UNEVOC Centre at Beijing Union University Conducted Teacher Development Program in Tibet China



On August 8-10, UNEVOC Centre at Beijing Union University together with enterprises such as Google Inc. jointly conducted a teacher development program on "Educational informatization promoting teaching reform and innovation" to over sixty primary and secondary school teachers in Lhasa, Tibet, aiming to enhance these teachers' information technology capacity. He Jingping, vice mayor of the Duilongdeqing District Government in

Lhasa, Prof. Bao Hong, vice president of Beijing Union University and head of UNEVOC Centre at Beijing Union University, associate Prof. Sheng Hongyu, secretary-general of the Centre, and Prof. He Fang, coordinator of the Centre, attended the opening ceremony.

Prof. Bao Hong pointed out in his speech that Beijing Union University would be readily willing to help promote the educational development and accelerate the integration of information technology and education in Lhasa, since Chaoyang District, in which Beijing Union University is located, and Duilongdeqing District in Lhasa are corresponding support districts.
