## IN FOCUS: EU, UNESCO inaugurate new equipment at Yarmouk University and Middle East University



In two separate events held under the patronage of H.E. Dr. Mohammad al Momani, former Minister of State for Media Affairs, the official inauguration of equipment attracted high level attendance including, H.E. Mr. Andrea FoThank yntana, EU Ambassador to Jordan, Mr. Ibrahim Laafia, Head of Cooperation at the European Delegation, Dr. Zidan Qafafe, President of Yarmouk University and Ms. Costanza Farina, UNESCO representative to Jordan.

The EU provided the new equipment as part of an overall 1.5 million euro contribution, designed to improve the ability of beneficiaries to provide high quality media content and train the next generation of media leaders. The equipment was provided in conjunction with an extensive capacity development program for each institution, which aims at strengthening both university education in journalism and the quality of radio production and diversity. At Yarmouk, the equipment includes new workstations for three multimedia labs, a new mixer, a professional tuner, a professional CD/MP3 player, headphones, microphones for Yarmouk FM, new studio cameras, a prompter and much more for the radio and TV studios. Middle East University was provided with new, high quality radio and TV studio equipment and a media lab, including a full PC lab.

### EU and UNESCO collaborate to strengthen media sector through support to Yarmouk FM



With the generous EU-funding for high-tech equipment, Yarmouk FM has been transformed and moved to a brand new location at the University. The investment will work to improve the ability of beneficiaries to provide high quality media content and train the next generation of media leaders. Recently, with technical support provided under the project, the team at Yarmouk FM has been working to bolster their connection with listeners and the local community. The "listener's club" is composed of members interested in providing real feedback to Yarmouk FM; participants listen to the programming as it airs and then contribute constructive evaluation of the themes and material, with the overall aim of supporting the delivery

of quality, connected programming. The club also works to provide an element of 'citizen journalism', with members contacting the station with ideas or to report when something newsworthy is taking place within the community.

### EU and UNESCO radio training concludes at Al al Bayt University

The training sessions on radio news and program production at Al al Bayt University in Mafrag are now complete. Several radio experts and consultants have been working with the university's faculty, staff and students focused on the basics of setting up a radio station, institutional issues such as how to form an advisory board, ensure editorial independence, and manage the station, as well as technical skills such as radio production and editing. The training also helped students to develop ideas for new programs. Trainees expressed their gratitude for the training and the opportunity to sharpen their skills and thanked the European Union and UNESCO for supporting the development of their radio station. The university has an FM license (103.5 FM in Mafrag) in place and has now commenced broadcasting, with programs and segments produced by both students and faculty, offering quality programming to students and the surrounding community.
