For Cambodia to work towards a peaceful society, a place for education about the Khmer Rouge era is essential for its people. Improving the understanding of the Khmer Rouge conflict, promoting justice for victims, and bringing about reconciliation for the Cambodian society will be crucial for a peaceful future.
