	Please briefly describe the general awareness in your country about the importance of intangible cultural heritage (as defined in Article 2 of the Convention). You may refer to some specific problems that you may encounter when doing so, and propose possible solution]	The awareness of the importance of the intangible heritage is very mixed. A large number of people appreciate the expressions in various forms of the intangible cultural heritage including music, old traditions, performing arts, rituals and festivals etc. However, the level of awareness does not motivate them towards finding ways of preserving. It is very important that the preservation and the consequent change over decades is recorded to develop an awareness of the direction of change or the conservation of the pure forms. This country has an almost ten thousand years old traditions that is under threat of being lost. Some of the problems are because of overlapping cultural influences over millennia. The area of the Indus valley and the present Pakistan have had an impact on the intangible cultural heritage. Substantial content must have disappeared and lost forever. However, traces and surviving elements need to be recorded to build up a repertoire, a conservatory of the intangible cultural heritage. The social prejudices and religious interpretation do come in the way of serious research and progress particularly in dance and music. Also the major impact is the lack of requisite political will and motivation to provide funding for the scholarship and research.

The practitioners and bearers of intangible cultural heritage have been involved primarily in the classical music in the country and the knowledge has been passed from within the tradition of a school known as "Gharanas". Similarly, on a very minor scale

		there has been preservation in the dance form. There is hardly any in drama. The oral traditions, which primarily was in the form of storyteller is almost extinct. There is need to be a group of intellectuals, researchers and scholars putting them together to launch a campaign of awareness with the support of the media.
3.		The appreciation of intangible heritage needs to be introduced in the curriculum of the schools, colleges and universities. These should be supported by audio visual material.
