AN ACT to provide for the incorporation of the trustees of the Rural Development Centre of Rose Hall, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.

[5th December, 1989]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Assembly of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Rural Development Centre of Rose Hall Incorporation Act, 1989.

Short title

2. In this Act —

"Centre" means the Rural Development Centre.

Interpretation

"Central Committee" means the Executive Body of the Centre.

"Trustees" means members of the organisation who are responsible for the safe keeping of the Centre's assets.

"General Assembly of Delegates" means an assembly of all officers and members of the Centre.

Incorporation of Executive or Central Committee

3. Alban Stapleton (Chairperson), Clive Stapleton (General Secretary), Samuel Williams (Vice-Chairperson), Christobell Fraser (Assistant General Secretary) and Promise Stapleton (Treasurer) and their successors in office appointed in the manner provided by Section 4 of this Bill, are hereby established as a body corporate to be known as "the Incorporated Trustees of the Rural Development Centre", which shall have perpetual succession and a common seal and power to sue and be sued.

Power to fill vacancies

4. On any vacancy occurring in the said body corporate by reason of the death, absence from Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, or incapacity to act of any of its members, the General Assembly of delegates may elect a member in his place and every member so elected shall have the same powers as if he had been named a member in Section 3 of this Bill.

Power to acquire and dispose of property

5. The said body Corporate shall have power to acquire for the said Centre any movable and immovable property and may from time to time, by deed, sell, demise, grant, convey, mortgage, exchange or otherwise dispose of any lands or other property.

Vesting of property held by persons on behalf of the Executive Committee

6. All movable and immovable property in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines now held or vested in any person for or on behalf of the said Centre whether or not in his own proper name is hereby vested in the said body corporate.

Vesting of property

7. All movable and immovable property heretofore or hereafter bequeathed or devised by will, or otherwise given to the Centre are hereby vested in the said body corporate.

Saving

8. Nothing in this Bill shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or any other persons except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Bill and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
