The Danish National commission for UNESCO and the following organizations: the Danish Cultural Institute, Live Music in Schools, the Danish Broadcasting Corporation, the Network for Children and Culture, The Academy of Music of Southern Denmark, and Schools in and Muncipalities of Århus, Morsø, Guldborgsund, Helsingør, in partnership with the Secretariat of Culture in the Municipality of Rio de Janeiro, Segundo Turno Cultural in Brazil are working on the CICLO project, an international pilot exploring new ways to implement the 3 goals of the Seoul Agenda. Students around age of 12 from 10 classes in Denmark and Rio de Janeiro participate in this project from April to the end of May 2012 in order to reflect on the creation of sound and musical expressions; by imagining how would be the sounds in the future, 20 years ahead – inspired by the intentions of Rio+20. The results are presented in the involved cities during performances. The students in Denmark and Brazil can also share the results and their feelings about this project via uploads on the Internet.
