CALL TO ACTION

15 July 2015 marks the first commemoration of **World Youth Skills Day**. Adolescent *girls*' and boys' access to media and technology is necessary but not sufficient to ensure their understanding of their fundamental rights and their empowerment. By acquiring 21st Century competencies (knowledge, skills and attitude) young *girls* and boys will be better enabled to advocate against and avoid being exposed to atrocious crimes such as human trafficking and radicalization which are direct violation to their most fundamental rights. These competencies include *girls* and **boys** being media and information literate.

UNESCO and the Global Alliance on Media and Gender (GAMAG) call for partners to feature *women* on your homepage throughout the year 2015. Each month is dedicated to a theme and tackles critical areas of concern. The month of July focuses on "21st Century competencies for girls and boys".

21ST CENTURY COMPETENCIES FOR GIRLS AND BOYS

- Media and Information Literacy: skills to search, critically evaluate, use and contribute information and media content wisely; knowledge of one's rights online; understanding how to combat online hate speech and cyberbullying; understanding of the ethical issues surrounding the access and use of information; and engage with media and ICTs to promote equality, free expression, intercultural/interreligious dialogue, peace, etc.
- Intercultural Competencies: self-awareness/identity, seeing and feeling from other perspectives, knowledge of other cultures, relationship building, cultural humility and ability to adapt.
- Global Citizenship Competencies: knowledge and understanding of specific global issues and trends; knowledge of and respect for key universal values; problem-solving skills and decision-making; able and willing to launch and engage in proactive actions.
