Sir/Madam.

Following the Director-General's letter CL/4285, inviting your State to participate in the UNESCO Conventions Ceremony, I have the honor to share with you some information regarding the logistics of this event.

The UNESCO Conventions Ceremony will be held at the UNESCO Headquarters in Paris on 15 November 2019 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., in conjunction with the 40th session of the General Conference.

During this Ceremony, to which all delegations are invited, representatives of Member States will present to the Director-General, in her capacity as depositary, their instruments of ratification of the conventions of UNESCO or sign those opened for signature. As a celebration of UNESCO's standard-setting activity, this unprecedented event provides an opportunity for your State to make public its commitment to the mandate of UNESCO.

In order to ensure the participation of your State, I would be grateful that your Delegation kindly advise my Office as soon as possible by indicating the conventions that your State intends to ratify or sign and the identity of the representative that will represent your State during the Ceremony. The communication shall be accompanied by a copy of the corresponding instrument of ratification or, if appropriate, by an instrument conferring full powers for the signature. My Office will proceed to the legal review of these instruments and, when such review has been completed, will confirm the participation of your State to the Ceremony.

In this regard, I would like to remind you that, pursuant to the rules of international law, instruments of ratification must be signed, either by the Head of State or Head of Government, or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs. Regarding the signature, any person wishing to sign the conventions, other than the above mentioned three authorities, will have to be vested with appropriate full powers. In order to be valid, the instrument conferring full powers must be signed either by the Head of State or Head of Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs, and contain the name and title of the person vested with full powers, as well as the title of the relevant convention.

In addition, I have the honor to invite your Delegation to participate in an information session that will be held on **17 September 2019**, between 10 a.m. and 11.30 a.m., in Room IV of the Organization's Headquarters, during which the conduct of the Ceremony and its modalities will be presented.

My Office remains at your entire disposal for any eventual question.
