REPORT ON THE ELECTIONS OF THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE AND OF THE MEMBERS OF THE NGO-UNESCO LIAISON COMMITTEE (17 December 2014)


## I. COMMISSION OF ELECTIONS

1. At its first plenary meeting on Monday 15 December 2014, the International Conference of NGOs appointed the Commission of Elections to oversee the balloting procedures. It consisted of three (3) tellers from among the organizations which were not standing for election to the office of Chairperson of the Conference or to the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee:

- Mrs Marie Claude Allez (International Movement ATD Fourth World);
- Mrs Françoise Bouteiller (International Council of Women);
- Mr André Lokisso (Assistance to the Integration of Demobilized Child Soldiers).


## II. ELECTION FOR THE PRESIDENCY

2. The election of the Chairperson of the International Conference was held in a single secret ballot on Tuesday 15 December 2014 afternoon (the morning ballot was declared invalid).
3. Two (2) persons, members of organizations in official partnership, were candidates for this election where one (1) seat was to be filled.
4. The candidate having obtained more than half of the valid votes cast (not counting abstentions) was declared elected: Mrs Martine Levy, presented by the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), with 43 votes.
5. The detail of the counting of the votes is as follows:

## III. ELECTION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE NGO-UNESCO LIAISON COMMITTEE

6. The election of the members of the NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee was held in two secret ballots to allow the election of ten member organizations, four (4) with associate status and six (6) with consultative status. The six regions as defined by UNESCO should also be represented by at least one partner NGO based in this region.
7. Twenty-four (24) organizations were candidates for this election where ten (10) seats were to be filled.

## III. 1 First ballot

8. The first ballot was held on Tuesday 16 December 2014 afternoon (the morning ballot was declared invalid).
9. Six (6) seats to be filled for the first ballot allowing the election of six organizations having each its headquarters in one of the six regions as defined by UNESCO.
10. It should be noted that:

- For the Arab States region: no organization of this region was candidate. This region will not be represented in the Liaison Committee for the duration of the term of office (Article I. 3 of the Annex of the Rules of Procedure);
- For the Africa region: only one organization of this region was candidate. The organization was declared elected without the need to hold a ballot (Article I. 2 of the Annex of the Rules of Procedure). The elected organization for this region is the Forum for African Women Educationalist (FAWE).
- For the Eastern Europe region: only one organization of this region was candidate. The organization was declared elected without the need to hold a ballot (Article I. 2 of the Annex of the Rules of Procedure). The elected organization for this region is the Sozopol Foundation.
- For the Latin America and the Caribbean region: only one organization of this region was candidate. The organization was declared elected without the need to hold a ballot (Article I. 2 of the Annex of the Rules of Procedure). The elected organization for this region is the Latin American Social Sciences Council (CLACSO).

11. Therefore, the first ballot was intended to fill the two (2) seats for the two remaining regions: Western Europe and North America, and Asia and Pacific.
12. The candidate organizations having obtained the largest number of vote by region were declared elected. These organizations are the following:

- for the region Western Europe and North America, the Association francophone d'amitié et de liaison (AFAL) with 24 votes;
- for the Asia and Pacific region, China Folklore Photographic Association with 36 votes.

## III. 2 Second ballot

14. The second ballot was held on Wednesday 17 December 2014.
15. Five (5) seats to be filled (4+1 remaining vacant from the region not represented) for the second ballot allowing the distribution of the remaining seats taking into account the status of partnership (association and consultation): two (2) seats for the organizations in associative status and three (3) for the organizations in consultative status.
16. The candidate organizations having obtained the largest number of votes for each partnership category up to the number of seats that remain to be filled were declared elected. These organizations are the following:

- Coordinating Committee for International Voluntary Service (CCIVS) (association status), with 43 votes;
- Rotary International (association status), with 40 votes;
- International Council of Organizations for Folklore Festivals and Folk Art (CIOFF), (consultative status) with 25 votes;
- International Federation of Coalitions for Cultural Diversity (IFCCD) (consultative status), with 25 votes;
- Catholic International Education Office (OIEC) (consultative status), with 27 votes.
