 - Global Thematic Network: Research Universities, Institutions and NGOs


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- Achieve progress on SDG Goal 4 Target 4.1 and 4.2, 4.4 and 4.7

What does EQUAL address?

- Lack of adequate representation of scholars from LMIC's in measurement, evaluation and program innovations relevant to progress on SDG 4 and its indicators
- Capacity building mutual between scholars of the global North and global South
- What research skills are relevant?
 - Psychometric skills for within- and cross-country validation of individual assessments and contextual assessments (e.g., quality)
 - Culture and learning / human development
 - Impact evaluation
 - Implementation science
- Buy-In for GAML Initiatives with role for national-level measurement





EQUAL Timeline

I. Planning Phase:

Global: Identify key players (Universities, researchers) in 4 regions (East Africa, West Africa, MENA, South Asia); identify Section Leader and co-Leader; host global planning meeting.

Sections: Attend global planning meeting; host regional planning meeting; identify research questions.

II. Development Phase:

Global: Provide technical assistance and guidance to Section Leader s in preparing for Seed Grant competition (guidelines and standards for evaluation etc.); develop solutions for dissemination, engagement, and collaborative learning.

Sections: Launch seed grant competition.

III. Implementation and Consolidation Phase:

Global: Provide technical assistance to sections and seed grant projects; host annual global convenings; facilitate and ensure collective learning and exchange; consolidate findings from sections.

Sections: Implement seed grant projects, consolidate findings, engage and collaborate in Global Network.

LMIC Measurement Inventory

Wuermli et al. (2016), a joint product of Global TIES for Children (NYU) and SIEF (WB)

- Objective: Landscape of available measure validation studies across full range of learning, development and quality (context) measures
 Inclusion criteria
 - Assesses individual level outcomes
 - Children and youth 6-24
 - Adults
 - Setting-level characteristics and processes
 - E.g., classrooms, home environment
 - Used in low- and/or middleincome country

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- Total: 294 measure validation studies
 - Setting: 126
 - Individual: 168
 - child outcomes: aprx. 96%
 - Socioemotional: 84
 - cognitive: 28
 - physical health: 16
 - educational outcomes: 34
 - Used in more than one LMIC: 156
 - 89 individual-level
 - 67 setting-level
 - 76 measures have been used in more than five LAMICs.

Useful for...

Guiding "common set of items" approach

- Mapping next steps for measures aside from literacy and math skills in SDG 4
- Adding current state of measurement of quality of education – preprimary through secondary / youth programs
- Identifying networks of researchers engaged with measurement
