

- We have a presence in 33 countries with 34 National chapters






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FAWE-Vision

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Context — Out of School Youth in SSA

☐ Education is a Human Right
☐ 45 million youth are out of school in
Africa-Majority are girls and young
women
☐ 28 million girls in West and Central
Africa have no access to education
☐ Girls and Women in Africa from
marginalized and poorest communities
especially girls with disabilities have a
lesser chance to ever attend school,

compared to boys





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Why? – Out of School Youth in SSA

- ☐ Low absorption capacity for school aged children
- ☐ High drop out rates from school
- ☐ Limited capacities to collect gender disaggregated data
- ☐ Insufficient investment in
- ALE
- Lack of coordination across the government agencies





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ALE – An opportunity for OS Youth

- ☐ ALE as a means to addressing OS Youth
- ☐ Push for recognition non formal and informal learning certification.
- ☐ Increased funding for ALE opens new opportunities for learning
- ☐Girls Can Too! Economic viable TVET courses





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How?

- Multiple factors causing youth out of school requires multi-faceted approaches and action
- Strengthen collaboration and partnerships at regional, sub regional and country level-A platform for learning and sharing of experiences
- SDGs creates opportunities to strengthen cross-sector engagement/planning -Ministry of Education, Health, Gender, TVET, Higher Education and Industrialization etc.).

- ☐ Strengthen evidence based policy advocacy/engagements at all levels
- Advocate for govts to align policies and budget priorities with gender inclusiveness; strengthen systems to collect data and track progress toward gender equality in ALE
