Summary of debate

The Chair of the Nominations Committee announced the results of the Nominations Committee's election for the SC Commission. The Chair (Malaysia), four Vice-Chairs (Turkey, Dominican Republic, South Africa, Sudan) and the Rapporteur (Slovenia) were elected.

The Chairperson, Ms Noorul Ainur binti Mohd. Nur (Malaysia) took the floor to open the Commission.

Following her opening remarks, the Chairperson started to propose the organization and methods of work of the Commission. The timetable of work was adopted with no changes.

The Chairperson gave the floor to Mr. Sergio Guevara, Chair of the MAB International Coordination Council (MAB-ICC) to deliver a joint statement on behalf of the chairpersons the international and intergovernmental science programmes.

Ms Houda Ait Mik representative of the World Federation of Engineering Organizations (WFEO) addressed the SC commission during this opening segment.

Ms Denise Young representative of the International Council for Science (ICSU) addressed the SC Commission.

The SC Commission took note of reports of the intergovernmental and international scientific programmes without objection.

The Youth representative, Ms Samantha Montesarchio (Italy) presented the conclusions of the UNESCO Youth Forum (Item 4.5).

The Director of Programme and Budget for the Bureau of Strategic Planning, Mr Jean-Yves Le Saux then took the floor to introduce the 39 C/5 and thereafter, together with presentations by the Assistant Director-General for Natural Sciences, Ms Flavia Schlegel and by the Assistant Director-General for the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission, Mr. Vladimir Ryabinin, introduced the Draft Programme and Budget for 2018-2021 and Item 3.4.

The Chairperson drew up and announced a list of speakers wishing to comment on Item 3.4 and allowed 3 minutes for each speaker. The floor was the opened to statements from Member States following the order of the list with 25 Member States making their statements. The remaining speakers were scheduled for the afternoon session at 3 p.m. on Monday, November 9.
