**2001 UNESCO** Executive Board invited the Director-General to support ad hoc efforts with Member States as appropriate

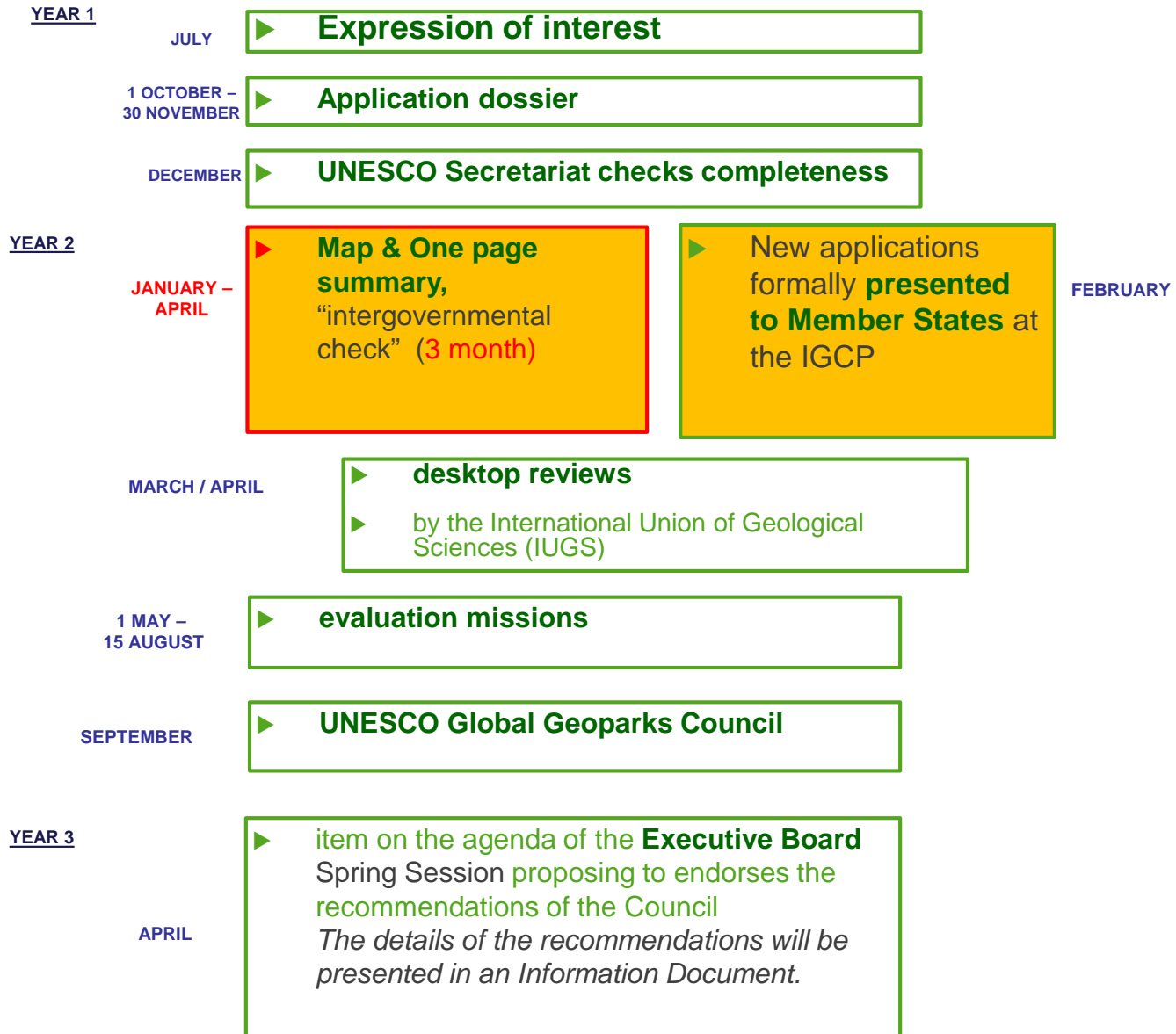
**2015 UNESCO** General Conference, approval of the International Geoscience and Geoparks Programme all Geoparks of the Global Geoparks Network receive the **label**

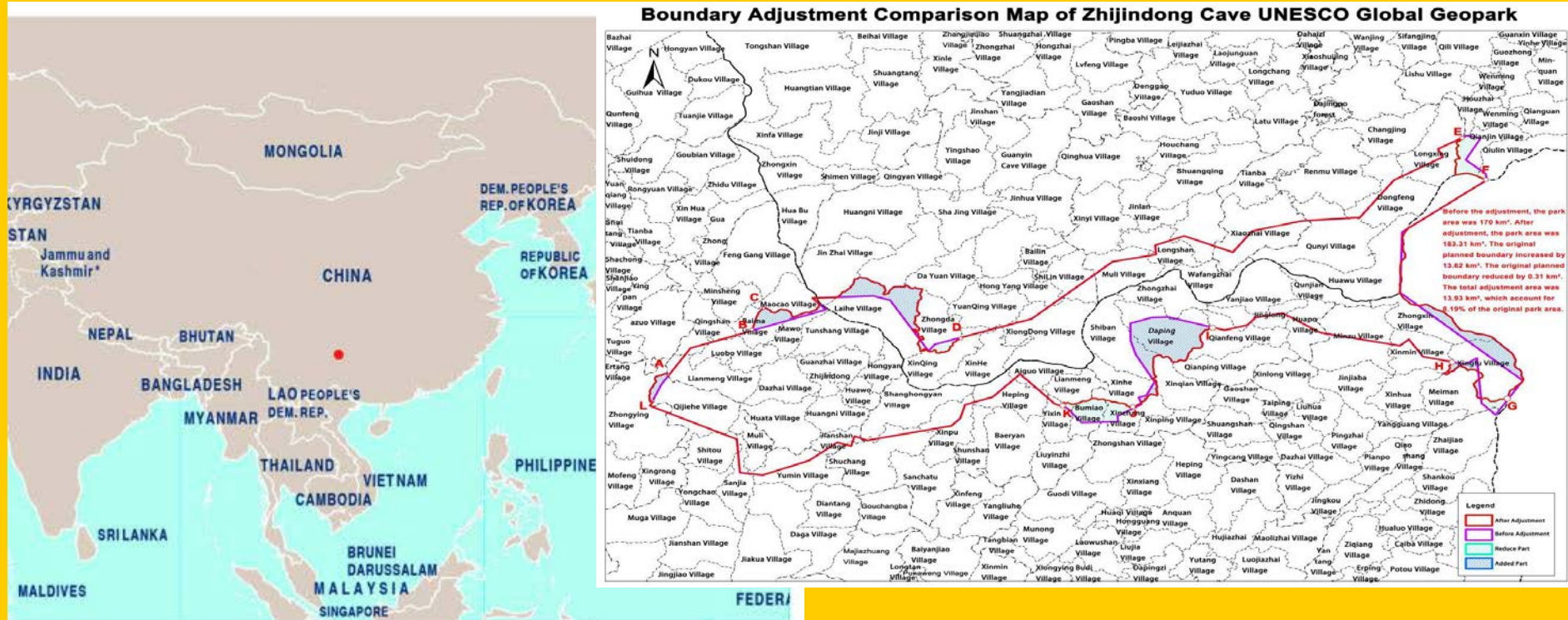
