Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

- 56,877 articles mentioning UNESCO were monitored this month in news outlets worldwide.
- At Headquarters and abroad, UNESCO events were responsible for focusing significant additional attention on the Organization. The three featured events this month, the 201st session of the Executive Board, World Book and Copyright Day and International Jazz Day - all in the second half of April - clearly provided impetus for coverage that brought several peaks to a period of increased coverage (see graph to the right). The Executive Board was a key factor and largely responsible for the two main peaks of activity in April. In particular, two issues were driving press interest: the Draft Decision on Occupied Palestine and the interviews for the post of Director-General. Additionally, World Book and Copyright Day brought another peak of reporting on the Organization on 24 April. International Jazz Day coverage was the third element in this trio of events that, when taken together, were responsible for keeping media interest high in UNESCO.

UNESCO Website and Social Media Channels

- April 2017 traffic on our public website dropped by 16% after having reached an all-time high in March (see 2nd graph to the right). Details on the traffic were not communicated.
- This month, a few landmarks were achieved on social media: 1. Instagram accounts in Spanish and Russian, VKontakte, and Twitter in Arabic and Russian have been officially verified; 2. the total number of followers on our Twitter accounts topped 3 million (see graph to the right).
- Coverage of World Book and Copyright Day and International Jazz Day generated once again huge interest. #DíaDelLibro, hashtag for World Book and Copyright Day was world trending topic for most part of the day, and messages for this celebration in Spanish were the most retweeted and the most liked & shared this month on Facebook and Twitter (see details page 14).

Publications

- Top 10 online viewing dropped in April for the first time this year (-14%) and is lower than last year same month (-8%). Spanish titles dominate again in this list (62% of downloads). The only English titles that remain very prominent this month are flagship reports: [Engineering: issues, challenges and opportunities for development; UNESCO report](#) and the main [GEM Report, 2016](#). In Spanish, [Hacia las sociedades del conocimiento: informe mundial de la UNESCO](#) (Towards knowledge societies: UNESCO world report) is number two in the Top 10 list with more than 10,000 downloads.
- Views on Google Books are stable with more than 780,000 pages viewed for the second month in a row.



Focus on a Field Office

This topic aiming to highlight the outreach efforts in the field focuses this month on our Office in Dakar.

Major events:

I. 201st session of the Executive Board (19 April – 5 May 2017)



The highlights of the 201st session of the Executive Board included the Interviews with the nine candidates for the post of Director-General of UNESCO, proposed by Azerbaijan, China, Egypt, France, Guatemala, Iraq, Lebanon, Qatar and Viet Nam, on 26 and 27 April 2017. For the very first time, the interviews were webcast live, with a total of 26,120 external connections registered during the two days. Videos and relevant information were posted on UNESCO website.

Another highlight was the adoption on 2 May of a new decision regarding Jerusalem under item 30 "Occupied Palestine", which was covered in the media worldwide, before and after its adoption. Some 1,700 articles reported on the decision worldwide, including more than 1,000 in Arabic media.



Press coverage: More than 1,700 articles covered the decision on Jerusalem worldwide as at 6 May 2017. Some 1,060 news were monitored in Arab speaking media, with the highest number in Egypt (34%), Saudi Arabia (18%), Palestine (7%). More than 650 articles were published in other languages, incl. 280 in the US, 72 in Israel (in English), 21 in the UK, Germany and France. 23 journalists were accredited for the interviews for the post of Director-General. Less than 500 articles covered these interviews.

Social media: In coordination with the Executive Board team, it was agreed to publish only 2 tweets announcing the webcast of the interviews. Those messages were published on the English and French accounts on the morning of 26 and 27 April and were retweeted on the Chairman's account.

II. World Book and Copyright Day 2017 (23 April 2017) / Journée mondiale du livre et du droit d'auteur (23 avril 2017)



La [Journée mondiale du livre et du droit d'auteur](#) (23 avril) était consacrée cette année aux personnes aveugles ou souffrant d'une déficience visuelle. C'est dans ce cadre que l'UNESCO a organisé à son Siège, lundi 24 avril, en partenariat avec l'[Asfօred](#) (Association nationale pour la formation et le perfectionnement professionnels dans les métiers de l'édition) une conférence d'une matinée sur le thème *Accessibilité : quels enjeux pour l'édition ?*

Le 23 avril a également marqué le début du mandat (2017-2018) de Conakry (République de Guinée), ville nommée [Capitale mondiale du livre 2017](#). La ville de Conakry et le continent africain étaient de fait à l'honneur, dans la deuxième partie de la journée, pour la promotion de la littérature africaine avec l'évènement « Lire l'Afrique ! ». Deux tables rondes *Regards croisés sur l'Afrique littéraire d'aujourd'hui* et *Femme africaine, source d'inspiration littéraire* ont permis au public d'échanger avec onze auteurs africains : Christian Abegan, Sophia Ammad, Kidi Bebey, Sonia Houenoude, Jussy Kiyindou, Mohamed Mbougar Sarr, Hemley Boum, Selma Guettaf, Yves Berthrand Nguyen Matoko, Fathia Radjabou, Michelle Tanon-Lora, en présence des modérateurs Dominique Louba, Directrice du Prix Senghor et Réassi Ouabonzi, blogueur « Chez Gangoueus ». Plusieurs maisons d'édition ont présenté leur collection : Editions A dos d'âne, Editions Dagan, Editions Nubia, L'Harmattan Guinée, Librairie-Galerie Congo, Michel Lafon Editions, Présence Africaine.

De multiples animations et ateliers ont rythmé cette après-midi : club de lecture, initiation à cinq langues africaines, découverte d'un magazine dédié au design africain, personnalisation de livres en tissu wax, typique de l'Afrique. Trois spectacles contés et chantés au son d'instruments africains ont complété le programme.

Participants: Conférence : 160 participants. Lire l'Afrique ! : 250 participants.

Audience: Grand public adulte, personnel de l'UNESCO, Délégations permanentes et professionnels de l'édition.

Press coverage: World Book and Copyright Day was widely covered. More than 630 articles - in the 6 official UN languages - associated the day to UNESCO. New sites based in Spain published most stories (147 articles monitored), followed by the US (74 articles), Mexico (49), Egypt (33), France (31), Saudi Arabia (24), China (21). Ten journalists were accredited for the event at Headquarters.

Social media: World Book Day proved again to be a big success on social media despite of falling this year on a Sunday. Once more, it was especially successful in Spanish, where the hashtag #DíaDelLibro was trending topic worldwide most of the day. Messages on the French accounts included a focus on the promotion of the event taking place at Headquarters on 24 April.

III. International Jazz Day 2017 (30 April 2017)

International Jazz Day was celebrated on 30 April in 196 Member States. The global venue of this sixth edition was Havana, Cuba, a land of rich musical tradition with important contributions to the development of jazz.

Together with the Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz, the Cuban Institute of Music and the Ministry of Culture of Cuba, a week-long programme of activities was organised which closed with the All-Star Global Concert, broadcast to Cuba and the world from the emblematic Alicia Alonso Grand Theatre of Havana.

Jam sessions, concerts in parks and theatres, workshops in arts schools and photographic exhibitions were some of the educational activities on the programme, which also included the broadcasting of a documentary on the history of jazz to more than 11,000 schools across the country and the screening of the documentary *Keep on Keepin' on*, hosted by the Director-General, Irina Bokova and the legendary Quincy Jones.

World renowned artists, such as UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador Herbie Hancock, Marcus Miller, Chucho Valdés, Bobby Carcassés and Esperanza Spalding, among others, participated in several activities of the programme, including the Global Concert, and exchanged with both established and up-and-coming national jazz artists.

The Director-General and the President of the Union of Writers and Artists of Cuba, Dr Miguel Barnet, brought the celebration to a close within the framework of the Global Concert, which featured stars from 14 countries under the artistic direction of Herbie Hancock and Chucho Valdés, with U.S. actor Will Smith as host and Quincy Jones as special guest.

For the first time in 2017, UNESCO Brussels with Flagey culture house and visit.Brussels joined efforts to jazz up Brussels with concerts, workshops and exhibitions for International Jazz Day. The week-end events included a concert of Afro-Cuban jazz organized with the Cuban Embassy attended by European Union partners and Embassies and more than 20 concerts across town to celebrate jazz. The event received attention from over 10 media outlets and 100,000 impressions on social media.

Participants: Some 15,000 in Havana, Cuba. **Audience:** Students, artists, intellectuals, young people, and public at large.

Press coverage: International Jazz Day 2017 was widely covered. More than 1,000 articles were monitored in April 2017, and some additional 200 in early May. More than 450 articles were published in the US, followed by Italy (105), Cuba (55), Russia (54), Canada, Mexico (52), Spain (49). 700 articles mentioned the All Stars concert in Havana; 135 journalists were accredited for the event in Havana.

Social media: On 'International Jazz Day' Facebook account, the video [International Jazz Day Global All-Star Concert](#) got 505 K views. As of 8 May, the Thelonious Monk Institute has received 1,871,221,390 media impressions about International Jazz Day, out of these, 1,163,817,321 include mentions of Havana being the Global Host City.

Le Bureau régional multisectoriel de l'UNESCO pour l'Afrique de l'Ouest (Sahel) à Dakar couvre tous les secteurs de programme : éducation, sciences naturelles, sciences sociales et humaines, culture et communication et information. Le bureau couvre sept pays : le Burkina Faso, le Cap-Vert, la Gambie, la Guinée-Bissau, le Mali, le Niger et le Sénégal. Outre la couverture représentationnelle et programmatique des pays de l'Afrique de l'Ouest, le bureau assure la coordination de certaines thématiques du programme d'éducation pour l'ensemble de l'Afrique subsaharienne. Il a aussi en charge l'appui des activités liées à la santé et au bien-être à l'école pour l'Afrique de l'Ouest et du Centre. L'UNESCO Dakar est particulièrement actif pour contribuer à l'opérationnalisation des objectifs de développement durable (ODD), notamment celui portant sur l'éducation (ODD4) « Education 2030 ». En outre, le bureau a œuvré à appuyer la réalisation de l'Agenda 2063 de l'Union Africaine, pour « une Afrique intégrée, prospère et pacifique, conduite par ses propres citoyens et représentant une force dynamique sur la scène mondial » en soutenant, de manière efficace, les États membres dans son champ d'action.










Geographical origin of visits (source: Google Analytics)



Traffic indicators explained:

1 Page views: The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

2 Visits (or sessions): A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

3 Visitors: A visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.






2.2. Statistics on articles referring to UNESCO

At Headquarters and abroad, UNESCO events were responsible for focusing significant additional attention on the Organization. The three featured events this month, the 201st Session of the Executive Board, World Book and Copyright Day and International Jazz Day, were all in the second half of April and clearly provided impetus for coverage that brought several peaks to a period of increased coverage. The Executive Board was a key factor and largely responsible for the two main peaks of activity in April. In particular, two issues were driving press interest: the Draft Decision on Occupied Palestine and the interviews for the post of Director-General. Additionally, World Book and Copyright Day brought another peak of reporting on the Organization on 24 April. International Jazz Day coverage was the third element in this trio of events that, when taken together, were responsible for keeping media interest high in UNESCO.

3. UNESCO Social Media Channels


In April 2017, UNESCO has achieved a few landmarks on Social Media. To begin with, several accounts have been officially verified. These include Instagram in Spanish and Russian, Vkontakte, and Twitter in Arabic and Russian. Finally, the total number of followers on UNESCO's Twitter accounts topped 3 million.

April has been marked by two major events on Social Media, World Book and Copyright Day and International Jazz Day. This year, one of the difficulties was that both celebrations fell on a Sunday, a fact that always plays against the popularity of these events on social media. Nonetheless, #DíaDelLibro, hashtag in Spanish for Book Day, was world trending topic for most part of the day. Actually, the most retweeted message and the most liked and shared post in April has been precisely about World Book and Copyright Day in Spanish (see details page 14). In addition, we asked our audiences about the book they were reading. This type of post aims specifically at increasing the audiences' engagement. The exercise worked particularly well in Spanish and in English.



For Int'l Jazz Day, the main lead was taken by 'International Jazz Day' account. However, UNESCO published a number of messages using quotes from famous jazz artists, which proved to be quite successful as they made it to the top 10 messages on both Twitter and Facebook accounts in English and Spanish.

Finally, this month UNESCO also started a 3 weeks long campaign focused on Press Freedom and the celebration of World Press Freedom Day (3 May). The full results of this coordinated effort with the CI sector will be fully analyzed in the May 2017 Visibility Report.




3.4. Content shared by UNESCO on Wikimedia

Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects receive some 15 billion page views per month from 500 million visitors in 285 languages. The websites are created by tens of thousands of volunteers working together with the aim of bringing free educational content to the world. As part of UNESCO's [Open Access Policy](#) it began to share content on Wikimedia projects in December 2014 to increase UNESCO's visibility and share educational content. UNESCO has uploaded around 1,000 media files to Wikimedia including photographs, videos and illustrations and made them available under a Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike IGO 3.0 license. The number of Wikipedia articles using UNESCO content has been growing over the past year and are now being used on 40 different language Wikipedias.

In April 2017 UNESCO media content (mainly images) received more than 1.7 million page views, showing a slight drop compared to March 2017 (-8%), but still a 185% increase compared to April 2016. This increase is due to the initial stages of work to import Open Access graphics from UNESCO publications into Wikimedia.

Since April 2016 UNESCO media content received over 12.4 million page views on Wikipedia. It is expected the usage and viewing figures of UNESCO content on Wikimedia projects will increase significantly as larger volumes of content will be added in the coming months.

In addition, the 2,700 images created as part of Wiki Loves Earth Biosphere Reserves received over 720,000 page views across 23 different language versions of Wikipedia in April 2017. Wiki Loves Earth Biosphere Reserves is a photography competition run by MAB as part of the international Wiki Loves Earth photography contest in May and June 2016.

Open Access text

Text from UNESCO Open Access publications and web pages has been used to create and improve Wikipedia articles. In total Wikipedia pages including UNESCO text have been used on 156 pages which received over 2 million page views in April 2017; this includes articles created using the [UNESCO Science Report](#), [The United Nations World Water Development Report 2016](#), [Rethinking Education. Towards a Global Common Good?](#) and the [World Network of Biosphere Reserve](#) description pages. [More information](#) on using UNESCO Open Access text on Wikipedia.

The UNESCO online repository of photos offers over 25 000 photos for free download. Subject matter spans all areas of activity of the Organization, including events at Headquarters and in the different regions of the World. Separate photobanks in the sectors are not tracked but also get significant downloads.

The **UNESDOC database** -managed by KMI/MSA Knowledge-Sharing & Open Access Unit - contains the full text and bibliographic records of documents and publications published by UNESCO since 1945 as well as bibliographic records of library acquisitions. These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.


In April 2017, there were **156 173** records available online in PDF format (**155 806** in March 2017), including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.






The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.

'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

After a steady growth in Top 10 viewing between January and March this year, April shows a slight decline. Views dropped this month by 14% and are 8% lower than last year same month. Spanish titles dominate again with 62% of downloads in this Top 10 list. The only English titles that remain very prominent this month are flagship reports, one previous, [Engineering: issues, challenges and opportunities for development; UNESCO report](#) and one more recent, the main [GEM Report, 2016](#).


In Spanish [Hacia las sociedades del conocimiento: informe mundial de la UNESCO](#) (Towards knowledge societies: UNESCO world report) is number two in the Top 10 list with more than 10,000 downloads. The publications page views on Google Books show a small increase this month, +1% compared with March this year and +5% compared to the same period last year. In the bookshop no one sector or theme stood out but online the [Bouba and Zaza](#) series and the [General History of Africa](#) collection (in French) both did well.

Breakdown of the 10 most viewed publications (PDF), by language of publication









9. UNESCO logo exposure


9.1. Patronage

Patronage is UNESCO's most prestigious form of moral support. It is granted to demonstrate UNESCO's endorsement of an activity organized under the responsibility of an external organization. UNESCO's patronage is granted to a range of activities, such as cinematographic and audiovisual productions, publications, meetings, conferences and cultural performances, award ceremonies, as well as a range of other events of regional and international scale. Information on patronage requests and their follow-up is recorded in a central database managed by ERI/DPI/PBM. The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.

10. Media and Communication Partnerships

UNESCO has partnership agreements with the media, such as newspaper companies (Asahi Shimbun / Japan, Dong-A Daily and The Chosun Ilbo / Korea) and TV networks (TBS / Japan). Memoranda of Understanding have been signed with major press agencies (Xinhua News Agency / People's Republic of China, Al Jazeera / Qatar). The general purpose of these partnerships is to enhance public awareness of our message and activities through written and audiovisual products where the name and logo of UNESCO is present.
