
All youth and a substantial proportion of adults, both men and women, achieve literacy and numeracy by 2030

2000: World Education Forum sets literacy goals	
2003-2012: United Nations Literacy Decade	


We have come a long way... but we are not there yet

Literacy rate has been increasing steadily over the last 60 years




We recognize the challenge... 757 million cannot read and write Two thirds are women

Almost anywhere, anytime






