ANNEX

Report of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions on its activities and decisions to the Conference of Parties

Context

- 1. The Intergovernmental Committee for the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") is composed of representatives of 24 States Parties to the Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention"), elected by the Conference of Parties for a term of four years, in accordance with the principles of equitable geographical representation as well as rotation. The Intergovernmental Committee shall meet annually and may meet in extraordinary session at the request of at least two thirds of its Members to discuss specific issues.
- 2. The responsibilities and functions of the Committee (Article 23 of the Convention) include, among others:
 - promoting the objectives of the Convention as well as monitoring its implementation;
 - preparing operational guidelines for the implementation of the provisions of the Convention;
 - transmitting to the Conference of Parties the quadrennial periodic reports submitted by Parties, including comments and summaries;
 - establishing procedures and other mechanisms for consultation aimed at promoting the objectives and principles of the Convention in other international forums;
 - taking decisions on funding requests under the International Fund for Cultural Diversity;
 - inviting, at any time, public or private organisations or individuals to participate in its meetings for consultation on specific issues.
- 3. The annual sessions of the Committee are forums for discussion and decision-making, where Members meet to decide on the implementation of the Convention. These working sessions allow them to exchange views on the priorities decided by the Conference of Parties and to make important decisions, enabling the Parties to implement the Convention at the national level and to fulfil their obligations. The Committee's report on its activities and decisions thus enables the Conference of Parties to be informed of the work accomplished by the Committee. The Committee's work is guided by the resolutions approved by the Conference of Parties since its last session. The report describes the activities carried out by the Committee and the decisions it took in the past two years since the previous Conference of Parties.

Composition of the Committee

4. At its fifth ordinary session, on 10-12 June 2015, the Conference of Parties elected 12 members of the Committee, in accordance with Rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure of the Conference of Parties.

5. The 24 Member States of the Committee and their terms of office are as follows:

Given the Chairperson, Mrs Eva Nowotny's inability to participate in the ninth ordinary session of the Committee due to unforeseen circumstances, and in accordance with Rule 14 of its Rules of Procedure, the Committee unanimously accepted the recommendation of its Bureau to entrust H.E. the Ambassador of Lithuania, Mr Arunas Gelunas, with Chairperson duties.

Activities of the Committee since the fifth ordinary session of the Conference of Parties (10-12 June 2015)

- 9. Since the fifth ordinary session of the Conference of Parties (June 2015), and in accordance with Article 23.6 (b), (e) and (f) of the Convention, with the activities and priorities defined by the Conference of Parties (Resolution 5.CP 14) and with the work plan for the activities of the Committee (June 2015- June 2017) (Decision 9.IGC 5), the main activities and decisions of the Committee have focused on:
 - i. the implementation of the global capacity-building strategy;
 - ii. the implementation of the International Fund for Cultural Diversity (IFCD), the second phase of its fundraising and of communication strategies;
 - iii. the monitoring and assessment of the Convention's impact, including:
 - a) new quadrennial periodic reports submitted by Parties;
 - b) the development and implementation of a results framework for the Convention, including SMART indicators;
 - c) the implementation and impact of Articles 16 "Preferential treatment for developing countries" and 21 "International consultation and coordination" of the Convention;
 - iv. the preparation of draft operational guidelines on digital issues;
 - v. the assessment of the involvement of civil society in the implementation of the Convention and in the work of the governing bodies;
 - vi. pursuing synergies with the 1980 Recommendation concerning the Status of the Artist:
 - vii. the monitoring and implementation of the recommendations of the Internal Oversight Service (IOS) and of the External Auditor.

Conclusion and next steps

- 11. The table above shows that the majority of the activities requested by the Conference of Parties has been implemented by the Committee and that the necessary decisions have been adopted, in accordance with its work plan. However, the implementation of certain decisions is still pending. Such cases include the Committee's invitation for Parties to provide extrabudgetary contributions to the Secretariat, both under the capacity-building strategy and for the implementation of IOS recommendations.
- 12. Furthermore, in the current context, the Committee faces challenges regarding the integration of new themes into its workplan which have emerged in the past few years and which are raising global concerns. For example, the Committee will have to consider issues related to the 2030 United Nations Agenda and the impact of global conflicts ¹ on the implementation of the Convention. For instance, in a conflict situation, artists will likely face situations in which creating, producing and disseminating will be difficult, thus calling into question their artistic freedom as well as their freedom of movement within their territory and abroad.
