Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

Some 60,000 articles mentioning UNESCO were monitored in November 2016 in news outlets worldwide (-16% vs Oct. 2016). Peaks were registered early in the month with up to 3,000 daily articles, notably on the occasion of International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists, with its multiple events in various venues around the world, and at the end of the month, with more than 4,000 articles monitored, mainly related to the ongoing inscriptions to the Representative List of the intangible Cultural Heritage (see graph to the right).


- Traffic on UNESCO's public website dropped by 5% after two consecutive months of growth. Visits and page views remain however among the highest in 2016. A peak was registered on 30 Nov. 2016 with the increased traffic on the Intangible Heritage website on the occasion of the inscriptions on the Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage (+65% vs Nov. 2015).
- November 2016 was a busy month for UNESCO's social media to cover the numerous events. As a result, it sustained a positive growth on our social media channels in all languages with significant accomplishments on various platforms. This month, a total of more than 5.4 million followers were registered on key accounts across 7 languages, showing a 38% increase compared to November 2015.

Publications

- November 2016 figures for the Top 10 online viewing have fallen since Sept. this year but still remain superior to those in 2015 in the same period (+13%). A large interest is shown for Spanish titles (60%) and for the English version of the flagship publication <u>GEM Report, 2016</u>, the frontrunner in the Top 10. Publications page views on Google Books are the second highest this year, after a slow three months.
- In the bookshop, the best-selling publications were the <u>World</u> <u>Social Science Report 2016</u> and World Heritage titles, while online and internal sales were dominated by *Climate Change* (in French) in the IOC Ocean Forum series, and the new volumes in the collection *Different Aspects of Islamic Culture*.






Articles monitored daily in all media sources in which "UNESCO" appears

Major events:

I. Internet and the Radicalization of Youth: Preventing, Acting and Living Together (30 Oct.- 01 Nov. 2016)

UNESCO and the Government of Quebec organized a conference on "Internet and the radicalization of youth: Preventing, Acting and Living together" from 30 October to 1 November 2016 in Quebec, Canada. The conference was organized in the framework of the Information for All Programme (IFAP) and as a follow-up of the first-ever conference on this topic, held in June 2015 at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris.

The main goals were to: 1) present best practices in countering radicalization of young people in cyberspace and 2) develop initiatives for effectively preventing violent extremism and radicalization of youth.



The conference was a considerable success in terms of participation.

Three concrete initiatives were announced during the event:

1. The Call of Quebec for Action was announced by the end of conference signed by the participants including the Prime Minister Philippe Couillard and the Minister of International Relations and la Francophonie, Christine St Pierre

2. The creation of a UNESCO Chair on the fight against radicalization and preventing violent extremism

3. The project "Prevention of violent extremism by strengthening capacities of young people in Jordan, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia"

Participants: 500 participants from about 70 countries. **Audience:** The Prime Minister of Quebec, 7 Ministers, government officials, 4 high-level UN officials, and 5 mayors, researchers, specialists and civil society representatives.



Press coverage: Quebec conference got wide coverage locally, however, articles appeared as well in <u>Paris Match</u> and <u>Le Monde</u>.

Social media: The DPI team provided access to @unescoNOW (our dedicated live-tweeting account) to programme specialists present at the event in order to live-tweet activities, while @unesco channels were cross promoting the live materials. In addition, @UNESCO communicated on the subject with compelling visuals and interesting statistics.

II. International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists (02 Nov.)



The third edition of the <u>International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (IDEI)</u> was observed through a multitude of events organized worldwide; its commemoration started by a seminar in Arusha, Tanzania on 10 September 2016 organized by UNESCO and the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights. Other events included high-level panel discussions and roundtable discussions in New York, Bogotá and The Hague as well as other initiatives in Europe, Asia, South America, the MENA region, and Africa. In total <u>33 commemorations</u> were organized by UNESCO and partners to raise awareness on impunity for crimes against journalists and its impact on the safety of journalists.

In order to promote the International Day, a **media kit** was sent out in advance to field offices, NGOs and partners and well-known journalists for them to share the materials on IDEI with their network and on social media. The International Day also served as the occasion to share the highlights of the new UNESCO Director-General's Report on Safety of Journalists and the Danger of Impunity through the public **awareness raising campaign** 'My killers are still free', which visualized the key findings of the Report and emphasized the duress of impunity through audio testimonials of those who keep the memory of killed media workers alive. The powerful and heartfelt statements of close relatives, co-workers, and lawyers demonstrate the consequences of impunity and the ultimate price journalists have paid. Furthermore, an **Op-Ed**



by Mr Frank La Rue, the Assistant Director-General for Communication and Information, was translated in 6 languages and published in 43 media in more than 20 different countries, including, Cambodia, Italia, Jordan Myanmar, Pakistan, South Sudan, Senegal, Russia, United States. In more than 50 countries various articles on the International Day were published. Official declarations and statements were made by Secretary-General Bank Ki-moon of the United Nations, European Commission, Organization of American States, African Union, OSCE, but also by the President of France, François Hollande, and the President of Somalia, Hassan Sheikh Mohamud.



Participants: Seminar in Arusha: more than 100 participants (judges, journalists) from 36 different countries. A total of 26 people participated as a speaker in the panel discussion and 43 journalists attended the seminar. Speakers for the high level panel discussions around the world included renown journalists, among which Mr Mazen Darwish, Laureate of the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize; representatives of civil society and other Member States' representatives. **Audience:** Representatives from Member States, UN Agencies, NGOs, academia, and media professionals.

Press coverage: Some 50 articles, mainly in the African media, covered the Arusha Seminar in September 2016. International Day to End Impunity for Crimes Against Journalists was extensively covered worldwide early in the month, and several hundreds of articles were monitored as well throughout the month of November referencing UNESCO statistics on the killing of journalists. The Op-Ed by Frank La Rue, was published in more than 30 media in Oct.-Nov. 2016. See selected media coverage <u>here</u>.

Social media: The 2 November commemoration was widely shared on all UNESCO's social media channels. In the week leading up to 2 November, UNESCO Twitter account disseminated teasers of the testimonials of the 'My killers are still free' campaign, as well as the poster especially created for the International Day and infographics on the Director-General's Report on Safety of Journalists and the Danger of Impunity. In order to engage the global public and programme partners, 'power' twitterers with a large following were contacted to share IDEI2016-related tweets on 2 Nov. E.i Ms Christiane Amanpour, our Goodwill Ambassador for Freedom of Expression and Journalist Safety, Mr Hamid Mir, a well-known Pakistani journalist, Ms Maria Ressa, Philippine journalists, Mr Edison Lanza, Special Rapporteur on Freedom of Expression of the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights (CIDH), Ms Cilla Benkö, CEO of Sveriges Radio, as well as partnering delegations and civil society organizations such as WAN-IFRA, CPJ, IFEX and IFJ tweeted or retweeted UNESCO content. Also several UN Agencies retweeted IDEI2016-related tweets, amongst others United Nations, Un Human Rights, UN Women and UNODC. The <u>link to the DG's Report</u> was the most retweeted, namely 866 times.

III. UNESCO at COP22 (07-18 Nov. 2016)



The 22nd Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP22) convened from 7 to 18 November 2016 in Marrakech, Morocco. On this occasion and as part of the overall United Nations system, UNESCO's observer presence at the COP once again provided information and technical resources about its work on climate change. UNESCO also assists UNFCCC-COP host countries through its <u>uniquely multidisciplinary expertise and outreach</u> in climate change education, science, culture and communication, mobilizing efforts for enhanced climate change awareness and action in the lead-up to, during and in the follow-up to each COP.

On the occasion of COP22, **75 events** (conferences, debates, launching events etc.) were organized by UNESCO before and during the conference, in Marrakech and in the different areas of the COP (Blue and Green Zones).

Since COP21, UNESCO has a pavilion in the civil society area (Green Zone) of the COP, providing an opportunity to engage different stakeholders and the general public to collectively address climate change and inform them about UNESCO's role in finding solutions. A <u>series of thematic days</u> related to UNESCO's actions on climate change was organized on UNESCO's pavilion, where conferences and debates were held: Indigenous People (7/11), UNESCO's Designated Sites (8/11), Water (9/11), Ocean and Disaster Risk Reduction (10/11), Social and Human Sciences (11/11), Small Island Developing States (12/11), Education (14/11), Gender (15/11) and Africa (16/11).



UNESCO Pavilion, SHS Day OUNESCO

UNESCO was once again the only UN agency to be represented in the civil society area and also the only organism to present a series of debates and conferences all day, every day. This offered a unique space and opportunity for a great variety of stakeholders such as UNESCO's experts, representatives of other UN agencies, UNESCO's partners, the civil society and the general public, to gather and exchange on main issues related to climate change. Sessions were attended by a vast public from 15 to 150 people (depending on the session), and some 150 to 300 people came every day to UNESCO's pavilion to find out more about the UNESCO's actions on climate change. UNESCO's motto "Changing Minds, not the Climate" had a great success with the public on site, who understood perfectly the key role Education and raising awareness plays in the creation of a sustainable world. The great cooperation between UNESCO's several sectors and between UNESCO's headquarters and field offices allowed the Organization to consolidate its presence and visibility on its actions to the international community and to the civil society.

During the COP, events organized by UNESCO were covered by <u>Radio Climat</u>, which broadcast in Marrakech on a temporary radio license, and also contributed to a temporary press agency for community radio stations worldwide, led by young people. This programme was coordinated by AMARC, in partnership with the FMAS, with the support of the Maghreb UNESCO office in the framework of the «Network of Mediterranean Youth» project (NET-MED Youth) and funded by the European Union.



The "UNESCO GREEN CITIZENS: Pathfinders for change" exhibition, highlighting nine emblematic projects on education for sustainable development, was held in Marrakech's airport in November during the COP and could be seen by all passengers. A launch event was organized on UNESCO pavilion, in the presence of UNESCO Director-General, Ms. Irina Bokova. The exhibition will be travelling to four other international Moroccan airports until March 2017:

- Casablanca (December 2016)
- Rabat (January 2017)
- Tanger (February 2017)
- Fez (March 2017)



Press coverage: Some 400 articles referenced UNESCO at COP22. The Kuwait News Agency, National Radio New Zealand, L'Observateur du Maroc, Liberation (Maroc), and Arab Times, were among the news organizations that included UNESCO in their coverage.

Social media: @UNESCO social media team communicated heavily on UNESCO pavilion's thematic days during COP22. The thematic day on Education was well received, with key events in the Blue Zone around the press conference organized by GEM Report colleagues with the Director-General and HRH Princess Lalla Hasna of Morocco - to launch the Global Education Monitoring (GEM) Report's new publication, PLANET: Education for environmental sustainability and green growth, such as a high-level panel debate, including Education ministers; both events were streamed on Facebook Live. The #GreenCitizen exhibition, along with Water, Megacities and global change event were also well received on social media.

IV. World Philosophy Day (17 Nov. 2016)

On the occasion of World Philosophy Day, a series of events were organized from 16 to 19 November at UNESCO Headquarters to celebrate the creativity and diversity of this discipline, which were attended by more than 3,000 participants. Over three days, access to philosophical guestioning were proposed to all, including through: the 15th International Encounters on New Philosophical Practices (16-17 November), a Round Table on "Speak up together for tolerance" (17 November), a Round Table on teaching Aristotle at secondary and university level (18 November), the launch of the new UNESCO Chair on the practice of philosophy with children (4-18 years) (18 November).





In this context, the celebration culminated on 18 November in a Night of Philosophy from 7 pm to 7 am, an unprecedented celebration of human thought and creativity organized with support among others of the French National Commission for UNESCO and the Mairie de Paris. The watchword of the night: to bring philosophy to all audiences and to life in all its forms.

Children, adults and many young people were present during the 12-hour event. Everyone was able to create its own unique and multiform philosophical journey, moving from passionate listening to one of the 48 conferences of renowned philosophers from all over the world, to guestioning or amazement in front of the 24 artistic installations and performances organized throughout the night.

V. High-Level Conference "Promoting an Inclusive Urban Agenda for Refugees and Migrants" (22 Nov.) and Expert Meeting "Empowering cities to implement an inclusive urban agenda for refugees and migrants" (23 Nov. 2016)

Local authorities and their administrations are oftentimes at the front lines of refugee and migrant reception and integration. Further to additional financial resources, local governments need enhanced capacity, in terms of knowledge, skills and authority, to foster the enjoyment of human rights for all their inhabitants and tackle effectively the mounting anti-migrant backlash.

Finding adequate responses to these challenges is what motivated the partnership on *welcoming cities for refugees* between UNESCO, the Marianna V. Vardinoyannis Foundation and the European Coalition of Cities against Racism launched in May 2016.

Within this context, the partners organized in Athens, Greece, two mutually reinforcing events.

On 22 November, a high-level conference was convened marked by the presence of H.E. the President of the Hellenic Republic, UNESCO's Director-General, Ms Vardinoyannis, ministers, first ladies, mayors and experts. Its objective was to send a strong message in favour of an inclusive urban agenda for refugees and migrants aligned with the spirit of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The call for greater solidarity and anchorage of efforts in the universal values of human rights, gender equality and respect for diversity, was reinforced by the findings and recommendations of the UNESCO publication <u>Cities Welcoming Refugees and Migrants: enhancing effective urban governance in an age of migration</u> that was presented to the press on that occasion.



High-Level Conference, 22 Nov. 2016



On 23 November, an experts' meeting was organized with the participation of representatives of municipal authorities, representatives of UN agencies, UNESCO Chairs and experts. Its aim was to make a step forward in the endeavor of translating international commitments and the publication's recommendations into operational guidance (handbook) for urban governments and concerned stakeholders. The discussions brought to the fore a wealth of issues and considerations which will enrich the handbook for a welcoming urban agenda for refugees and migrants that is currently under elaboration.

UNESCO's Office in Tashkent was established in 1996 as a project office in the field of culture. Over the past 20 years, the Office's programme portfolio has grown and now includes activities in all UNESCO's areas of competence - education, the sciences, culture, and communication and information. The country Office focuses on advocacy and capacity-building, working closely with the Ministries of Education of the Republic of Uzbekistan, to promote the quality of education and lifelong learning opportunities for all. In the field of culture, the Office supports the development of Management Plans for the World Heritage-listed properties and the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage, including the promotion of culture as the driver for development. Through the localization of UNESCO's publications and capacity-building of journalists, the Office's work in the field of communication and information focuses on the quality of media reporting. UNESCO's action within the framework of the UN Joint Programme at the Aral Sea is promoting sustainable livelihoods of the local communities based on the natural and cultural heritage of the region. UNESCO is an active member of the United National Country Team and chairs the Education Results Group and the Communications Group. As a new feature, the Office's Facebook page launched in February 2016 is gaining importance as a tool of dynamic communication for both the country-level activities as well as for sharing global messages of the Organization.

10 -11 November 2016 in Tashkent and 17 November - 1 December in the regions

Training of Trainers and master classes at journalism faculties on quality reporting, followed by 6 regional trainings: The training of trainers conducted with support of an international expert brought together 25 journalists from all over Uzbekistan. The focus of the training was on the quality of journalism, including presentation of UNESCO's series of publications on investigative journalism, media and information literacy, and non-stereotyped reporting on HIV and AIDS, people with disabilities and women, as well as environmental journalism. The participants also discussed the draft code of conduct. The trainers trained then trained more than150 journalists during trainings organized in six regions of the country.

UNESCO participating in the SDG localization retreat with national authorities: As a member of the UNCT, UNESCO supports the government in the localization of the SDGs, leading discussions on SDG4. The workshop with national partners highlighted the importance of data and statistics in tracking progress



on the new set of sustainable development goals.

16 November 2016, Tashkent

International Day for Tolerance: Jointly with the Committee on Religious Affairs under the Cabinet of Ministers and the Tashkent Islamic University, UNESCO organized a meeting to explore the role of religions in promoting tolerance and inter-concessional dialogue. The Head of Office speech included the DG's message on the occasion of the Day.

21 November 2016, Nukus, Karakalpakstan

11-12 November 2016, Tashkent region

Presentation of the publication on "Heritage of Karakalpakstan: History, Culture, Nature, Museums" and opening of textile exhibitions at the State Museum of Art named after Savitsky in Nukus: The publication was published within the framework of the UN Joint Programme on "Sustaining Livelihoods Affected by the Aral Sea Disaster" with funding from the UN Trust Fund for Human Security (UNTFHS). Within this Programme, UNESCO contributes to the social and economic well-being of the local communities by promoting sustainable livelihoods. The aim of the publication is to promote the rich cultural and natural heritage of the region. The exhibitions "World textile: The East and the West" and of Latvian tapestry artist lveta Vecenāne were brought to Karakalpakstan with support from many embassies to demonstrate to local communities and masters of this remote region traditional textile from around the world. 

Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al). Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. More detailed statistics on specific programmes can be made available to the responsible officers upon request (contact: v.pham@unesco.org).

Traffic on UNESCO's public website grew in September, peaked in October, and dropped 5% in November. Visits and page views remain however among the highest in 2016. Compared to the same month last year visits increased by 9% while page views saw a slight decline (-4%). A peak was registered on 30 November 2016 with the increased traffic on the Intangible Heritage website on the occasion of the inscriptions on the Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage. As a result, visits to the Intangible Heritage website jumped by more than 65% compared to last year same month, at the beginning of the Committee Meeting.





¹ **Page views**: The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

² Visits (or sessions): A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

³ Visitors: A visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.





2.2. Statistics on articles referring to UNESCO

This graph shows the number of articles monitored in all media sources, in which "UNESCO" appeared in the story in November (Source: CISION)



Four of the five major events monitored for this month's report (see pp 3-8) were held outside headquarters or in the case of the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (IDEI), marked by a number of events held in various venues around the world. By far, IDEI with its multiple events, appears to have driven up UNESCO's story count at the beginning of the month contributing to up to 3,000 daily articles referencing UNESCO. The conference on the Internet and the Radicalization of Youth: Preventing, Acting and Living Together, which was held in Quebec, Canada and the conference on Promoting an Inclusive Urban Agenda for Refugees and Migrants, which was held in Athens, Greece attracted mostly local news coverage. At the end of the month, more than 4,000 articles were monitored, mainly related to the ongoing inscriptions to the Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage. Full coverage of this meeting will be in next month's report. In total, some 60,000 articles mentioning UNESCO were monitored in November 2016 in news outlets worldwide (-16% vs Oct. 2016).



3. UNESCO Social Media Channels

November 2016 was a busy month for UNESCO's social media to cover the numerous events. As a result, it sustained a positive growth on our social media channels in all languages with significant accomplishments on various platforms. This month, a total of more than 5.4 million followers were registered on key accounts across 7 languages, showing a 38% increase compared to November 2015.

Messages on international awareness days, International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (2 Nov.), World Philosophy Day (18 Nov.) and International Day for Tolerance were the most popular this month. On Facebook, the top 2 posts were on World Philosophy Day (in Spanish), while the most retweeted message was linked to the International Day to End Impunity for Crimes against Journalists (in English). Social Media team aims to continue its efforts to strategically craft and execute our content to strengthen UNESCO's presence on existing and emerging social media channels. This approach benefited our outreach and visibility, based on tracking success through engagement rates, growth statistics, reader responses and other metrics.







3.4. Content shared by UNESCO on Wikimedia

Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects receive 15 to 20 billion page views per month from 500 million visitors in 285 languages. The websites are created by tens of thousands of volunteers working together with the aim of bringing free educational content to the world. As part of UNESCO's Open Access Policy it began to share content on Wikimedia projects in December 2014 to increase UNESCO's visibility and share educational content. UNESCO has uploaded around 1,000 media files to Wikimedia including photographs, videos and illustrations and made them available under a Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike IGO 3.0 license. The number of Wikipedia articles using UNESCO content has been growing over the past year and are now being used on 40 different language Wikipedias.

In November 2016 UNESCO content received more than 935,000 page views, showing a slight decrease compared to Oct. 2016 (-2%). Within one year UNESCO content received some 8.6 million page views on Wikipedia. It is expected the usage and viewing figures of UNESCO content on Wikimedia projects will increase significantly as larger volumes of content will be added in the coming months.

Descriptions of the MAB Biosphere Reserves -made available in June 2016 under the same Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike IGO 3.0 license and used by Wikimedia volunteers to create 72 new Biosphere Reserve English Wikipedia pages - received over 7,000 page views in November 2016.



4. UNESCO Photobank (under construction, N/A for November)

The UNESCO online repository of photos offers over 25 000 photos for free download. Subject matter spans all areas of activity of the Organization, including events at Headquarters and in the different regions of the World. Separate photobanks in the sectors are not tracked but also get significant downloads.

The **UNESDOC database** -managed by KMI/MSA Knowledge-Sharing & Open Access Unit - contains the full text and bibliographic records of documents and publications published by UNESCO since 1945 as well as bibliographic records of library acquisitions. These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.


In November 2016, there were **154 847** records available online in PDF format (**154 603** in October 2016), including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.






The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.


'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

The November 2016 figures for the Top 10 online viewing have fallen since September (-15%), and October (-4%) this year but still remain superior to those in 2015 in the same period (+13%). The figures show a large interest for Spanish titles (60%) and for the English version of the flagship publication <u>*GEM Report, 2016*</u> which is in first place in the Top 10. Publications page views on Google Books have revived for October and November 2016 after a slow three months, and is the second highest figure this year. In the bookshop, the best-selling publications were the <u>*World Social Science Report 2016*</u> and World Heritage titles, while online and internal sales were dominated by *Climate Change* (in French) in the IOC Ocean Forum series, and the new volumes in the collection *Different Aspects of Islamic Culture.*



Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.
