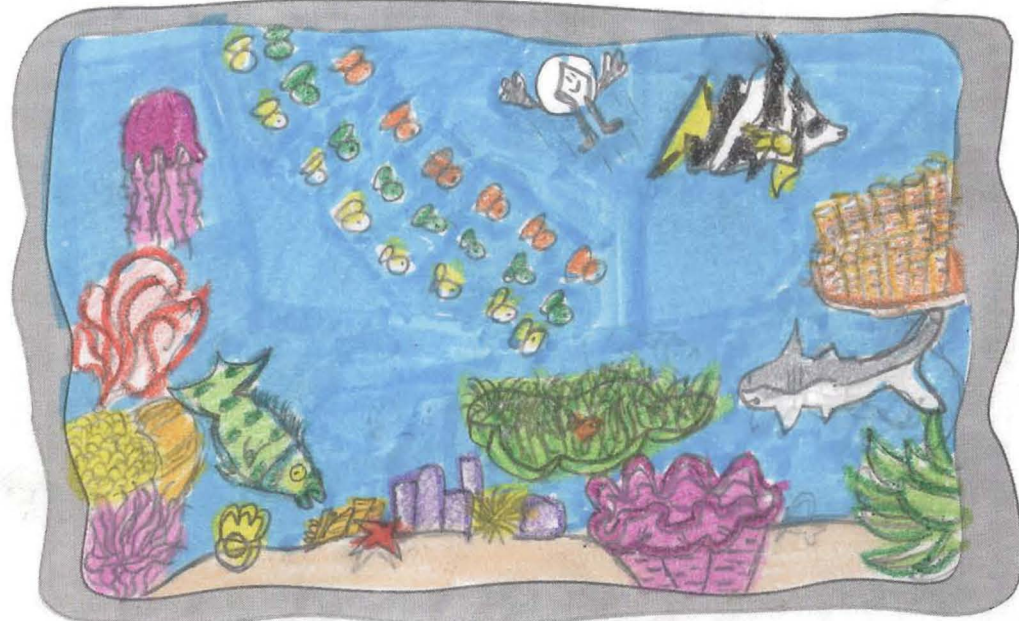

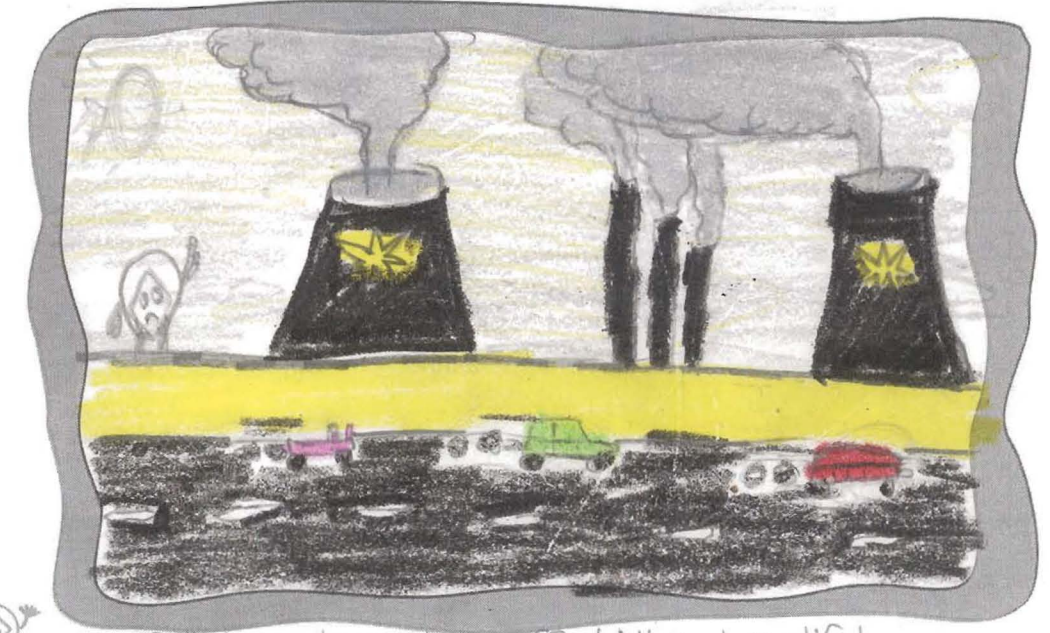
The Great Barrier Reef is in Brisbane and this is how it used to look like.

Pollution has also effected the beautiful Great Barrier Reef.



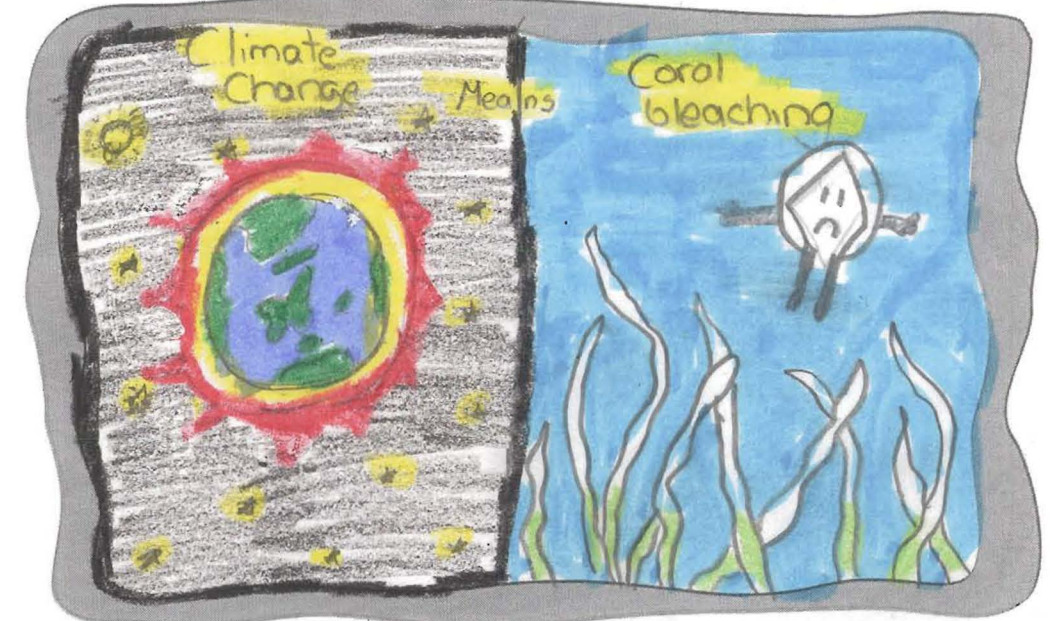

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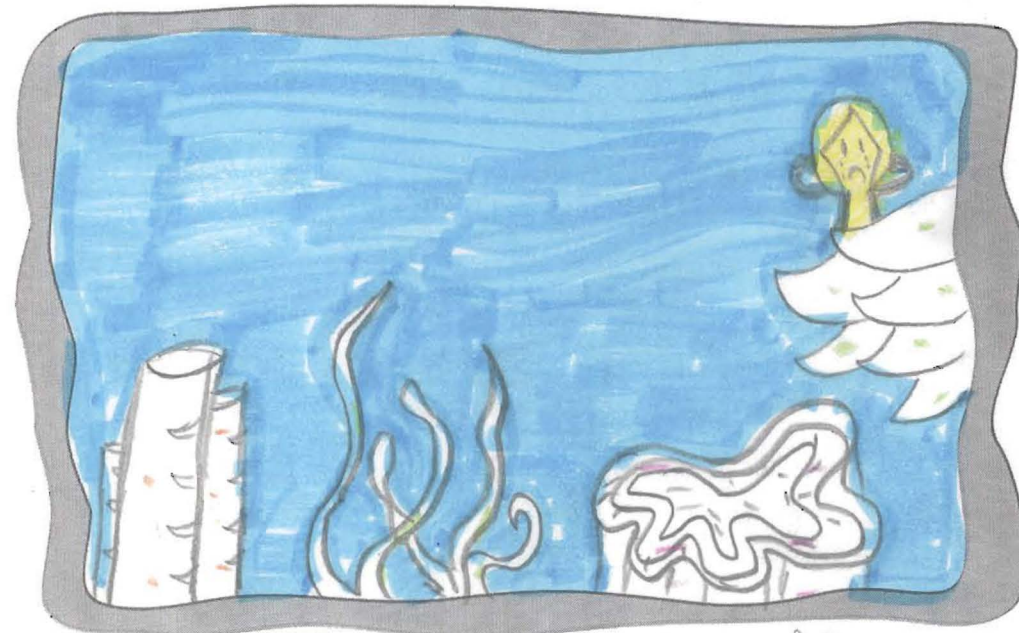

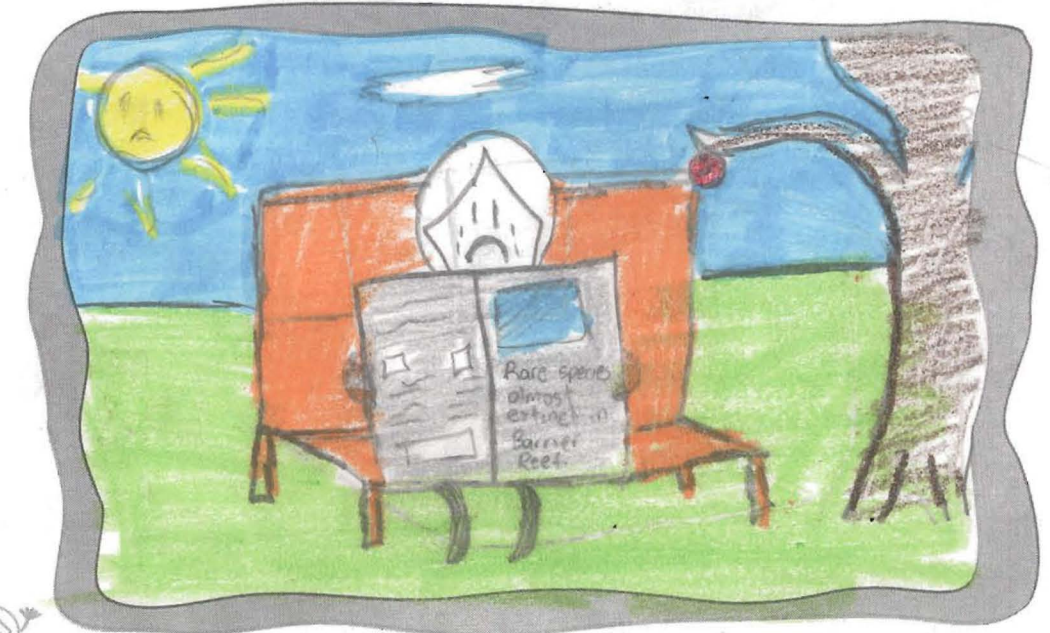
The rubbish that is thrown in the water can cause serious damage to marine life.

If this continues the nice colours of the coral will disappear.



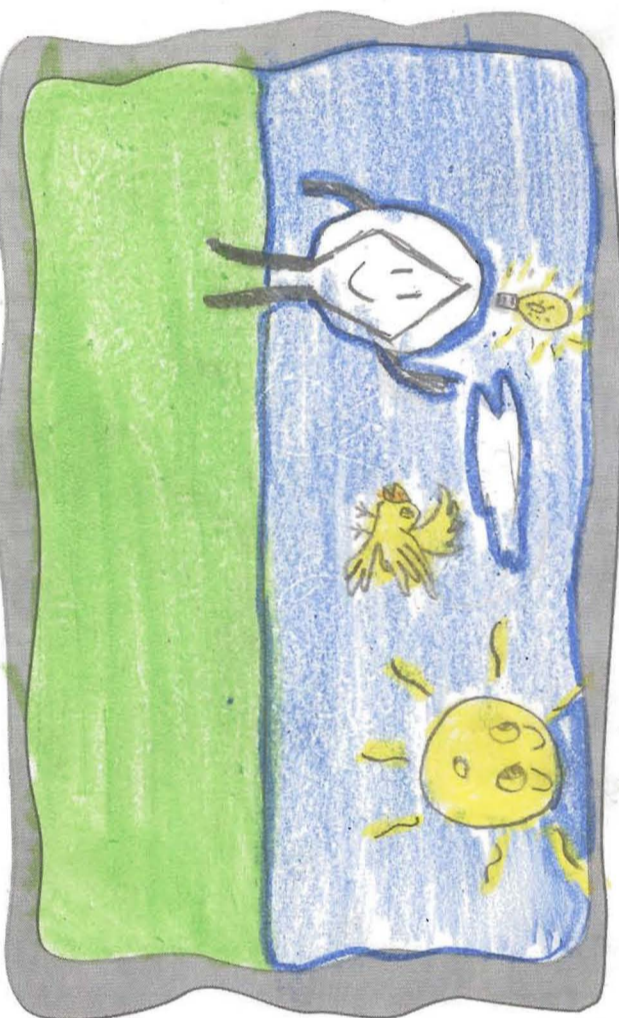
The marine life will also die and some species will be extinct because they are only found in the Great Barrier Reef.

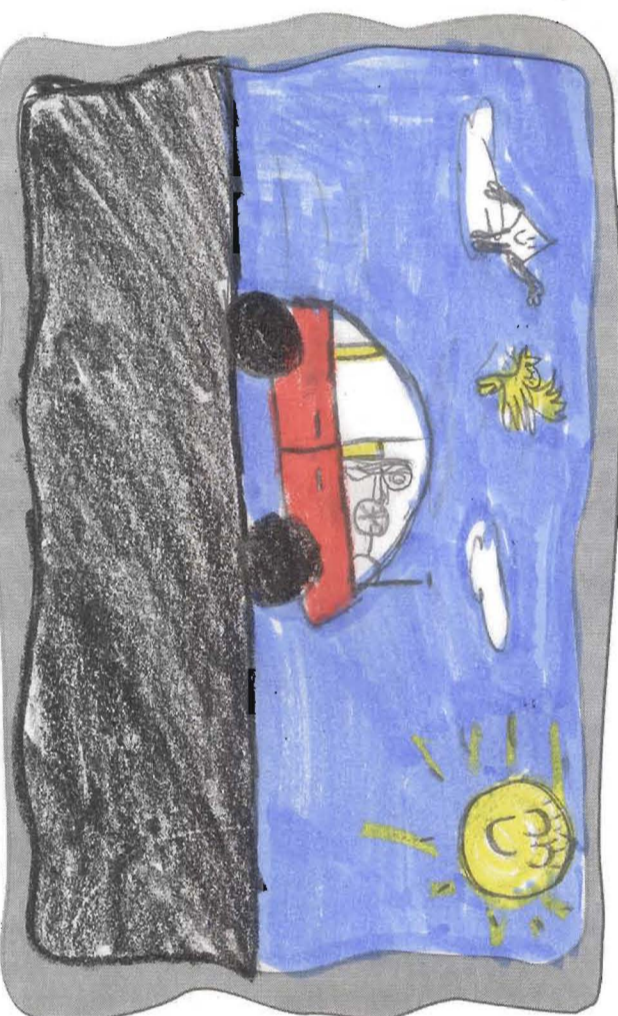

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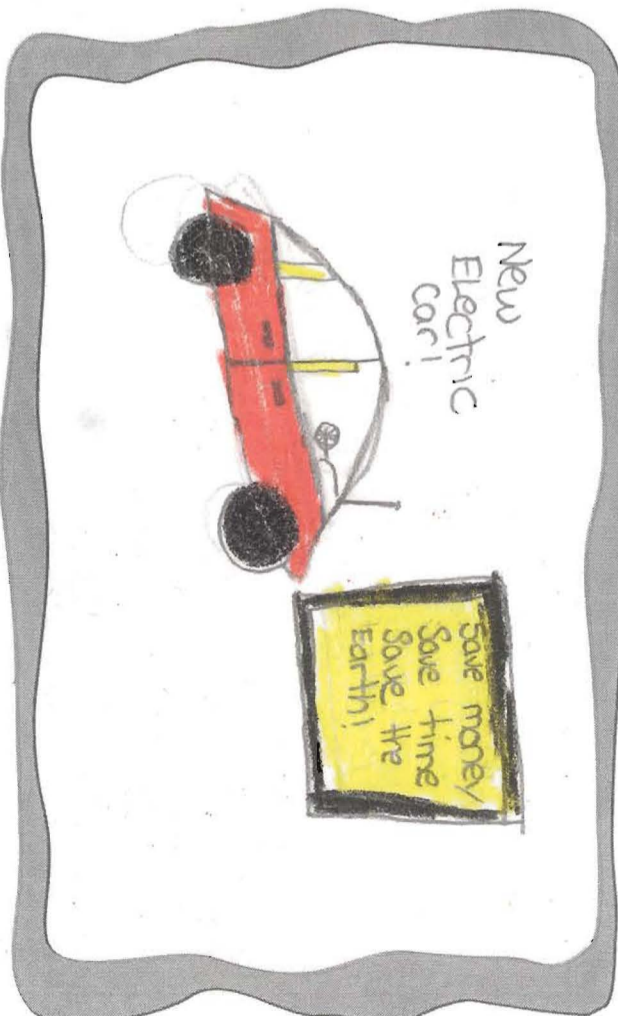

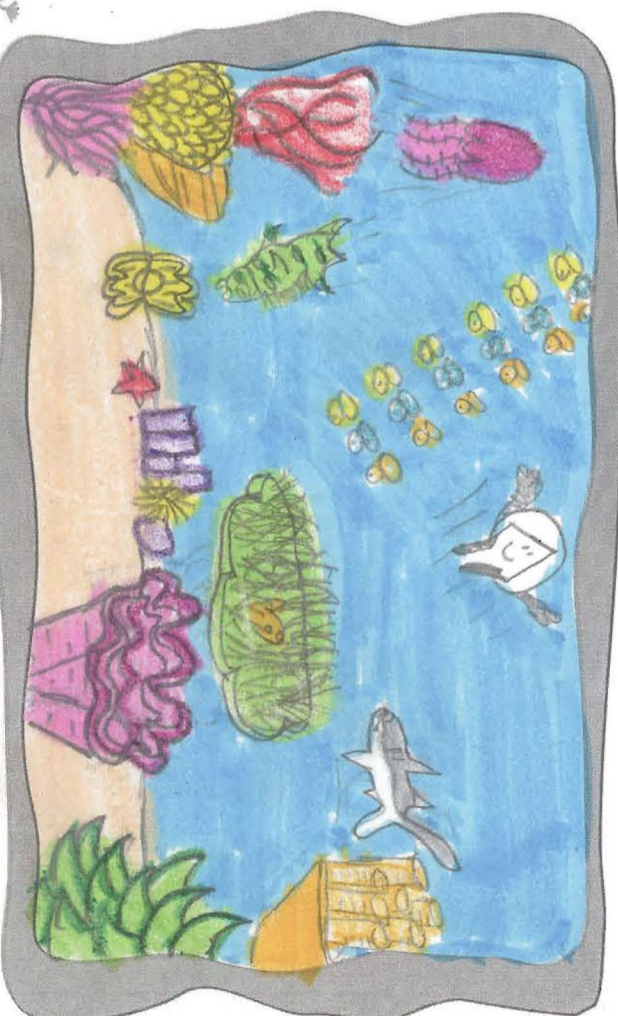
Volunteer work to clean up the Great Barrier Reef can help save the marine life.
