World Teachers' Day, celebrated every year on 5 October, will focus this year on the right to qualified teachers. On this occasion, several events will be organized, including the launch of a publication entitled "Improving the quality of teacher training in sub-Saharan Africa" and a debate on teachers and the right to education. The UNESCO-Hamdan bin Rashid Al-Maktoum Prize, which recognizes exemplary practices and performance that improve teacher effectiveness, will also be awarded to the Center for Mathematic Modeling of the University of Chile, the Diklat Berjenjang project of Indonesia and the Fast-track Transformational Teacher Training Programme of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
