The Regional Heritage Management Training Centre "Lucio Costa" Report for the XX Session of the World Heritage Committee City (Country), DD/MM/YYYY

Date of the Report - 10/03/2014

1. Background and mandate of the Centre

The Regional Heritage Management Training Centre "Lucio Costa" (CLC-CC2), in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, was established during the 34th session of the World Heritage Committee, in July 2010. The Region covered by the Centre comprehends South Latin America, and Portuguese speaking countries in Africa and Asia.

The main focus of the Centre is to contribute to capacity building in Heritage management in the Region, considering World Heritage as a platform for cooperation for the exchange of experiences and the dissemination of best practices for the implementation of the 1972, 2003 and 2005 Conventions. Training will include different modalities of formation, research and diffusion of knowledge and experiences, considering the multiplicity and diversity of the Region, the constant renewal of approaches to preservation and social and sustainable development.

2. Institutional and operational structure of the Centre (Governing Board, Staffing, Operational funding and premises)

The Center is projected to work within the institutional structure of the governmental Institute of National Historical and Artistic Heritage – IPHAN. A Committee of Management for the Installation of the Center was created in 2012 within IPHAN directory and a staff of 08 officers – architects, historians, art historians, journalists and managers – has been designated among IPHAN personnel and has been fully operational ever since, with the support of UNESCO consultants. CLC has already contacted the State Parties within the Region to promote adhesion to the CC2 and is expecting their official response, as well as the designation of representatives for composing CLC directing body.

For 2014, Brazilian government has put aside a budget of USD 1,7 million for the operation of CLC (committed until December 2015).

About its infrastructure, the restoration of Gustavo Capanema Palace (PGC), where the Center is located, is in progress and scheduled for completion in 2016. Works for the structuring of the Observatory, CLC website, Documentation Centre, including the library, are also in progress.

3. Programs and activities implemented since June 2013 and planned for the current year

In 2013, the regular activities of the Lucio Costa Centre were defined and drawn as a draft pedagogical proposal that, following discussions with specialists from Brazil and other countries from the region assisted by the Centre, was built up as a full *Training Programme*. The

programme is designed to offer a series of training actions for the management of cultural and natural World Heritage. It also determines the development of research, training and promotion activities based on knowledge production and the establishment of a collaborative network of professionals, researchers and institutions involved in the preservation of cultural and natural World Heritage and the promotion of cultural diversity in the regions covered by the CLC.

The table below shows the activities that took place in 2013, as well as the ongoing activities and those planned for 2014.
