




A GLOBAL CRISIS for TEACHING and LEARNING



The **COVID-19** pandemic has interrupted classroom learning for at least **9** out of **10** students worldwide



191 countries have closed all their schools, affecting over **1.5** billion

students from pre-primary to tertiary education

Almost **half** of all students affected worldwide face **barriers to online learning** during school closures
