The Intergovernmental Information for All Programme (IFAP) was established in 2001 to provide a platform for international policy discussions and guidelines for action in the area of access to information and knowledge; for the participation of all in the knowledge societies.

In 2008 at its 180th session, UNESCO's Executive Board approved the IFAP Strategic Plan (2008 -2013)<sup>1</sup> to guide IFAP in furthering its contribution to the international policy debate and providing support to Member States in the elaboration of information policy frameworks. In particular, the IFAP Strategic Plan identified 5 priority areas for IFAP's work namely Information Accessibility, Information for Development, Information Ethics, Information Literacy and information Preservation.

With the mandate for IFAP's current activities - as defined by the Executive Board in the IFAP Strategic Plan (2008 -2013) - coming to an end, it is important to now assess its implementation, identify achievements and lessons learned. By taking into account this assessment as well as emerging trends and challenges the future orientations of the Programme can be determined.
