12.2 To be considered for the Jury Prize, the works must have been completed within the last 10 years and before the announcement date of the awards (i.e. the project must have been completed after October 1994 and before October 2004). The project must also have been occupied or put to visible use

12.3 The submission must demonstrate that no structures of heritage significance were altered or cleared from the site for the purpose of the project submitted for the Jury

12.4 Projects which are new structures built as historic replicas, built against historic facades, and historic theme parks will not be considered within the scope of the Jury Price.

The guidelines for "Selection of Awards Recipients", "Jury", "Conditions of Entry" and "Announcement and Presentation of the Awards" shall be subject to Articles 3, 4, 5, and 6, respectively.
