# **Executive Summary**

**Disclaimer:** The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

#### **Media and Major Events**

November was a huge month for press coverage about UNESCO. Events at the General Conference dominated news coverage for most of the month of November, but archeological discoveries at Lumbini, a World Heritage site in Nepal, and a report on ocean acidification also did spectacularly well in the press.

The top story at the General Conference was the loss of US voting rights, which generated an avalanche of articles around the world. The story was published in top tier media in every region. The vast majority of these news outlets published multiple stories, first announcing the voting loss, and then reporting on the US State Department's declaration of regret, and the tweet by White House National Security Advisor Susan Rice saying "Shameful that US has lost its vote at #Unesco. Congress needs to fix this. Current law doesn't punish the Palestinians; it handicaps the US."

The re-election of the Director-General was also widely reported by international media, while in China, the election of Hao Ping as president of the General Conference also received huge coverage.

The launches of the World Social Science Report and the Creative Economy Report resulted in only sporadic coverage in different world regions. Of the two, the Social Science Report drew the most media interest, with the focus of stories on the link between social science and climate change.

As is usually the case, national media in Member States also gave significant coverage to the interventions at the General Conference by their respective representatives.


Outside of the General Conference, the announcement in late November of archeological discoveries at the Lumbini World Heritage site that shed new light on the birth date of the Buddha, was spectacularly covered globally. Thousands of articles related the story, all of which mentioned that Lumbini is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and that the archaeological project was carried out under UNESCO's auspices.


The report on Ocean Acidification, based on a UNESCO conference on the same theme, also did exceptionally well in the media, with several reports in top tier international such as CNN and the BBC, and exhaustive coverage throughout Latin America.



#### **UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels**


Usually we notice in November a drop in visits typical of this period of the year. However, this month, the loss in visits has been partially compensated by the high number visitors to the General Conference website, which has been the 4<sup>th</sup> most visited UNESCO site of the month, after unesco.org, World Heritage and Careers.


As expected with holding of the General Conference, visits to unesco.int increased again and for the third month in a row. With an 8% growth this month, the number of visits has more than tripled from same month last year and from November 2011 (previous General Conference).


Starting from this month, Unescommunity's performances could be measured and compared with last year's traffic (from Jan. to Aug. 2013 a different measurement algorithm was used, more information can be provided upon demand). At a first glance, the number of visits is slightly higher than in November 2012 (+14%), but the number of page views dropped dramatically (-40%). The fact that users spend an average time of 3:30 min per page and the very low "bounce rate" may mean that the decrease in page views is linked to the limited production of English content on the platform.

Audiences continue to grow in all languages on UNESCO's social media channels. Messages that generated substantial interest and traffic were on the loss of US voting rights (where our 10 messages were shared on average 40 times each); the importance of tolerance (the RT average ranged between 50-80); as well as efforts to dispel rumors of a UNESCO lottery (with 400 RT, the Spanish Tweet on the subject was the Top1 Twitter of the month).








#### **UNESCO Publications**

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in November has dropped substantially by 32% but still remains higher than the same month in 2012. The only English title that has retained its place in the top 10 views over the last few months is the *World Water Development Report 4*. Complete figures for UNESCO Publications on Google Books are not available for this month and will be published hopefully in December's Monthly Report. Education titles dominated bookshop sales but for on-line sales one particular title on Climate Change (SC) come out largely ahead of all the other titles.



# **Major events:**

# I. General Conference – 37<sup>th</sup> Session (5-20 November 2013)

The 37<sup>th</sup> session of the General Conference opened with the election of its President, H.E. Mr Hao Ping (China), and the admission of Anguilla as an Associate Member.

The representatives of UNESCO's 195 Member States were also called to appoint the Director-General. Ms Irina Bokova, nominated by the Executive Board on 4 October 2013, was elected for a second term with an overwhelming majority of 92%.

The function of the General Conference is to determine the policies, the main lines of action and the budget of the Organization. Setting the direction for UNESCO's work over the next eight years: the new Medium Term Strategy (2014-2021) positions UNESCO to play a leadership role in defining the development objectives that will replace the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) in the areas of education, science, culture, communication and information.



Africa and gender equality will continue as the Organization's highest global priorities and peace and sustainable development are the overarching objectives that will guide all of the Organization's activities. Youth will stay at the top of UNESCO's agenda. Member States also stressed that priority will be given to achieving Education For All goals, and committed themselves to a new development goal for education based on access, equity and guality and lifelong learning.

The 37<sup>th</sup> session mobilized more than 3,000 participants. Laura Chinchilla, President of Costa Rica, Moncef Marzuki, President of Tunisia and Algirdas Butkevicius, Prime Minister of Lithuania, participated in the Leaders' Forum at the opening of the Session (6 November 2013). President Rafael Correa (Ecuador) addressed a plenary session and Idriss Deby Itno, President of Chad, presented UNESCO with a replica of the Toumai fossil cranium, the oldest hominine remains found to date. The Conference was also addressed by Princess Marie of Denmark and the Prince and Grand Master of the Sovereign Order of Malta, Matthew Festing.

During the General Conference, two major UNESCO reports were launched: the *Creative Economy Report 2013: Widening local development pathways*, and the *World Social Science Report 2013 - Changing Global Environments* and significant meetings on Education and Sciences were held.

The smooth running was ensured by over 700 permanent and temporary staff seconded to work for the most important Governing Body of the Organization. Inspired by the move towards a PaperSmart UN System and in order to reduce the Organization's costs and carbon footprint, this year the information on the General Conference was (and is) still available in various digital formats: this facilitated access to information also for the public wishing to follow the General Conference away from Paris.

**Press coverage:** The Media section accredited 407 journalists for the General Conference. All of the top news agencies were resent, including AP, APTN, AFP, AP, EFE, and Xinhua. Visiting Heads of State brought them own press teams with them. The media relations section issued 11 press releases on events and decisions taken at the Conference; briefed scores of journalists by telephone on the proceedings; organized numerous interviews between journalists, delegates and programme specialists, along with three press conferences.

Most press coverage was focused on the loss of US voting rights, which was clearly the top news story of the Conference, and generated a veritable avalanche of articles and commentaries in leading press around the world. The coverage was further fuelled by reaction from the US Government, regretting the move, and a tweet from National Security Adviser Susan Rice saying the laws preventing the US from paying its dues should change.

The re-election of the Director-General also generated significant coverage. A press conference with the Director-General immediately after the election was attended by journalists from AP, AFP, Itar-Tass, EFE and Xinhua, along with several representatives of the African media. The resulting dispatches were relayed in several languages by media around the world.

**Social media:** Two bits of news got strong traction on social media, especially Twitter – the DG's reelection (66 RTs & 303 likes on FB – much higher than usual for institutional news), and the loss of US voting rights (119 RTs).


#### II. Launch of the United Nations Creative Economy Report 2013, Special Edition (14 November 2013)

The Special Edition of the 2013 Creative Economy Report: *Widening Local Development Pathways*, was launched on 14 November 2013, at UNESCO Headquarters during the General Conference, by the Director-General, together with a panel of high level representatives from UN agencies, the principal investigator of the Report and UNESCO Artists for peace, and moderated by the ADG/CLT.

This Special Edition, co-published by UNESCO and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) through the UN Office for South-South Cooperation, is composed of a research-based Report and a web documentary. For the first time, it showcases the creative economy at the local level in developing countries, and features numerous case studies and best practices. It is a major step in UNESCO's global initiative to put culture at the top of the international agenda and should nourish the implementation of the Culture Programme in the forthcoming quadrennial period.

The results of the Report will inform international debates on the post-2015 UN development agenda and the role of culture in sustainable development. It speaks to decision-makers, demonstrating some of the key factors and criteria that make creative economy initiatives successful on the ground. It also includes ten recommendations.

During the launch event, speakers highlighted the dual nature of creative economy as an economic driver that generates employment and income, and at the same time, a source of social cohesion, identity and dignity. Owing to this dual nature, the creative economy encompasses the social, economic and environmental dimensions of development, which enable it to be truly sustainable.

**Press coverage:** Like the World Social Science Report, the Creative Economy Report, launched during the General Conference, received very light coverage overall. It was also accompanied by a detailed press release and excellent press package, including audiovisual elements and a statistical annex. However, there was no strong news story emerging from the report and very little fresh data, which meant that the mainstream media did not really pay it the attention it deserves.

**Social media:** 14 tweets and several Facebook/Google+ posts helped to publicize the launch of the report and its key findings. Using the hashtag #CreativeEconomy, the top performing messages include the call to "put culture and creativity at the heart of public policy and sustainable development" (284 likes on FB), and statistics on the growth of cultural industries worldwide (55 RTs). A series of attractive digital cards, displaying the vitality of creative economies, were created to increase the report's appeal via social media

#### III. Launch of the World Social Science Report 2013 - Changing Global Environments (15 Nov. 2013)

On 15 November, the Director-General, Irina Bokova launched the World Social Science Report 2013: Changing Global Environments at UNESCO Headquarters, at a special event during the SHS Commission of the 37th session of the General Conference.

"The social sciences have a critical contribution to make, in helping us understand, imagine, and craft a more sustainable future for all. This is the message of the World Social Science Report 2013" stated the Director-General.

Also in attendance were the Deputy Secretary-General of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), William Danvers and the Executive Director of the International Social Science Council (ISSC), Heide Hackmann, along with delegates from OECD and UNESCO member states.

This special event was translated simultaneously into the 6 working languages of UNESCO, and was webcast live.

The full report was made available free online for member states starting 15 November 2013.

**Website statistics:** Press release: 1,646 visits/ 2,993 page views. Web release: 53 visits/319 views. Dedicated webpage: 1,627 visits/3,810 page views; Event announcement: 68 visits/443 page views.

**Press coverage:** Media coverage of the World Social Science Report, launched during the General Conference was reasonable given the very specialized nature of the report. A detailed press release and comprehensive press package were distributed globally for the report, and key science journalists were contacted. There weren't many stories published, but those that were, appeared in quality science news outlets such as e!Science, SciDev.net, or general news sites such as AllAfrica.com. This was probably because the theme – climate change – was topical, and that there was a clear message or call for action associated with the report.

**Social media:** 3 tweets were published, all pitching the report through different angles The top message "Climate change is about PEOPLE" has been one of the month's top tweets, with 119 retweets; its success was largely driven by the inclusion of a digital card, specifically designed for social media, which showed a woman holding crops affected by climate change. By contrast, messages using visuals that are included in the publication – such as cars stuck in a traffic jam – flopped. These numbers leave no doubt that, for the general public, it is critical to emphasize the human dimension in all of our work.

#### IV. World Philosophy Day 2013: "Inclusive Societies, Sustainable Planet" (21 November 2013)

On 21 November 2013, the 11th celebration of World Philosophy Day (WPD) was successfully launched at UNESCO's Headquarters in Paris. A round table discussion on the general topic of this year's WPD "Inclusive Societies, Sustainable Planet" was addressed by the UNESCO's Director-General, Ms Irina Bokova, who called UNESCO "a quintessentially optimistic institution" and defined its philosophy as 'realistic optimism', founded on the Organization's deep belief in the power of the intellectual and moral solidarity between nations and individuals to make a world a better place.

The Director-General underlined the indispensable role of philosophy in achieving the Organization's goal of preventing the recurrence of the horrors faced by humanity in the 20th century and building the defences of peace in the minds of men. Philosophy empowers human beings to critically think about what could go wrong, suggest positive alternatives and make them possible. The Director-General stated that the Organization must not be afraid to "ask difficult questions" in order to explore ways to prevent radically exclusive societies or a radically unsustainable planet. Philosophy and critical thinking constitute therefore an indispensable part of UNESCO's work and represent its realistic yet optimistic spirit.



Furthermore, the Director-General reflected on the idea of justice that underlines the main theme of this year's World Philosophy Day and its links with social cohesion, inclusion and tolerance in societies marked by growing urbanization, rising diversity, deepening inequalities. Justice today, said the Director-General, means that "no decent society can be shaped only by the interplay of formal rights and obligations". Justice is a combination of rational and feeling; of a logical theory rights and "an emotional texture of solidarity". This view of justice is essential to what the Director-General called "social sustainability" which represents a key feature of the new humanism that has become a guiding principle for UNESCO's action.

The event was attended by approximately one hundred participants, including members of the different philosophy networks and the International Council for Philosophy and Humanistic Studies, as well as Member States representatives.

Over two days of the following week, on 26 and 27 November, UNESCO Headquarters also hosted a series of events which echoed the main themes of the 2013 WPD, including a round table on "Thinking the Anthropocene", a contemporary art exhibition "Adapting in the Anthropocene", the 13th International Meeting on New Philosophical Practices, and an international round table entitled "Paul Ricoeur: Ethical Knowledge". Some six hundred persons attended these events, which were appreciated by many of UNESCO's partners in the areas of social and human sciences.

#### V. World Science Forum 2013 (24-27 November 2013)

For the first time the World Science Forum (WSF) was held outside of Europe. The WSF is organized every two years and this year's Forum was held in Rio de Janeiro from 24 to 27 November 2013. The theme for the 6<sup>th</sup> forum was 'Science for Global Sustainable Development'. The Forum contributed to UNESCO's follow up on the outcomes of the Rio+20 process by strengthening the science, policy and society interface and connecting scientists, policy makers, representatives of the private sector and civil society to the issues, discussions and activities involved in the ongoing discussions on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the design of the Post 2015 Development Agenda.



The plenary discussions of the forum explored issues concerning inequalities as barriers to global sustainability, science policy and science governance, scientific integrity, science education, the role of science in innovation and science for natural resources. A number of parallel sessions were also organized focusing on issues such as the science diplomacy, higher education, disaster risk reduction, ocean sciences, the Future Earth Programme and challenges and opportunities facing Young Scientists and Researchers. The forum ended with a parliamentary session to strengthen the role of parliaments in the governance of science by ensuring their linkage to national and global sustainability processes as well as the follow up of the forum.

The declaration of the forum commits participants to collectively and individually use science to address the global challenges faced by today's society.

The World Science Forum was established after the 1999 World Science Conference, organized by UNESCO and ICSU in Budapest. The 2013 Forum was organized by the Brazilian Academy of Sciences in partnership with the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, UNESCO, the International Council for Science Unions (ICSU), the European Academies Science Advisory Council (EASAC), and the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS).

Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al).

Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. 



November was a huge month for press coverage about UNESCO. Events at the General Conference dominated news coverage for most of the month of November, but archeological discoveries at Lumbini, a World Heritage site in Nepal, and a report on ocean acidification also did spectacularly well in the press.

The top story at the General Conference was the loss of US voting rights, which generated an avalanche of articles around the world. The story was published in top tier media in every region. The vast majority of these news outlets published multiple stories, first announcing the voting loss, and then reporting on the US State Department's declaration of regret, and the tweet by White House National Security Advisor Susan Rice saying "Shameful that US has lost its vote at #Unesco. Congress needs to fix this. Current law doesn't punish the Palestinians; it handicaps the US."

The re-election of the Director-General was also widely reported by international media, while in China, the election of Hao Ping as president of the General Conference also received huge coverage.


The launches of the World Social Science Report and the Creative Economy Report resulted in only sporadic coverage in different world regions. Of the two, the Social Science Report drew the most media interest, with the focus of stories on the link between social science and climate change.

As is usually the case, national media in Member States also gave significant coverage to the interventions at the General Conference by their respective representatives.

Outside of the General Conference, the announcement in late November of archeological discoveries at the Lumbini World Heritage site that shed new light on the birth date of the Buddha, was spectacularly covered globally. Thousands of articles related the story, all of which mentioned that Lumbini is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and that the archaeological project was carried out under UNESCO's auspices.

The report on Ocean Acidification, prepared by IOC-UNESCO, the Scientific Committee on Oceanic Research (SCOR) and the International Geosphere-Biosphere Programme (IGBP), and based on a UNESCO conference on the same theme, also did exceptionally well in the media, with several reports in top tier international such as CNN and the BBC, and exhaustive coverage throughout Latin America.

These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.


In November, there were 141 422 records available online in PDF format (**140 083** in October), including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.






The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.


'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

Online viewing of UNESCO top ten publications in November has dropped substantially by 32% but still remains higher than the same month in 2012. The only English title that has retained its place in the top 10 views over the last few months is the *World Water Development Report 4*. Complete figures for UNESCO Publications on Google Books are not available for this month and will be published hopefully in December's Monthly Report. Education titles dominated bookshop sales but for on-line sales one particular title on Climate Change (SC) come out largely ahead of all the other titles.





#### 5. Profile of visitors





# 9.1. Patronage

Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.

# 10. Media Partnerships

UNESCO has partnership agreements with the media, such as newspaper companies (Asahi Shimbun / Japan, Dong-A Daily and The Chosun Ilbo / Korea) and TV networks (NHK and TBS / Japan). Memoranda of Understanding have been recently signed with major press agencies (RIA Novosti / Russia, Xinhua News Agency / People's Republic of China, Al Jazeera / Qatar).
