The United Nations Educational, Science and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) hereby invite qualified individuals/companies to submit sealed tenders as follows:

Conceptual graphic design proposal for the development of a global online platform entitled "UNESCO World Atlas of Languages (UNESCO WAL)".

The UNESCO WAL aims to contribute to the safeguarding of the world's diverse linguistic, cultural and documentary heritage, in multiple languages, and reinforce the modalities for implementation of UNESCO's Recommendation concerning the Promotion of Universal Access and Multilingualism in Cyberspace (2003).

The WAL will be developed as a new version of the existing [UNESCO World Atlas of Languages in Danger](#). It will include a multi-tiered interactive platform, with inputs from: (i) the Global Task Force (GTF), (ii) International Consultative Committee (ICC), (iii) Global Institutional Network (GIN); and (iv) Language speaker communities.

It is expected that this online platform would nurture education, build new knowledge, encourage exchange of scientific results among higher educational institutions, libraries, archives and other public and private organizations, promote open access to scientific resources, and empower local communities to use their own languages in cyberspace.

The final delivery date is 30 November 2017.

Objectives and Scope

UNESCO is seeking proposals to prepare a conceptual graphic design for the development of a global online platform entitled “UNESCO World Atlas of Languages (UNESCO WAL)”. The proposal should be prepared in line with UNESCO’s [“Roadmap towards UNESCO’s World Atlas of Languages”](#).

The proposals shall contribute to achieving the platform’s main objectives, which are formulated around three axes:

- Enriching the current online platform, entitled *UNESCO Atlas of the World’s Languages in Danger*, to make it, as the *UNESCO World Atlas of Languages*, as a top resource for language preservation, monitoring, promotion, knowledge sharing on language-related issues, as well as an interactive tool for languages teaching and learning;
- Building professional and institutional capacities to nourish languages revitalization and documentation efforts through the use of multilingual web interfaces, the conception of new ICT tools, and by gathering collaborative contributions from involved stakeholders;
- Raising awareness among UNESCO’s Member States about the importance of linguistic diversity and multilingualism, particularly in the cyberspace, and securing extra-budgetary resources for the implementation of the global initiative.

The major expected output/deliverable is a comprehensive conceptual graphic design proposal, including all technical elements such as all source files with necessary images, scripts, style sheets ready to be displayed on the web browser for the technical development of the above-mentioned platform.

Expected Procurement Components

For the implementation, UNESCO will:

- Provide “raw materials”, including a draft structure of the platform which will be used to define main sections, subsections and specific language window as well as survey template.
- Organize a meeting to consult experts working in the subject area.
- Collaborate and contribute to the peer review of the proposal, and validate the proposed conceptual design
- Carry out a user testing on the proposed conceptual design.

For the implementation, the Implementer might include in its team the following specialists:

- Graphic designer
- Web cartographer
- Web developer
- Artist

- Academic background in visual art studies and web design (minimum BA degree);
- Minimum five year experience in graphic design industry;
- Reference list and visual examples demonstrating qualifications and experience as well information about previous projects for participation in this possible upcoming solicitation process;
- Curriculum Vitae in English;
- Contact information including full name and address, country, telephone and fax numbers, e-mail address, website and contact person.

For institutional entities:

- Brief presentation of your institution including number of staff, turnover, years in business;
- Reference list and visual examples demonstrating qualifications for participating in this possible upcoming solicitation process;
- At least two CVs of staff to be involved demonstrating academic background in visual art studies and web design (minimum BA degree);
- Contact information (full name and address, country, telephone and fax numbers, e-mail address, website and contact person).

Interested candidates should send to UNESCO by 7 May 2017:

- Letter expressing their interest and motivation for carrying out this work (not more than 4 pages);
- Proposal for the conceptual graphic design of the global online platform entitled “UNESCO World Atlas of Languages (UNESCO WAL)” which could serve as a basis for further elaboration; and

- Financial proposal – quotation regarding the fees to carry out the work using recommended annexed form (see Annex I), including a provisional timeline.

The purpose of this notice is to provide general information on the requirements for the procurement process and to inform interested suppliers how to obtain a copy of the Solicitation Documents.

Interested companies who wish to participate in the OIC must request for a complete set of Solicitation Documents, available free of charge, from UNESCO contact person at the address shown below.

The sealed tenders must be delivered to the **UNESCO Headquarters in Paris** on or before **07/05/2017 at 18:00 hours**, in strict compliance with the instructions as stipulated in the Solicitation Documents.

Any amendments or clarifications will be communicated directly to all Bidders who have requested for a complete set of solicitation documents and officially confirmed their intention to submit a sealed tender. No remuneration will be made to companies for preparation and submission of their tenders.
