Executive Summary

Disclaimer: The objective of the Executive Summary is to highlight the key salient issues and not to provide a comprehensive coverage of all topics discussed in the report.

Media and Major Events

The inauguration of the first International Jazz Day and the celebrations for World Book and Copyright Day resulted in excellent coverage for UNESCO in world media during April.

Three other stories also drew major media attention for UNESCO: the takeover by Ansar Dine rebels of Timbuktu, a World Heritage city in Mali; the protection now accorded to the wreck of the Titanic by UNESCO's Underwater Heritage Convention, which covers wrecks and sites underwater for 100 years or more; and the earthquake off the coast of Banda Aceh in Indonesia, which triggered considerable interest in the Indian Ocean Tsunami Warning System, coordinated by UNESCO/IOC.

Coverage was most dense in China, North America and France, followed by Turkey and Saudi Arabia. However, the most noticeable data comes from Asia and Africa, and shows a 68 percent increase in coverage of UNESCO over the preceding month. This is largely attributed to the tsunami story and First Africa STI Forum in Nairobi in early April, which was attended by the Director-General.

With more than 4,500 articles, Asian media outlets published the most articles mentioning UNESCO, followed closely by Europe and then North America.




After particularly high traffic in March, April traffic was slightly lower although still the second highest for 2012. The peak in visits was reached on World Book and Copyright Day, April 23, with over 91,000 visits.

A significant increase in visits was expected for International Jazz Day, but its success had to be shared with the websites of radio TSF Jazz -particularly followed by Jazz fans-, and Arte Live Web which also broadcast the evening concert taking place at UNESCO Headquarters.









Most of April was spent preparing for International Jazz Day, at the end of the month. While traffic on social media was consistent throughout the month, it exploded in the days leading up to the April 27 Paris concert and in the days following the April 30 NY concert. International Jazz Day was positive news that broke existing social media records, previously held by the not-so-positive media attention as a result of the Palestine vote.

April saw the official launch of UNESCO's Google+ page (www.plus.ly/unesco, now the 2nd biggest in the UN system, next to the UN) and its first ever mobile app-based photo-sharing account, Instagram which UNESCO is perhaps the only UN agency to actively involve in its communications. The app allows users to instantly add special color filtering effects to the photos they take with their mobile cameras (similar to Photoshop integrated into the phone) and to share them. For communication purposes, these special effects enable to color photos with subjectivity, and provide a much-needed and refreshing respite from the quasi-scientific images that are overwhelmingly used to illustrate many of UNESCO programmes, like World Heritage. The 5 photos of World Heritage posted so far on Instagram, featuring monuments on the Paris Seine and Brasilia, got us 300 followers within days, and enthusiastic comments for each posting. Promotions of Instagram on our Facebook and Twitter were greeted with equally enthusiastic feedback that presage a bright future for this tool. With a 16.44% increase of followers this month, Twitter has the most significant increase since January 2012 (see 2nd graph to the right).


UNESCO Publications


After a high peak in March April saw a significant drop in on-line PDF viewing, down by some 47,000 views. The number of consultations of publications on Google Books continues to grow doubling the number of book visits of April 2011 (see graph to the right). All titles except one in the top downloads are in Spanish or Portuguese only one of which is recent, with the number one position being held by a Spanish title which is 20 years-old.


For sales of publications, World Heritage titles continue to perform well in the bookshop. On-line the Bouba and Zaza collection did very well in April.


UNESCO Visits

April 2012 marked the 2nd time that the Visitors Service received more than 1.000 visitors/month over the past year. This significant increase can be attributed to a high number of requests made internally. 358 visitors or 33% of total visitors came on behalf of a Delegation or UNESCO sector. As an example, this month, the Delegation of Ukraine welcomed a total of 95 visitors and the Education Sector held 3 visit-conferences for a total of 68 visitors.









Major events:

I. First Africa Forum on STI for Youth Employment, Human Capital Development and Inclusive Growth (1-3 April 2012)

The First Africa Forum on Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) for Youth Employment, Human Capital Development and Inclusive Growth took place in Nairobi, Kenya from 1 to 3 April 2012. Hosted by the Kenyan Government, it was organized jointly by UNESCO, the African Development Bank, the African Union Commission, the UN Economic Commission for Africa, in collaboration with the Association for the Development of Education in Africa (ADEA). The Forum consisted of a two-day experts meeting followed by a high-level one-day Ministerial Conference.

Its key objectives were to facilitate the sharing of experiences and analysis of best practices in strengthening STI mechanisms, designing policy measures for the promotion of innovation, entrepreneurship, youth employment, harnessing the role of innovation in the informal sector, and increasing the participation of women and youth in STI. Moreover, the ministerial segment aimed to engage the African ministers in a dialogue with experts on the use of and investment in STI for development, as well as to encourage them to make a political commitment for the integration of STI in national and regional development agendas.

The main result of the Forum was the adoption of the "Nairobi Declaration" wherein ministers committed to strengthen scientific research in Africa through the promotion of scientific networks and collaborative research at the national, regional and intra-regional levels. It also announced further support to higher educational institutions and research institutes by developing instruments, policies and reforms, as well as setting appropriate funding mechanisms to generate knowledge and develop entrepreneurship.

The Forum was covered by Kenyan Broadcast Corporation. It was also web-cast, in particular through You Tube. Interviews were broadcast on TV channels and radio stations.

Press coverage:

All told, UNESCO's involvement in First Africa Forum on STI netted approximately 61 articles in the international media. The coverage was understandably concentrated in Africa (29 articles), followed closely by Europe (22), and North America (11), while Asian news agencies only published two articles on the subject. South America, the Middle East and Australia/Oceania publications, on the other hand, have devoted comparatively little attention to the forum. In covering the First Africa Forum on STI, the majority of news outlets cited UNESCO as the primary instigator of the event, despite the presence of the African Development Bank (AfDB), African Union Commission (AU) and the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA). The presence of the Director-General, who was received by Kenyan president Mwai Kibaki, contributed to the positive coverage of this event.

Social media:

5 messages about STIs, especially as they regard African youth, were disseminated on all UNESCO Twitter accounts. Messaging efforts aimed at advocating the general public to take greater interest in STIs, academically and professionally, given their importance in economic development. With tweets averaging 14 retweets, performance was surprisingly good for a topic that is not exactly mass-market.

Most retweets seemed to come from forum participants, attesting to the success of our on-site marketing actions at the event venue. UNESCO worked closely with ADEA to encourage participants to share and advocate among their personal/professional networks the importance of STIs. Computers were made available to participants and posters were put up inciting people to tweet using #AfricaFuture in strategic places at the venue. With ADEA, a content marketing scheme was worked out to promote UNESCO's work and social media channels in the ADEA webzine distributed to all event participants.

In the April 23 debrief on the communications plan with ADEA, all parties agreed that social media campaign went well, and optimized message dissemination by addressing first the core audience of event participants.

II. World Book and Copyright Day (23 April 2012)

This year, the 17th edition of the World Book and Copyright Day focused on translation, to mark the 80th Anniversary of the Index Translationum. Created by the League of Nations in 1932 and taken over by UNESCO in 1948, this international bibliography of translation is the oldest programme of UNESCO. With 4,000,000 data and 5,000 visitors per month, the Index Translationum is among the biggest statistical resources of UNESCO and represents a unique tool for monitoring worldwide translation flows. This is also a source for decision makers of the book industry and the cultural policies field.

On this occasion, the Culture Sector, in collaboration with the Permanent Delegations of Germany, France, Poland, and Great-Britain and Northern Ireland, organised a debate on 23 April at UNESCO HQ, which focused on the utility and future of the Index Translationum. Francesco Bandarin ADG/CLT and Matthews Sudders, Ambassador, Permanent Delegate of Great-Britain and Northern Ireland for UNESCO, opened the event.

After introducing the history of the Index Translationum (M. Tukaj UNESCO/Index Translationum), several users spoke on the utility of this database for their research and activities: M. Bustamente and C. Balayer (EHESS), G. Glasson Deschaumes (CNRS), P. de Sinety (Institut Français), T. Szubiakiewicz (National Library of Poland), A.T. Khatchadourian (Transeuropéennes), C. Mathieu (INALCO), H. Kim (Ahnkook Foundation, South Korea) and M. Rosi (UNESCO). The presentations were followed by a discussion on the possibilities, the limits and the future of the Index Translationum. Alain Godonou, Director CLT/DDD, delivered the final word.

Press coverage:

During the month of April, World Book and Copyright Day garnered more than 514 articles worldwide. While considerable attention was paid to the Day in Spanish-speaking countries-Argentina (24 articles), Peru (11) and Spain (36)-World Book and Copyright Day enjoyed major coverage in the United States (62 articles), China (42) and Sweden (27).

Social media:

For World Book and Copyright Day, UNESCO debuted a social media partnership with the World Digital Library, which curated a Facebook photo gallery called "A look at the first books". Here's the premise: "Unsurprisingly, the first books tended to be religious texts or maps. On April 23, the World Digital Library, that UNESCO helped create to preserve our documentary heritage, offers us a look at its collection". The gallery received an impressive 185 likes, with 66 shares, or 36% share rate that is markedly higher than UNESCO's standard 25%. The World Digital Library and UNESCO retweeted each other's messages from April 22-24; audience interest was at respectable, averaging 20 retweets per message.

Brasilia Office: Facebook: 9 posts / 57 likes / 50 shares; Twitter: 9 tweets / 17 retweets. To celebrate the Day, the Office <u>partnered with NGO T Bone</u> (a butchery that supports cultural promotion) and implemented a campaign to promote reading, which involved public libraries. Statements and interviews answering the question: "Why is reading important to you?" were collected and were posted on social networks. The Office donated 100 books to four public and school libraries to enrich the project.

III. International Jazz Day (30 April 2012)

In November 2011, during the UNESCO General Conference, 30 April was proclaimed "International Jazz Day". Celebrating this important international art form is intended to promote dialogue among cultures, peace, diversity, and respect for human rights and human dignity, as well as to eradicate discrimination, promote freedom of expression, foster gender equality, and reinforce the role of youth for social change.

UNESCO partnered with The Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz, chaired by UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador Herbie Hancock, to organize three flagship events. On 27 April 2012, at the UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, International Jazz Day was officially launched with a full day of celebrations, featuring an opening statement by Director-General Irina Bokova. Over 80 artists from around the world contributed their time and talent to make the International Jazz Day launch in Paris a tremendous success. The Day's activities included Master Classes with jazz luminaries Marcus Miller, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Hugh Masekela, and others; round table discussions; live performances; photo exhibitions; and movie screenings. The events culminated in an exciting evening concert, where the Director-General, Goodwill Ambassador Hancock and US Permanent Delegate to UNESCO, Ambassador David Killion set the stage with a series of powerful statements about the impact and legacy of jazz throughout history. The audience was then treated to stellar performances by Barbara Hendricks, George Benson, Igor Butman, Manu Katche, and many more.

Three days later, on 30 April, a sunrise concert was held in New Orleans, Louisiana, considered by many to be the 'birthplace' of jazz. The Director-General gave a statement, and Herbie Hancock performed his trademark tune, 'Watermelon Man' via satellite with students around the world. Finally, the Day closed out with an evening performance in the United Nations General Assembly Hall in NY. Jointly organized by UNESCO, the Thelonious Monk Institute, and the US Mission to the United Nations, the concert featured a series of performances by true jazz legends, including Stevie Wonder, Tony Bennett, Chaka Khan, Angelique Kidjo, Lionel Loueke, and many others. The event was co-hosted by Michael Douglas, Robert De Niro, Quincy Jones, and Morgan Freeman.

The Day was truly a global phenomenon, with countries all over the world, representing every continent and every region, organizing activities. Full details about the various events, including the activities organized by partners around the world, can be found on the official <u>UNESCO International Jazz Day website</u>.

Press coverage:

With 3 main events in New York, Paris and New Orleans, and 42 others held around the globe, the first International Jazz Day enjoyed enormous media coverage around the world. At Headquarters, 70 journalists were accredited. Renowned outlets published articles concerning the event, including the Wall Street Journal, International Herald Tribune, Huffington Post, Los Angeles Times, Seattle Times, New York Times (United States), Sydney Morning Herald (Australia), Montreal Gazette, Ottawa Citizen (Canada), France24 (France), Times of India (India), Malaysia Star (Malaysia), Independent Online, Trinidad News, Albany Times Union, Agences France Presse, et al.

In all, more than 2,055 articles were published on the subject of International Jazz Day and UNESCO's involvement in the events. This exposure was helped by an International Jazz Day webcast and by broadcasts from Arte, TSF Jazz and PBS, all of which extensively covered the Day.

The United States accounted for the majority of coverage with over 1,286 articles. The rest came predominantly from Canada (143 articles), Mexico (92), France (79), Spain (53), Russia (39), Ukraine (17), Australia (16) and Italy (15). Articles peaked over the last weekend in April and the first week in May.

Social media:

For social media, International Jazz Day involved 2 different campaigns: one for the April 27 Paris concert and another for the April 30th NY concert.

Overall, Intl Jazz Day was positive news that broke existing social media records, previously held by the not-so-positive media attention we got as a result of the Palestine vote. In all, we cumulated roughly 1,700 new Twitter followers on @unescoNOW and 2,600 new likes on Facebook. The hashtag #DiadelJazz trended in Spain and Latin America on April 30; @unesco_es cumulated 986 new followers between April 27 and April 30 as a result.

Social media is content-driven, so it led a few web content initiatives to ensure success of our messaging efforts:

- In the 140 character world of social media, slogans ("All that jazz points to peace") and pitches were worked out that all emphasize the link between jazz and peace, or jazz as the promise of a universal language transcending borders and hence the symbol of universals, like human rights & equality.
- "Exclusive Interviews" with a healthy selection of Paris concert performers were prepared. Each interview
 webpage was conceived as an advertisement to encourage jazz stars to publicize their interviews on their own
 web and social media.
- Social media attempted to foreground the contributions of non-Anglo-American jazz artists, such as a Skype interview with Danilo Perez in Spanish
- Coordination with performers for the Paris concert, official media partners (like TSF Jazz) and UN agencies (the UN HQ & UN Radio) to spread and amplify the jazz messages.
- Launch of 3 new chat initiatives for UNESCO
- The 1st ever Google Hangout dedicated to our <u>Google Hackathon</u>:. This Hangout marks the official launch of UNESCO's Google Plus account at www.plus.ly/unesco.
- A social TV type of live international chat organized by the US State Dept for the NY concert, and which has the
 distinction of being the first social media event where our DG was able to field audience questions about jazz


Both a communication and a knowledge management tool, UNESCO's websites, with over 2.7 million pages of content, are today a key component of its public information strategy. Maintained by Corporate Web Services in close collaboration with the Programme Sectors, the main site is updated continually in all 6 UN languages (with some subportals also in Portuguese, Vietnamese, et al).

Web traffic shown here (page views, visits, visitors, country and language of visit, etc) has been measured since September 2011 with the free Google Analytics toolset via tags embedded in pages. 

¹ Page views: The page view is the most widely used indicator to reflect the level of traffic to a website. A page view is counted when the page requested by the user is loaded into the internet browser. Note: Page views are very different from the outdated concept of 'hits'. A 'hit' is counted for each of the many elements in a Web page (i.e. image, animation or video are all counted as separate 'hits', while a page view counts all elements on a page as one page view).

² Visits: A visit is defined as a series of page requests from the same uniquely identified client with a time of no more than 30 minutes between each page request.

³ Visitors: A Visitor counts once within the timescale of 30 minutes. A visitor can make multiple visits. Identification is made to the visitor's computer, not the person, usually via cookie and/or IP+User Agent. Thus the same person visiting from two different computers will count as two Visitors.



This graph shows the number of articles monitored in national and international media, in which "UNESCO" appeared in the title or first paragraph of a story in April (Source: Meltwater News)




The inauguration of the first International Jazz Day and the celebrations for World Book and Copyright Day resulted in excellent coverage for UNESCO in world media during April.

Three other stories also drew major media attention for UNESCO: the takeover by Ansar Dine rebels of Timbuktu, a World Heritage city in Mali; the protection now accorded to the wreck of the Titanic by UNESCO's Underwater Heritage Convention, which covers wrecks and sites underwater for 100 years or more; and the earthquake off the coast of Banda Aceh in Indonesia, which triggered considerable interest in the Indian Ocean Tsunami Warning System, coordinated by UNESCO/IOC.

Coverage was most dense in China, North America and France, followed by Turkey and Saudi Arabia. However, the most noticeable data comes from Asia and Africa, and shows a 68 percent increase in coverage of UNESCO over the preceding month. This is largely attributed to the tsunami story and First Africa STI Forum in Nairobi in early April, which was attended by the Director-General.

With more than 4,500 articles, Asian media outlets published the most articles mentioning UNESCO, followed closely by Europe and then North America.



3. UNESCO Social Media Channels

Most of April was spent preparing for International Jazz Day, at the end of the month. While traffic on social media was consistent throughout the month, it exploded in the days leading up to the April 27 Paris concert and in the days following the April 30 NY concert. International Jazz Day was positive news that broke existing social media records, previously held by the not-so-positive media attention as a result of the Palestine vote. Results could however have been doubled e.g. with the assistance of the NY Office, if the biggest stars playing in NY with social media followings reflecting their stature could have been contacted, with a deeper brand integration with the IJD partner, or the use of the new crowdsourcing tool to get jazz clubs worldwide to post their celebrations.

April saw the official launch of UNESCO's Google+ page (<u>www.plus.ly/unesco</u>, now the 2nd biggest in the UN system, next to the UN) and its first ever mobile app-based photo-sharing account, Instagram which UNESCO is perhaps the only UN agency to actively involve in its communications. The app allows users to instantly add special color filtering effects to the photos they take with their mobile cameras (similar to Photoshop integrated into the phone) and to share them. For communication purposes, these special effects enable to color photos with subjectivity, and provide a much-needed and refreshing respite from the quasi-scientific images that are overwhelmingly used to illustrate many of UNESCO programmes, like World Heritage. To start the Instagram initiative, ERI/WEB is working with certain field offices to get them to Instagram the World Heritage sites in their cities (often right next to their offices). The goal is to show our commitment to the places where our field offices are present in, and to visually interpret, rather than just present, from an "insider's eye" our appreciation for aspects of the sites that we protect. The 5 photos of World Heritage posted so far on Instagram, featuring monuments on the Paris Seine and Brasilia, got us 300 followers within days, and enthusiastic comments for each posting. Promotions of Instagram on our Facebook and Twitter were greeted with equally enthusiastic feedback that presage a bright future for this tool.



The UNESCO online repository of photos offers over 25 000 photos for free download. Subject matter spans all areas of activity of the Organization, including events at Headquarters and in the different regions of the World. Separate photobanks in the sectors are not tracked but also get significant downloads.

The **UNESDOC** database – managed by MSS/BKI Clearing House - contains the full text and bibliographic records of documents and publications published by UNESCO since 1945 as well as bibliographic records of library acquisitions. These documents and publications are produced by UNESCO Headquarters, UNESCO Offices and Institutes and cover all areas of its activities: education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, communication and information. An application has been specially developed for conducting the statistical consultation of electronic files (PDFs) from 1 January 2006.


In April there were **131 609** records available online in PDF format (131 449 in March), including documents, publications, communication material and other working documents.




The UNESCO Library collections offer an overview of the Organization's current and past activities and programmes as recorded in print publications and other resources.


'UNESCO publications' cover the output of the programmes of the Organization and feature in the biennial Publications Plan. They are produced in a variety of formats (books, CD-ROMs, ebooks, etc.) and are classified into different categories (global and regional reports, monographs, reviews, technical studies, atlases, etc.). They are distributed for free via UNESCO's networks and on-line, or as sales products under the 'UNESCO Publishing' imprint.

After a high peak in March April saw a significant drop in on-line PDF viewing, down by some 47,000 views. The number of consultations of publications on Google Books continues to grow doubling the number of book visits of April 2011. All titles except one in the top downloads are in Spanish or Portuguese only one of which is recent, with the number one position being held by a Spanish title which is 20 years-old.

For sales of publications, World Heritage titles continue to perform well in the bookshop. On-line the Bouba and Zaza collection did very well in April.





Since 1948, *The Courier* is the UNESCO flagship periodical. The magazine has changed a great deal over the years, both in content and in form, but it pursues its original mission: promote UNESCO's ideals, maintain a platform for the dialogue between cultures and provide a forum for international debate.

Presently, it is a quarterly 56 pages magazine published in the 6 official languages. The PDF is available on *The UNESCO Courier* website, and sent by e-mail to the subscribers. The printed version is sent to the Member States/Partners mailing list.

In April, a special issue on Jazz has been published in French (1 500 copies) and distributed at the first celebration of the International Jazz Day at UNESCO Headquarters.

Courier web pages have been created in three languages (English, French and Spanish) for: World Book and Copyright Day; Index Translationum; Nelson Mandela; Underwater Cultural Heritage; Music; and Jazz. These web pages contain a big number of archived articles on the relevant subjects, as well as several new articles, such as "Mandela: reading The Courier on Robben Island", "The Antikythera mechanism, ancestor of the computer", "The Index Translationum and the sociology of translation", "Interview with Herbie Hancock: the roots of jazz are in humanity".





The database is updated daily and shared with the focal points for UNESCO name and logo use of each Sector.
