2. Institutional and operational structure of the Centre (Governing Board, Staffing, Operational funding and premises)

From the outcome of the second cycle of Periodic Reporting (2012) conducted by the UNESCO World Heritage Centre on the state of conservation of World Heritage properties in Asia and the Pacific, a Centre of Excellence on Natural World Heritage for Asia and the Pacific region at the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), was proposed as a Category 2 Centre under the auspices of UNESCO.

The Indian Cabinet of Ministers, chaired by Honourable Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi formally approved the proposal for signing the Agreement for establishment of the UNESCO C2C at Wildlife Institute of India in August 2015. The Agreement was signed between the Director General, UNESCO and Director General of Forest, Government of India on September 2nd, 2015. The 21 member Governing Body of the Wildlife Institute of India chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) is also the Governing Body of UNESCO C2C at WII.

The operational activities of the C2C are handled by a 15-member team of skilled professionals. The C2C team includes Director, Scientists, Technical Officers, Assistant Technical Officers and World Heritage Assistants. Administrative staff includes Administrative officer, Finance Officer and IT Officer.

The C2C is supported with financial resources primarily from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India to achieve its mandate and raises funding from other institutional donors for specific activities. A new building within the WII campus is in the final stage of construction that will house the C2C.

3. Updates on the management of the Centre – particularly on meetings of the Governing Board and key decisions adopted

The UNESCO General Conference 37 C/Resolution 47 dated 19 November 2013 granted approval to the proposal for establishing the Category 2 Centre on World Natural Heritage Management and Training for the Asia-Pacific region. The Centre has been envisaged as an integral part of Wildlife Institute of India and is governed by the Institute's Governing Body with Secretary (Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change), Govt. of India as its Chairperson and Director, WII as its Member Secretary.

The Annual Progress Reports are submitted to and reviewed by the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change from the Government of India. A review meeting under the chairmanship of the Director General of Forests and Special Secretary, MoEFCC, Government of India was held at Wildlife Institute of India on 2nd July, 2016 *(Enclosure I)*. The Centre has successfully accomplished annual work programmes for the years 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17.

4. Programs and activities implemented since April 2016 and planned for the current year

The programmes and activities envisaged between April 2016 and March 2017 have been achieved. The Annual Work Plan (2017-18) is currently being prepared and shall be shared after formal approval from the Governing Body.
