Proposed decision
The Executive Board,

1. Recalling 37 C/Resolution 1 (V) and 197 EX/Decision 5 (I, D),
2. Having examined documents 199 EX/5 Part I (A) and 199 EX/5. INF,
3. Stressing the importance of the SAMOA Pathway as the reference document for SIDS,
4. Expresses its gratitude to the Director-General for the efforts made to finalize the SIDS Action Plan and approves the finalized SIDS Action Plan as finalized-amended;
5. Welcomes the strategy for a first phase of implementation of the SIDS Action Plan contained in Part II of document 199 EX/5.INF;
6. Notes that the Regular Programme budget allocated to the SIDS Action Plan will not cover all the proposed activities and does not reflect the recognition and importance of SIDS as a priority group and that it must be therefore, strengthened.
7. Invites the Director-General to seek extrabudgetary resources to allow the full implementation of the Action Plan of SIDS;
