists at national, regional and global level. Based on South-South and North-South-South cooperation and on public-private collaboration, these activities – among which the International Fund for the Promotion of Culture and the Creative Cities Network – focus on exchange, training, advice and capacity building, in particular for young people, and in developing countries. They are conceived in synergy with the initiatives developed in the framework of the international cultural Conventions, in particular the 2005 Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions, with its International Fund for Cultural Diversity (IFCD), which invests in projects that lead to structural change, including economic growth and social cohesion. - In the framework of the new impetus which UNESCO imparts to its action in Africa, the Chiefs of Delegations will meet to discuss Global Priority Africa. This will be the occasion to present the Operational Strategy on Priority Africa 2014-2021 and its Action Plan. The meeting will take place from 2:00 to 3:30 p.m., in Room XI.

Yesterday

• The President of the 37th session of the General Conference, the Chairperson of the Executive Board and the Director-General of UNESCO opened the Leaders' Forum. Keynote addresses were delivered by three Heads of State or Government, H.E. Ms Laura Chinchilla, President of Costa Rica, H.E. Mr Moncef Marzouki, President of Tunisia as well as H.E. Mr Algirdas Butkevicius, Prime Minister of Lithuania, followed by special addresses and a debate at Ministerial level. It was recognized that the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the Education For All (EFA) goals had succeeded in creating a global humanist awareness in all countries, among governments as well as civil society. In that vision, peace, prosperity and harmony cannot be attained without efforts to address the needs of people living in poverty or in the margins of society. Progress was made. But much remains to be done. One lesson drawn from the successes and limitations of the MDGs was that sustainable and equitable development cannot rest solely on economic policies. It calls for approaches that put humans at the center. It calls for new models through people who can be

equipped with the tools that help them develop their own potential. With the participation of 54 Member States, a rich and vivid debate was moderated by H.E. Mr Shashi Tharoor, Minister of State for Human Resource Development of India and Mr Stephen Cole, Senior Presenter Al Jazeera English, Doha and London, with a view to formulating key messages for the global negotiations currently under way for the post-2015 agenda and to providing general orientations for the work of the Organization

Tomorrow

 One year before the end of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD, 2005-2014), at a moment when the post-2015 development agenda is being debated, and as the future of ESD are being designed, an ED Ministerial Breakfast entitled "Scaling-up Action on Education for Sustainable Development" is being organized by UNESCO from 8:00 to 9:30 a.m. The meeting is expected to mobilize support among Member States for the implementation of the Global Action Programme on ESD and for ensuring that ESD is part of the post-2015 agenda.

Learning Today for a Sustainable Future - Join the 2014 World Conference on ESD in Japan

On the occasion of the General Conference, as host country and host cities, representatives of the Japanese government, the Governor of Aichi Prefecture, and the Mayor of Okayama will showcase their achievements in Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), and inform on the venue of the World Conference.

To mark the end of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD, 2005-2014), for which UNESCO is the lead-agency, UNESCO and the Government of Japan will coorganize the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development in November 2014 in Aichi-Nagoya, preceded by a set of stakeholder meetings in Okayama, Japan. Both events aim at celebrating a Decade of action and setting the agenda for ESD beyond 2014.

Scientific meeting on the discovery of Toumaï and the update of the General History of Africa

From 7 November 2013 10:00 a.m. to 8 November 6:00 p.m., Room XIII

The meeting will be opened by Professor Taisso Mackaye, former Minister of the Republic of Chad. Most of the themes covered during the day will regard the origins of Men, and scientific research. Yves Coppens, Honorary Professor at the College de France, will share a background chronology of scientific research on the origins of humanity. Michel Brunet, Professor at the College de France, Chair of human palaeontology and director of the palaeoanthropologic mission which led to the discovery of Toumaï, will discuss the discovery itself and its implications for research and scientific thought.

The discovery of Toumaï will also be discussed in the context of updating the General History of Africa. During these days, the Chief of the History and Memory for Dialogue Section at UNESCO, Ali Moussa Iye, will introduce the General History of Africa project and present its ninth Volume.

Participants will complete this scientific meeting by the definition of guidelines and modalities for the organization of the international conference on human origins in 2014 in Chad.

This scientific meeting will precede the exceptional ceremony on Monday 11 November, when His Excellency Idriss Deby, President of the Republic of Chad, will offer the moulding of the skull of Toumaï to UNESCO.

Yesterday

• A meeting on Priority Africa was organized for the Heads of African Delegations participating to the 37th session of the General Conference as well as for the members of their Delegation, to present the operational strategy for Priority Africa (2014-2021) along with its Action Plan in the context of the new impetus that UNESCO wishes to give to its action in Africa. Lalla Aïcha Ben Barka, Assistant Director-General for the Africa Department, presented and explained the operational strategy to the assembly. The meeting was opened by the Director-General together with Dr Martial De-Paul Ikounga, African Union Commissioner for Human Resources, Science and Technology.

The meeting was also attended by: His Excellency Solomon Jason Mbuzi, Permanent Delegate of Zambia to UNESCO; His Excellency Pinda Simao, Minister of Education of Angola; Ann Therese Ndong-Jatta, Director of UNESCO's Regional Office in Dakar; and the Representatives of Regional Economic Communities attending the General Conference.

The meeting permitted valuable discussions among participants, notably about Priority Africa, Education for All, and the Big Push initiative. The Director-General highlighted the essential quality of strong collaboration between UNESCO and the African Union and thanked the Commissioner for accounting for such constructive collaboration. Mr. Ikounga mentioned the challenges faced by Africa as a united family, underneath the umbrella that UNESCO represents, as a supporting relative to face and overcome these challenges.

Ms Irina Bokova highlighted the progress that has been made in favour of the African continent, notably through the adoption of the operational strategy, the reform concerning Field Offices, the Big Push initiative for Education for All, and the pedagogical use of the General History of Africa. She has also said: "I see Africa's renaissance as a springboard for global peace and development — with the world's largest, youngest population, the ambitions of Africa can only be seen as ambitions for the whole world."

- H. M. E. H. Fra' Matthew Festing, Prince and Grand Master of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, visited UNESCO on the occasion of the 900th anniversary of the Order's creation. He addressed the Conference, expressing the Order's particular concern for the conservation and protection of the world's cultural religious heritage as an irreplaceable instrument of cultural dialogue. Cooperation with UNESCO being one of the priorities of Malta, he reaffirmed its commitment to developing fruitful dialogue and cooperation with UNESCO.
- H.E. Mr Rafael Correa, President of the Republic of Ecuador, addressed the Plenary of the General Conference. Touching upon the history, the natural and cultural heritages of the country, he emphasized the particular importance of science and technology for the eradication of poverty and establishment of equitable society. In order to establish peace and sustainable development, he called for fair distribution of knowledge and wealth among nations, and underlined UNESCO's important role for the betterment of the world.

The side-event "Promoting Girls' and Women's Education for Gender Equality" was held as an occasion to reiterate the importance of ensuring girls' and women's right to education and to realize gender equality to, in and through education. The event was opened by the Director-General of UNESCO, followed by a panel presentation by 5 high-level panelists from the electoral groups, as follows:

- H.E. Ms Maria Arnholm, Minister for Gender Equality, Deputy Minister for Education of the Kingdom of Sweden
- H.E. Dr Tim Gopeesingh, Minister of Education of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago
- H.E. Mr Muhammad Baligh ur Rehman, Minister of State for Education, Trainings, and Standards in Higher Education of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan
- H.E. Ms Kandia Kamissoko Camara, Minister of National Education and Professional Training of Côte d'Ivoire
- Mr Fady Yarak, Director General of the Ministry of Education, Lebanon

The Director-General's welcoming remark set the tone of the panel presentations by reiterating that gender equality is a human right, and that education is the key building block for empowerment of girls and women and for nation building. The Director General also highlighted the contributions that UNESCO has been making to promote girls and women's education, especially since the launch of the Global partnership on girls and women's education in 2011 and more recently with the creation of the Malala Funds for Girls Right to Education with the support of the Government of Pakistan.

The five panelists were invited to present the work in their respective countries to promote girls' and women's right to education and to outline continuing challenges and new solutions and ideas to overcome them. Their presentations illustrated the diverse challenges faced in delivering quality education for girls and women in their respective countries, not only in terms of physical access to education opportunities, but also ensuring security, improving quality of learning, and raising teachers' gender awareness. At the

same time, many innovative and successful efforts have also been undertaken by the countries to promote girls and women's education and gender equality, for example, using flexible approaches to reaching girls living in the remote areas through non-formal education provisions; addressing gender stereotypes in the curricular and textbooks and fostering female role models in all areas and levels of education, and strengthening the linkages between girls' education and the labour force. The audience was also reminded of the fact that gender was not only about girls and women but also about boys, especially in countries where boys are underperforming in education as a growing concern.

Participants were invited to visit the different stands presenting updates of the projects developed under the Global Partnership for Girls' and Women's Education in five African countries. Visual presentations and publications on issues such as literacy and gender by UNESCO Institute for Lifelong Learning and updates from the on-line "World Atlas of Gender Equality in Education", developed by UNESCO Institute for Statistics were also made.

The World Science Day for Peace and Development 2013 was celebrated at UNESCO under the theme "Science for water cooperation "sharing data, knowledge and innovations". This event has been the clear demonstration of UNESCO's vision of science as a collective enterprise based on curiosity, education, knowledge and cooperation and on the belief that the value of science is realized only when the results are presented to policy makers and the public in an understandable way. The Celebration started the proceedings with a workshop for engineering demonstrations on Microscience Kits and the Robotics aimed at inspiring the young participants about the value of science to society and society to science. The Celebration was also an opportunity to launch the audio visual science teachers' training modules in physics produced by UNESCO and CERN - designed to improve the quality of science education in physics. Copublished by UNESCO, OECD and ISSC, this Report includes 100 articles written by 150 authors from 41 countries. The Report will be launched by the UNESCO Director-General, Irina Bokova, the UNESCO Assistant Director-General for Social and Human Sciences, Pilar Alvarez-Laso, the Deputy Secretary-General of OECD, William C. Danvers, and the Executive Secretary of ISSC, Heide Hackmann, in a ceremony that will take place from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m., in Room XI.

Yesterday

 The elections of members of the Headquarters Committee, the Legal Committee and other Subsidiary Organs of the General Conference took place in the morning.
 The results of the vote were announced in the afternoon in the Nominations Committee.

• In the framework of the Science Commission, the International Hydrological Programme organized a special programme on the United Nations International Year of Water Cooperation (IYWC). In her opening speech, the Director-General of UNESCO highlighted the importance of the role of the Organization's programmes and networks of centres, chairs and institutes in fostering water cooperation, also beyond 2013. Representatives of Tajikistan, The Netherlands, Hungary, Kenya and Mexico presented IYWC Milestone events and activities carried out during the IYWC, in view of shaping the future Sustainable Development Goals, including the closing ceremony in December in Mexico City. The Republic of Korea promoted international cooperation in view of the 7th World Water Forum in 2015. Brazil and Germany reported, respectively, on activities undertaken during the Water Cooperation 2013 campaign and through the UNESCO Category 2 Centre, International Center for Education, Capacity-Building and Applied

Research in Water Foundation (HidroEX) in Brazil. All countries emphasized that international partnerships, institutional and capacity development, as well as outreach efforts are indispensable for the peaceful sharing of water resources and water security: water should receive the crucial attention it deserves in the post-2015 development agenda.

• The **United Nations Creative Economy Report 2013**, Special Edition, which UNESCO is co-publishing with UNDP, was launched on 14 November 2013. Yesterday

The World Social Science Report 2013: Changing Global Environments was launched at a special event attended by numerous delegates and other social science stakeholders. The audience was addressed by UNESCO Director-General, Irina Bokova; the Deputy Secretary-General of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), William Danvers, and the Executive Director of the International Social Science Council (ISSC), Heide Hackmann. It was chaired by the UNESCO Assistant Director-General for Social and Human Sciences, Pilar Alvarez Laso.

The World Social Science Report argues that, in order to enable individual societies and the international community to address the challenges of changing global environments, a new kind of social science is needed, one that is bolder, better, bigger, and different. As the Director-General put it in her opening remarks, "The social sciences have a critical contribution to make, in helping us understand, imagine, and craft a more sustainable future for all. This is the message of the World Social Science Report 2013".

The 2013 World Social Science Report was prepared and edited by the ISSC with the support of high level specialists from all the over the world. It is co-published by the ISSC, the OECD and UNESCO. The full report is available free online for Member States.

• The investiture ceremony of Ms Irina Bokova for a second term as Director-General of UNESCO was held in a plenary session of the General Conference on 18 November. In her acceptance speech, Ms Bokova presented her vision of UNESCO's action for the next four years: "The oath that I have just given, also given by those who have preceded me, is an oath of humanism. Human creativity is our great strength, a bottomless wellspring, whose power we must unleash. This is UNESCO's humanist mission, and it has guided me in everything I have done. Together we are moving on all fronts, and our leadership has never been more in demand".

The plenary was opened by the President of the General Conference, followed by Ms Bokova taking her oath for a second term. The Chair of the Executive Board as well as the Chairpersons of all electoral regional groups and the Ambassador, Permanent Delegate of the French Republic to UNESCO, Representative of the host country, addressed the Plenary with congratulations to the Director General and words of encouragement for the next four years.

Notables invited to speak at the ceremony included Mr. Abdel Rahmane Ben Essayouti, Imam of the Djingareyber Great Mosque in Timbuktu; Ms. Enriqueta Estela Barnes de Carlotto, President of the Argentinian association the Grandmothers of the Plaza de Mayo - laureate of the 2011 Félix Houphouët-Boigny Peace Prize - and Mr. Homi K. Bhabha, Director of the Mahindra Humanities Center at Harvard University focused in their speeches on the impact and relevance of UNESCO's work at the service of people, societies and countries for peace and sustainable development.

Three short video presentations reflected on the commitment of young people to UNESCO's priorities, the project on girls education in Afghanistan and in "Building Peace Today", highlighting UNESCO's accomplishments during Ms. Bokova's first term.

Midway through the ceremony, Ms. Nicole Slack Jones made an extraordinary performance singing an a cappella jazz rendition of "What a wonderful world".

The ceremony was closed by musical artist Mr. Salif Traoré (A'salfo), a Unesco goodwill ambassador, and his group Magic System singing his popular "Bouger Bouger", which brought the President of the General Conference, the President of the Executive Board, the Director General and many in the audience to their feet.

- UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador Salif Traoré (A'salfo) donated the rights from his new single, "Savoir" (Knowledge), to the Organization's literacy projects. The song is a hymn to the transformative power of education in Africa and features an all-star cast of acclaimed musicians from several African nations and France. During the press conference he said "In my profession as a musician, the medium is the message,...and my message for everyone in "Savoir" is this: Make education a priority in all your activities".
- The UNESCO-UNU-ICSU-ISSC side event on Integrated Approaches to Science and Engineering for Sustainable Development was opened by the Director-General of UNESCO, who welcomed the participants and highlighted the importance of sustainability science for the organisation. Her introduction was followed by Mr Kazuhiko TAKEUCHI, Senior Vice-Rector of the United Nations University who came on behalf of the Rector. He presented UNU's activities in the area and stressed the fruitful joint collaborations with UNESCO around the concept of sustainability science. The Representative of the UNU Rector then focused on the importance of education for sustainable development and of education for sustainability science and commented the outcomes of the UNU/University of Tokyo/UNESCO Symposium on "Sustainability Science: Promoting Integration and Cooperation" (Paris, 19 September 2013). Then Mr Steven WILSON, the Executive Director of the International Council for Science presented the Future Earth initiative, highlighting the background, functioning and objectives of this concrete example of research and policy on sustainability science. Finally, an overview of UNESCO's programmes and activities in the area of sustainability science was presented by the UNESCO ADG for Natural Sciences, who emphasised the importance of a comprehensive interdisciplinary approach between sciences (natural, social and human) and education, especially higher education. The very relevant and important comments which were made by the audience during the discussion at the end of the side event reflected the interest and importance of the topic.

 The General Assembly of the States Parties to the World Heritage Convention will meet today for its second day of work examining Item 4: Revision of the Rules of Procedure of the General Assembly.

Yesterday

- The session on Protecting the World's Largest Museum the Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage gave an insight into the unique heritage preserved under water. Well-attended, the session encouraged delegates to foster the even wider ratification of the 2001 Convention and to enhance its implementation. It also underlined the importance and unique utility of the UNESCO 2001 Convention, established to encompass all traces of human existence that lie or were lying under water and have a cultural or historical character. The 2001 Convention plays a central role in the development of underwater archaeology and can be expected to substantially impact this discipline. It contains solid site protection measures and fosters the development of capacities.
- The information meeting on the Eastern and Southern Africa (ESA) Ministerial Commitment on sexuality education and sexual and reproductive health services for adolescents and young people took place yesterday. This session focused on Young People Today. Time to Act Now! a major initiative aimed at mobilizing political commitment of ministers of health and education in 21 countries from Eastern and Southern Africa to deliver comprehensive sexuality education and youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services to reduce HIV, eliminate unintended pregnancies, address gender-based violence, and ensure that all young people can reach their full potential.

- The 19th General Assembly of the States Parties to the World Heritage Convention held its first meeting opened by the UNESCO's Director-General. The General Assembly elected Mr H.E. Mr. Karunaratne HANGAWATTE, Sri Lanka, as Chairperson of the 19th General Assembly, with Switzerland and Zimbabwe as Vice-chairpersons. Mr Hassan AL-LAWATI, Oman, was elected as Rapporteur of the session. The General Assembly has also elected the new members to fill 12 seats of the 21 member World Heritage Committee, namely: Croatia, Finland, Jamaica, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Turkey and Viet Nam. - A Host Country Agreement was signed today by H.E. Sheikh Hassan bin Mohammed Al-Thani, Vice Chairman of the Qatar Museum Authority (QMA), and Mr. Eric Falt, Assistant Director-General of External Relations and Public Information on the 38th session of the World Heritage Committee that will take place in Doha (Qatar) in June 2014. The signing took place in the presence of H.H.Sheikha Mayassa Al Thani, who was elected as Chairperson of the World Heritage Committee and Mr Kishore Rao, Director of UNESCO's World Heritage Centre.
