General Context

- Culture heritage increasingly affected by emergencies
- Strategy for the protection of culture and the promotion of cultural pluralism in the event of armed conflict and its Addendum on disasters, unanimously adopted in 2015 and 2017 by the 195 Member States of UNESCO
- Role of intangible cultural heritage in emergencies both as threatened heritage and as a resource for prevention, resilience and reconciliation

Background

 - Pilot Survey on Intangible Cultural Heritage of Displaced Syrians (2017)
 - Community-based needs identification in North Kivu, Democratic Republic of Congo (2017).

 - Emergency International Assistance (Colombia, Côte d'Ivoire, Mali, Vanuatu)
 - UN brainstorming meeting (Beirut, October 2018)
 - Desk study on methodological approaches
 - Capacity-building material on ICH and disaster risk management
- **2018**: Decision 13.COM 11: convene the expert meeting



Nature of the meeting

Category VI meeting of individual experts:

- Experts participate in their **private** capacity and not as representatives of any government or organization
- ✓ Observers are allowed upon authorization of the Chair
- Generous financial support of the People's Republic of China
- Two-day meeting bringing together twenty-one experts from all regions and with specific expertise and/or experience in the field of intangible cultural heritage and emergencies
