



The Southern African Intangible Cultural Heritage Cooperation Platform (proposed name SAICH Platform) operates under the auspices of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO). The SAICH Platform is hosted by Chinhoyi University of Technology (CUT) in Zimbabwe.

The seven countries that are serviced by the Cooperation Platform are Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi. Namibia, Swaziland, Zambia and Zimbabwe. These countries, which have been participating in the UNESCO/Flanders ICH Project since 2014, form the cluster that falls under UNESCO's Multisectoral Regional Office (MSRO) in Harare.
