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The Education sector continued to be very active throughout 2009. A Brief mention of the activities we supported will follow.

2009 began with the 2nd conference on Early Childhood Education on 17-18/01/2009 which took place in collaboration with Oatar University, It offered both practitioners and academics to reflect, discuss and debate past experiences and current issues at hand. ECCE (Early Childhood Care and Education) remains an important part of the EFA, and this was reflected in the series of conferences where important ECCE issues were tackled and debated including the enabling environment, the various tools for developing young children's literacy, the role of media in the linguistic development of Arab children as children with dual language literacy.

In keeping with our ever changing times, on the 15th February of 2009 a **training workshop for enhancing teachers' ICT capacity building** on the utilization of modern technology in teaching took place in Riyadh in a joint effort between the Culture and Education sectors of the Doha Office. The opportunity was also taken to review and enhance the role of educational institutions and faculties in Saudi Arabia.

The Education for All Mid-Term Review Conference for the Arab Region took place in Doha from 19 to 21 February 2009. Organized jointly by UNESCO and Qatar Foundation, the Conference was inaugurated by His Excellency Abdulla bin Hamad Al Attiyah, Deputy Prime Minister, Koichiro Matsuura, Director General of UNESCO and Abdulla bin Ali Al-Thani Conference Chairperson. More than 145 participants from the Arab States, International and regional organizations and agencies, NGOs, the private sector and UNESCO staff attended the Conference. UNESCO Offices in Beirut and Doha coordinated in the provision of technical and logistical support to the Conference.

Between the **20-26th of April**, the Doha Office provided support to Oatar National Commission to mark EFA week by UNESCO Associated Schools in Oatar. Celebrations under the theme **"Open Books – Open Doors"** took place throughout the week The events comprised art exhibitions, lectures and seminars, researches on literacy in the Arab world and publication of flyers. Numerous articles were published in local newspapers.

Following the event in Doha, the **regional experts' meeting** on the **development of secondary education in the Arab region** was organized in Muscat, Oman from the **26th till the 28th of April**. This was organized in conjunction with the Beirut office, the Oman national Commission., and with the collaboration of IBE Geneva and the Bangkok office. This resulted in the attendance of a large number of experts both from the Arab region as well as

internationally. The main reason for the meeting was to promote the exchange of regional and international experiences on reforms in secondary education, while taking stock of the major achievements in the region in the field of secondary education in relation to new initiatives and projects. This was then finalized with discussions regarding the feasibility of implementing a regional project which focuses on studies, research and policy development to enhance secondary education in the Arab region.

The role of Arab NGO's was not forgotten in all of this as a sub-regional workshop was supported in Cairo in April, with a view to enhancing their role in achieving Education for All.

With a continued view on enhancing programme delivery and monitoring, the Gulf Cooperation Council Countries Consultative Meeting on enhancing capacitybuilding in areas related to the work of the UNESCO Institute for Statistics took place on 28 June 2009 in Doha. The meeting was initiated by the Qatar Statistical Authority and Doha Office with the support and collaboration of the UNESCO Institute of Statistics. The meeting reviewed the status of the GCC regarding UIS data collection and analyzed data collection systems and problems faced by the countries of the Doha cluster. A draft two year work plan to enhance capacities of GCC statistical authorities was produced. The meeting was followed by a training Workshop on the Revised UNESCO 2009 Framework for Cultural Statistics on 29th and 30th June 2009.


After all that work, yet another training session was held, but this time it was for the benefit of UNESCO education staff from Africa to the Asia-Pacific region, and the topic was educational planning. The training was hosted and held by the Regional Centre for Educational Planning in Sharjah during the month of July 2009 and it had been co-organized by UNESCO's own International Institute for Educational Planning and the education sector.

With the summer finished, and with the fall in temperatures, the office, in cooperation with the UNESCO Institute of Statistics prepared a training workshop in education statistics from the 24-28 of October in the mountain town of Abha in Saudi Arabia. Staff members were given the opportunity to learn about collection, processing and dissemination of educational statistical data. This was done by reviewing national experiences as well as examining the relations between the education and development indicators such as those from the Millennium Development Goals and Education For All goals.

Finally at the end of the year the attention was turned to the UNESCO National Education Support Strategy reports for Oman, Oatar and Bahrain were drafted and finalized.

A lot of the time was consumed with planning for 2010/11, as well as reporting and closing of activities in 2008/09. This had the effect of helping us cut carbon emissions by reducing the amount of missions we had to go on and therefore flights between October and January. Despite this, the period saw significant enhancement of our activities in Bahrain and Kuwait.

Germany, Bonn, 31 March - 2 April:" Ms. Deena Al Abdulla presented the Arab Recycling Initiative of the UNESCO Doha Office during the UNESCO Conference on Education for Sustainable Development, Half-Term Review". Our project was one out of five that was selected from the Arab Region.

7. Develop a flyer on the economic benefits that come from biosphere reserves, geoparks, world heritage sites, and Ramsar sites.

8. Planning meeting of Gulf Arab partners in IOCIN-DIO, the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission in the Indian Region.

COMMUNICATION AND INFORMA-TION SECTOR ACTIVITIES: 2008-2009

A series of "Information for All" workshops were organized by UNESCO Doha:

8-11/Nov/2008, in Muscat, Oman, participants from all Arab Gulf countries participated in the workshop, the workshop aimed promotion of Documentary and Archival System and Information for All, information Accessibility, document preservation, right to access information, places to access information and services provided to users of archives as well as Internet accessibility to archives, and copyright of archives.

16-19/Nov/2008, in Kuwait, participants from all Arab Gulf countries participated in the workshop, the workshop aimed to **Promote of Information Technology**, Information for All, as well as information Ethics and Information Accessibility

There was also an ICT Teachers Capacity Building workshop, organized on the period 16-18 Feb 2009, in Jeddah – Saudi Arabia, with education and ICT specialists from all Arab Gulf countries in the workshop. This workshop explored utilizing Information technology as a tool, in teaching, and methods of enhancing and improving teaching tools for teachers.

With a view to improving the capacity of media institutes, a contract has been signed with AL Jazeera Training Center to develop Media Curricula for the Arabic speaking media training centers in the Arab Gulf region, which is developed, and will be implemented by 2010.

To support the continued development of media a network is being developed beginning with a media database, which will contain most of the media institutes, training institutes, and key media organizations in the Arab region. Phase I of this project, which is data collection, and organization, has been finalized, and we are now in the process of implementing Phase II this year, in which we will launch a Web page, that will contain all the collected information, which will be accessible by the public.

Freedom of Expression Conference, organized with Liberties and Human Rights Affairs Department, at Al-Jazeera Network, located at Oatar, on 25-26 October, 2009. More than 40 media specialists from all Arab countries participated.

Our largest event by far was the World Press Freedom Day 2009, which was held in Doha (Oatar) on 2 and 3 May, titled "**Dialogue, mutual understanding and recon**- **ciliation**[®] during which media professionals from around the world discussed:

- The capacity of the media for intercultural dialogue and mutual understanding;
- The need to establish ethical and professional standards in order to build models of accountability as well as effective self regulation for journalists;
- What specific place for media in promoting interreligious dialogue and mutual understanding?
- Media and enhancing dialogue as a tool for empowering citizens.

The conference has been organized under the patronage of Her Highness Sheikha Mozah Bint Nasser Al-Missned, consort of His Highness the Emir of Oatar Shiekh Hamad Bin Khalifa Al Thani.

During the conference, Koichiro Matsuura presented the 2009 World Press Freedom Prize, awarded posthumously to murdered Sri Lankan journalist Lasantha Wickrematunge. Mr Wickrematunge's niece, Natalie Samarasinghe accepted the prize, which is supported by the Ottaway and Cano foundations and JP/Politiken Newspaper LTD.
