PART 5. GLOSSARY

Gross enrolment rate: Number of students enrolled in a given level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the official school-age population corresponding to the same level of education.

Net enrolment rate: Total number of students in the theoretical age group for a given level of education enrolled in that level, expressed as a percentage of the total population in that age group.

Recurrent expenditure: Recurrent expenditure includes all inputs that have to be provided regularly (usually on an annual basis), such as personnel costs (salaries and related costs) and non-personnel costs (supplies, utilities, operation costs, teaching and learning materials, laboratory materials, maintenance and small repairs).

Capital expenditure: Expenditure for education goods or assets that yield benefits for a period of more than one year. It includes expenditure for construction, renovation and major repairs of buildings and the purchase of heavy equipment or vehicles. It represents the value of assets acquired or created – i.e. the amount of capital formation – during the year in which the expenditure occurs.
